As the recently appointed ECF manager of Secondary School Chess my role is to increase the amount of chess played in and between secondary schools. In view of the dearth of activity at present hopefully the only way is up!

I have found that in most counties any secondary school chess league has all but died. In a few counties (Warwickshire, Suffolk, Sussex) there is some activity, mainly at the U14 or below level. Only in Surrey is there a thriving secondary school league at the U18 level. It is very refreshing to see that such activity is now on the increase in Sussex.

I hope to encourage more inter-school chess by organizing afternoon and one day events. I have planned some pilot events over the next few months which are described below. I will advertise any secondary school event, as one problem is people not knowing about them. And I will report on all events in future editions of this newsletter. So please do let me know of anything you are planning.

ECF Afternoon events

The idea here is an informal afternoon event, either in school time or just after, taking only 2 hours. So games are short and sweet. A 4 round Swiss means that only 1 team loses all their games, and so almost all go away with some success. As a one-off event teachers are more likely to be willing to give up time, particularly if they can leave school early (though for some leaving early may be a problem). My pilot event is aimed at schools in the Croydon area. I know of similar events which are already run in Birmingham, Bournemouth and Cumbria.

ECF One day events

This event is designed for those schools (and teachers) who would like more chess matches. The ideas come from the Birmingham Schools Saturday rapid plays and the National Schools "Last Chance Saloon". A six round Swiss allows for a range of abilities to be present but for most schools to have some successes. In the case of the pilot event at Eton College on September 23rd this event will also be graded. Judging by the rapid entry of a dozen teams, many schools seem keen for more matches! Again, perhaps such events could be run in other parts of the country.

ECF Yateley Manor National Schools Championship

School Chess League news

The Briant Poulter (Surrey schools) chess league continues to be highly successful. It is based on leagues of similar ability, rather than on age. In 2011-12 there were 5 leagues of between 6 and 9 teams. Each team played between 7 and 10 matches, and each team is of 6 players. For divisions 1 to 3 games are long play whilst in Div 4 and 5 two rapidplay games are played in each match. All matches last between 2 and 2½ hours and are played on Friday evenings. For 2012-13 it has been decided to have an extra long play division, mainly for older players who like to think more about their moves.

The Sussex Schools league has grown this year, and now includes Under 18 as well as Under 16 and Under 14 sections.
