The Congress was held in the Rosetor Suite, which is very popular with the players. Trefor Thynne, President of the Torbay Chess League, opened the Congress welcoming the players to the 44th. Torbay Congress.

The Congress is run on the basis of four sections, Swiss pairing system with a very experience Control Team of Ewart Smith, Open, John Ariss, Major, Victor Cross, Intermediate and Tony Tatam, Minor.

<u>OPEN</u>

The Open was closely contested going into the last round, but Keith Arkell G.M. was leading on 3.5 points with five other players close behind on 3 points. The following top score pairings for the final round:
