

Warwick University Rapidplay Tournament

Date: Saturday February 16th, 2019

Location: Warwick University, Science Concourse B2.02, Library Road CV4 7AL

Format:

- Seven rounds with a time control of 15 minutes + 10 seconds per completed move

- The event will have two sections:

a) Open (All players)

b) Minor (Max grade of 135)

- Entry Fees:

a) £5

b) There will be a £10 surcharge if registering on the day of the event

- Prize Money: 100% of entry fees will go towards prize money (estimates based on 50 entrants- number in brackets gives percentage of total entry fees for each prize)

Open- Estimated Prize: 1st: £70 (28%) 2nd: £40 (16%) 3rd: £20 (8%) Grading Prize: £20 (8%)

Minor- Estimated Prize: 1st: £50 (20%) 2nd: £30 (12%) 3rd: £10 (4%) Grading Prize: £10 (4%)

Mobile phones and electronic devices are only permitted in the playing area provided the device is completely switched off. During games they must remain switched off. Disqualifications will be used in line with FIDE regulations.

Grading and Rating:

Eligibility for grade-restricted sections will be determined by the January 2019 ECF Rapidplay grading list. All sections will be ECF graded and FIDE-rated. The following priority will be used for section allocation:

- (1) January 2019 ECF Rapidplay Grade
- (2) January 2019 FIDE Rapidplay Rating (converted using the formula: $(FIDE - 700) / 7.5$)
- (3) January 2019 ECF Standardplay Grade
- (4) Estimated grade assigned by the organiser

Ungraded players must give details of estimated playing strength. Ungraded players who cannot demonstrate a playing strength appropriate for their section must play in the Open.

Seedings will be determined by:

- (1) January 2019 ECF Rapidplay Grade
- (2) January 2019 FIDE Rapidplay Rating (converted using the formula: $(FIDE - 700) / 7.5$)
- (3) January 2019 ECF Standardplay Grade
- (4) Estimated grade assigned by the organiser
