

Leeds Junior Chess Congress 2013

Part of the Yorkshire Junior Grand Prix

The best tournament for all juniors at whatever standard

Sunday February 3rd 2013 at Fountain Primary School, Fountain Street Leeds LS27 0AW

Major Section:

Open to any player.

Prizes: 1st £50, 2nd £25, 3rd £15. Trophy for the winner.

Intermediate Section

Open to players with an ECF/YCA grade below 115

Trophies for the top 3. Best girl & second girl medal. Age group prizes for boys and girls may be awarded depending on entry.

Minor Section

Open to any player with no grade or below 40 (some tournament experience would be required).

Trophies for the top 3. Best girl medal. Medals in each age group for best boy and girl (U14,U11,U10,U9,U8 and U7).

Novice Section (age limit 11 years of age – unless with consent of Organisers)

Open to any player with limited experience or first tournament.

Trophy for the overall winner and then medals in each age group for best boy and girl (U11,U10,U9,U8 and U7) even if there is only one entry in the age/gender group.

Please note: Where there is a small entry in a section it may be merged with another section, although prizes will still be applicable for the section you entered.

Also: Trophy for the best Leeds player (lives or attends school in Leeds).

No player can win more than one trophy or medal. If trophies are won in any section – the age medal will be awarded to the next highest scoring junior.

New tie break system this year- details on the day. Cash prizes will be shared if points are equal.

Extra non - cash prizes may be awarded depending on size of entry on all sections except the Major. The organisers reserve the right to change the prize structure to suit the entries received. Grades used will be those published in January 2013.

Other Grand Prix events: Bradford Junior Congress (TBA) at the Latvian Club, Clifton Villas, Bradford.

(You do not have to enter this event or have entered any other events to be part of the Leeds Junior Congress).

Grand prix prizes will be in each section and will be announced later.

Entry fees: Major: £12.00. Intermediate: £10. Minor: £8. Novice: £8

(Refreshments will be on sale courtesy of the school, but you may wish to bring a packed lunch). Entries received without payment eg by e-mail will be accepted but will have an extra £2 charge on the day. Refunds given for withdrawal before Monday 28th January. We recommend you do not enter through a third party as this can lead to confusion. Send your entry directly to the organisers.

The organisers are only responsible for juniors in the playing hall. We strongly recommend juniors are supervised when they are not playing. It is a condition of entry that photographs may be taken and used for publicity. If you do not wish photographs of your child to be used you must tell us when you register on the day. Photos may appear on the YCA, Leeds Junior Chess and ECF websites. Parents will not be allowed in the playing hall during play.
