

CIVIL SERVICE LEAGUE INDIVIDUAL TROPHIES

Barstow Cup

Presented by Sir George Barstow, a prominent Treasury civil servant and businessman. He joined the Treasury in 1898. He was put in control of supply services in 1919 before joining the board of the Anglo-Persian Oil Company in 1927. He died in 1966.

First winner: ET Jesty (1923).

Most recent winner: Kevin Thurlow (1994).

Star Trophy

Presented by The Star, a London evening newspaper published from 1788 to 1960. The Star achieved a high circulation at the time of the Whitechapel Murders of 1888 to 1891. Some say the paper wrote the "Dear Boss" letter that gave Jack the Ripper his nickname.

First winner: J Webb (1929).

Most recent winner: Colum Duddy (1998).

James Curtis Trophy

Presented by James Curtis, who worked at the Ministry of Labour and National Service. He was a prominent member of the Civil Service Chess Association and helped to restart representative matches after the Second World War. He died in 1961.

First winner: P Henley (1951).

Most recent winner: Brian Skinner (1995).

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

Rate of play

80 minutes per player per game plus a

10-second increment per move.

Byes

Players may take a maximum of one ½-point

bye in any round except the last round.

Defaults

Players arriving after 7.00pm will be

defaulted. Players without an opponent at

7.00pm will if possible be re-paired at a time

limit of 75 minutes per player per game, or

else awarded a 1-point bye.

Sections

Entry into the Major and Minor sections will

be determined by the January 2013 grading

list published by the English Chess Federation.

ECF grading

All games will be submitted for grading and

inclusion in the July 2013 grading list.

Disputes

In any dispute the Tournament Controller's

decision will be final.
