Finance: The most significant papers to Council are those related to Finance. The Board undertook a detailed and lengthy discussion regarding the two approaches. David Eustace and John Philpott are to be congratulated on assembling the information in such a user friendly format. I consider that the discussion was well informed, that a proper assessment of the potential risks attached to both approaches was clearly understood and the final recommendation was soundly based.

Governance: The Board established a Review Panel, chaired by Julie Denning. That group have now been superseded by the Governance Committee chaired by Robert Stern. They have systematically addressed the agenda set out for the ECF by the Governance review Commission. Not all matters have yet been finally dealt with but there has been considerable progress. My view is that the ECF has achieved a considerable level of progress in this area.
