

DIRECTORS' REPORTS

Chief Executive's Report

There is a detailed report on the ECF's activities in the year to April 2012 in the Achievement Report against Business Plan, as well as in the individual directors' reports. This report will concentrate on developments since April and broader organisational matters.

When I came to this role two years ago, I identified in my election address a number of areas in which I hoped to be able to make a positive contribution. It is for others to judge whether this was the case, but I should like to revisit these themes in this, my final report as Chief Executive.

Vision & Strategy

Over the last few years, the ECF has documented its long term vision and strategy in what I hope is an ambitious but realistic and professional way. Its annual business planning is more robust, if not immune to the twists and turns of actual events or incapable of improvement. I am delighted that Stephen Jones has volunteered his services as Strategic Planning Officer, and he can look to bring his expertise and fresh perspective to the task of helping the Board and Council decide the ECF's future direction. The Achievement Report and Long-Term Strategic Plan included among the AGM papers reflect Stephen's hard work, and I thank him for his efforts.

The last year has not been the easiest of times to focus on the medium to long term, and I regret that more progress has not been made in some areas. This notwithstanding, I urge Council and the Board to give serious thought to its ambitions for the future direction of the ECF. It is all too easy to become caught up in the job of delivering business as usual or – worse – to focus more on events of the recent past than the constructive task of building the future. My greatest regret over the last twelve months is that I was myself unable to focus on these aspects of future development to anything like a sufficient extent.

Trust & Transparency

Two years ago, it was clear that there was something of a 'trust and transparency deficit' with regard to the ECF. In my previous report, I suggested that there were encouraging signs of progress in this area.

It is disappointing to have to acknowledge that there have been some backward steps in the last year, at least insofar as the perception of the ECF is concerned. Several controversies – most notably, the 2011 British Championships prize-giving, the CAS legal action against FIDE, the deficiencies in the original accounting for the British Championships sponsorship monies – have damaged trust in the ECF in a way which may take some time to repair.

In dealing with these and other matters, I have sought to be open and honest. Sometimes, a judgement had to be made that the correct course was to say little – for example, while investigating and finally commenting upon what proved to be unfounded allegations about members of the English delegation at the EU Youth Chess Championships in Austria – despite considerable (and understandable) curiosity from third parties.

Finding the correct balance in communication is not easy, and with hindsight I believe that my judgements have not always been right in this. In attempting to respond to questions or to address misunderstandings or misstatements, I suspect that I have contributed to prolonging public debate of controversies when this was not in the best interests of English chess. The volume of correspondence and internet forum comments in itself becomes an important factor in the effectiveness of the ECF as an organisation. For example, to receive and deal with something in the order of 200 e-mails from one individual alone in respect of one of the year's controversies – the total number of e-mails received on the same subject comfortably exceeded one thousand – required a substantial amount of time which clearly could have been better applied elsewhere. Moreover, the nature and tone of many of these e-mails (and related forum posts) had an undeniable effect on my ability to motivate myself to focus on more productive work, and this effect evidently extended at times to other members of the Board.

Among the important issues raised by the events of the past year are two points which Council may wish to consider:

* Code of Conduct – The consultation paper presented to Finance Council in April 2012 attracted almost no response. In my judgement, the absence of a formal means of settling complaints contributed to the prolongation of the controversies. One should be under no illusion that all parties would accept the result of such a process without continuing to protest, but its existence would make it easier for most people to accept that it was reasonable to move on.

* **Public statements** – About half of the Board, as well as other ECF officials, choose to comment on the English Chess Forum. On a practical level, this can be very time-consuming if one official finds himself having to deal with a sequence of comments by several individuals. Perhaps more importantly, it raises the question as to whether such comments by officials prolong discussion of controversies to the detriment of English chess and whether it would be better for the ECF to state its position officially and then stay quiet.

I took the personal decision in August not to continue posting on the English Chess Forum. Whilst this was due part ly to an unwillingness any longer to accept attacks upon my integrity and partly to a wish to free up more time for

more constructive tasks, the timing was motivated by the wish to give Council the opportunity to judge the impact on the forum discussions of my non-participation. This could lead to a more informed debate – if desired – on the mer its or otherwise of posting on the forum.

My own feelings are distinctly mixed. My instinct is that it is a plus to communicate more and to answer questions where possible; experience, however, leads me to question whether this particular medium is the right one.

As the outgoing Chief Executive, I do not consider it appropriate for me to seek to impose constraints on the new Board and other ECF officials. This is, however, a subject that Council may wish to consider, now or at a future meeting. Ultimately, it is a matter for Council how they want ECF officials to communicate in public.

Customer Service

Improving customer service is undeniably a work in progress. The office staff work hard to respond in a prompt and efficient way to membership queries, and on the whole this is achieved, the challenges of the bedding-down period for the new membership scheme notwithstanding. The office is currently having to cope with its busiest period (the influx of new memberships) while missing one member of staff on long-term sick leave, and some temporary help has proved necessary, to be funded from the contingency budget.

Whilst there will inevitably be exceptions, responsiveness to queries has, I believed, improved across the organisation. The ECF still lacks a formal complaints process, but in practice the procedure presented to Finance Council in April has been applied when complaints are received.

Finances

2011/12 was the first year which the ECF had to face without the benefit of funding from the Department for Culture, Media and Sport. Since this represented approximately a third of the ECF's income – and this in the context of an organisation which had endured two years of annual deficits – overcoming this challenge was an important priority.

Last year, I reported on the outcome of the cost review, which enabled the ECF to reduce its expenditure by something in the order of \pounds 45,000 a year. In 2011/12, further significant cost savings have proved difficult to find, in the face of the inflationary pressures familiar to us all. The introduction of an online membership system has added the cost of an annual licence fee and card processing fees (for memberships purchased directly online), but the time savings brought about by the change should enable a saving in staff costs which will more than offset these new costs.

The new membership scheme and changed game fee framework should place the ECF on a sound and self-sufficient financial footing for the future. The structure of the scheme means that there is relatively little dependency on the take-up of membership per se. Indeed, a higher-than-expected proportion of non-members paying game fee would increase the ECF's income compared with its central budget projection.

In accordance with the wishes of Council (which supported the introduction of a universal membership scheme), the relative pricing of membership and game fee actively incentivises the former. While the new arrangements do not achieve Council's ambition for a membership-only scheme immediately, it is a reasonable expectation that this will be achievable in the not too distant future, if membership take-up reaches a sufficiently high percentage.

Such a major change as the new membership scheme cannot be achieved without risk. If the changes were to lead to a significant reduction in the amount of graded chess being played or the number of graded players – if segments of English chess were to withdraw from the ECF, for instance – this would adversely affect the financial position. I am pleased to report that, at the time of writing, there were no signs of this. In its first two months of operation, the PaySubsOnline system saw some 1250 new members joining the ECF directly online, with a healthy flow of new members also joining by the more traditional methods through the office. Early signs are that the proportion of members purchasing the higher value memberships (Gold and Platinum) is better than forecast, which will boost income compared with budget if sustained. The indications are that many leagues and county associations will opt to become Membership Organisations (13 agreements had been signed at the time of writing), and I fully expect to see a significant influx of bulk membership submissions during September and October. At the risk of being made to look foolish by events, I should not be surprised if the AGM in 2013 will be receiving a report to the effect that the ECF membership has reached a figure in excess of 12,000. This will be good news for the stability of the ECF, but more importantly, it will represent the establishment of a large community of members united by their enthusiasm for chess and their wish to see it develop and thrive in this country. Making the most of the opportunities presented by this community will be a critical success factor for the ECF, which means, I genuinely believe, that it will be of great importance to the future of chess in England.

If Council decides in due course to pursue an application for charitable status, this should bring further financial benefits – for example, the card processing fees available from PayPal are halved for registered charities – and open the door for a more successful campaign to attract donations and sponsorship.

The baseline for judging the success of the membership scheme will be the financial stability of the Federation. Our ambitions for the ECF and English chess should naturally extend far beyond this, and I hope that this will prove merely to be the platform for a programme of investment in ventures to develop and grow the game.

Organisational matters

The transition to a more universal membership scheme has been the most significant change over the last year. Implementation of the scheme has not been exactly as I would have wished, with communication to member organisations taking place at a later stage than originally envisaged and delays in the introduction of the online membership system. At the time of writing, work was still ongoing to ensure that fully satisfactory invoicing systems were in place, although this should have been completed by the time of the AGM.

I apologise to Council for these shortcomings. My own personal capacity to allocate time to the project was often a critical factor, and the impact of some of the other matters touched on in this report meant that I sometimes fell short of my original intentions. Whilst the transition to the new membership scheme was always likely to be something of a bumpy ride, I am sorry that my own efforts were not always sufficient to make the journey smoother. At times, this has tried the patience of member organisations, and I apologise for this.

Further organisational changes are, in my judgement, desirable. The consultation papers presented to Finance Council in April 2012 on Governance, Financial Capital, a Code of Conduct and Charitable Status were intended to form the basis for firm proposals at this AGM. Responses to the papers were sparse – the total number of responses received was lower than the number of consultation papers – and it therefore seems inappropriate to attempt to move these matters forward at this time. This is regrettable, but further consultation and reflection are clearly needed.

The question of Charitable Status is dealt with elsewhere on the AGM agenda, so I shall not comment on it here. It is my recommendation that Council should as a minimum seek to address the question of Financial Capital at the same time as Charitable Status (which I suggest should be dealt with at an EGM, before the expiry of the PIF trust deeds in February 2013). Since a decision to proceed with an application for registered charity status will necessitate a reorganisation of the current ECF into two separate entities, it is strongly recommended that the opportunity be seized at that time to take some steps along the path to changes in governance.

It has been my privilege to serve English chess, albeit relatively briefly. 2011/12 was a difficult year, and I am grateful for the support of my colleagues in tackling its challenges. The office team – Tina Turner, Christine Carcas and Andrew Walker – has provided essential support for me and the rest of the federation, and I wish to record my sincere appreciation of their hard work. I should also like to record particular thanks to David Anderton and John Philpott, both of whom have been extraordinarily generous with their time. Their expertise has proved invaluable during my term in office.

As an organisation, the ECF is critically dependent upon its volunteers. Throughout my time with the ECF, there have been vacancies unfilled for lengthy periods of time. One of the most regrettable effects of the negative atmosphere created by the past year's controversies has been to make the challenge of finding volunteers more difficult, and I am sure that it has played some part in the decisions of some Board members, myself included, not to stand for re-election.

Where volunteers have been forthcoming, the benefits are clear to see. Phil Ehr has successfully established a large team of volunteers in supporting roles, which has enabled positive progress on a number of fronts in the area of Junior Chess. I am sure that this progress could be replicated elsewhere in the organisation, but this would only be possible with sufficient volunteers.

It is inevitable that the efforts of some volunteers should enjoy a higher profile or public appreciation than others. Some, such as my fellow Board member, Tim Woolgar, have had to endure public criticism in some quarters from the very outset. The Director of Marketing is in many ways a thankless role – raising the profile of chess in this country is a daunting challenge, all the more so when allocated a budget as close to nil as makes no difference – so it is only fair that I should record my gratitude to Tim for his efforts. His wise counsel and hard work over long hours helped enormously with the recent media storm over the EU Youth Chess Championship incident and ensured that the ECF dealt with the matter in a professional and effective way. Prior to this, his contribution to the online membership system project and his analysis of ways to improve the ECF's website were noteworthy.

All of my fellow Board members have worked hard in the service of the ECF, and I am grateful for their support. I wish the new Board every success as they face the challenges of the next few years.

Home Chess Director's Report

British Championships

The 99th British Championships took place at the Parks Leisure Centre in North Shields between 22 July and 7 August. The British Championship itself was won by Gawain Jones after a two-game Rapidplay playoff against Stephen Gordon with whom he had tied on 9/11. Gawain and Stephen shared the English Championship prize, while Jovanka Houska took both the British and the English Women's titles. Congratulations to the team who organised this year's Championships. I look forward to next year's 100th Championships in Torquay.

Grading

The number of standard grades went up from 10,105 to 10,331. The number of rapidplay grades went up from 4,134 to 4,684. I am proud to say that the introduction of twice-yearly lists went smoothly, and I have to congratulate the grading team

on their hard work making this happen. We are also grateful for Mike Bennett's fantastic and long overdue improvements to the grading website, which makes monitoring grading performance throughout the season easy and interactive.

County Chess

In the County Championship, Middlesex won their first Open title since 1989. 58 qualified for the national stages, with 6 defaulted matches. For the first time, games from the Final were broadcast live over the Internet. All the games from the Finals appear on the ECF website, and are available for download.

Correspondence Chess

Regrettably, the Counties & District Correspondence Championship did not take place in the 2011-12 season. The British Federation for Correspondence Chess has agreed to organise this event in future.

Signing at the London Chess Classic

This ground breaking initiative arose from a conversation between myself and Barry David (Chairman of the English Deaf Chess Association) at Hendon Chess Club in London where it became clear that deaf people using BSL (British Sign Language) could not access the commentary at elite chess tournaments. Indeed, it was thought that there had never been any-thing like a BSL-interpreted chess commentary anywhere. It was immediately agreed to do something to change this, by organising signing at the 2011 London Chess Classic with co-funding from the ECF and International Master Malcolm Pein, organiser of the Classic. It was a great success, and we shall be repeating the exercise this year

International Chess Director's Report

Luke McShane took three notable scalps at the Tal Memorial in June defeating Levon Aronian, Vladimir Kramnik and Alexander Morozevich and finishing with four points against nine of the world's top players rated between 2738 and 2835. Only a last round loss to world number one Magnus Carlsen prevented him from possibly sharing first place. He was seconded by Peter Wells.

Gawain Jones qualified for the 2013 World Cup by virtue of his 2760 performance at the 2012 European Individual in Plovdiv, Bulgaria in March where a 4/4 start and five draws against higher rated players and a last round win saw him claim one of the qualifying places.

Nigel Short won the Gibraltar Masters in January with a 2838 performance scoring 8/10 and winning on tiebreak from Hou Yifan. He played nine grandmasters including four over 2700 and finished ahead of fifty-nine other grandmasters. He then won the Thailand Open with 8/9 and a rating performance of 2768.

Gawain Jones and Stephen Gordon became joint English champions finishing on 9/11 at this year's British Championship with Gawain becoming British champion after winning a two game play-off. Jovanka Houska retained her British ladies title whilst one of her students, Radha Jain, made a welcome return to international chess and became British under eighteen girl champion. Marcus Harvey & William Foo shared the under eighteen title and James Adair became under twenty one champion. I would also like to personally thank Lara Barnes for performing such an excellent job as tournament organiser and hope she remains involved with the tournament for many years.

David Howell won the Leiden Chess Tournament Open in the Netherlands in July with a rating performance of 2750 and the 6th Wunsiedel Open in Germany in May with a 2702 performance.

Colin Crouch & Chris Ross won silver medals on boards one and two for the United Kingdom team at the International Braille Chess Olympiad in India in August and Chris was then part of the International Braille Chess Association team at the Olympiad scoring 5.5/8 as his team won the bronze medal in their rating band.

As mandated by ECF Council, I ensured that England fielded their strongest available teams in the European Team Championship in Greece from 3-11 November 2011 having secured £10,500 of outside funding to add to the budget provided by the ECF. Although the team of Michael Adams, Nigel Short, David Howell, Gawain Jones and Nick Pert finished below their seeding, Michael won gold medal on top board finishing off with a win against Vassily Ivanchuk whilst Gawain had a 2700+ performance. The women's team consisted of Jovanka Houska, Dagne Ciuksyte, Maria Yurenok (making her England debut), Kanwal Bhatia and Sarah Hegarty. Dagne top scored with 6/8. Glenn Flear returned as captain of the women's team for the first time since 2008.

Thanks to Ian Reynolds and eight other anonymous donors I was also able to field our strongest available open team at the 2012 Olympiad. With Luke McShane sadly unavailable the team was unchanged from 2011 although Gawain moved to board two with Nigel and David each dropping a board. Captained by Peter Wells for the first time since 2008 the team finished in equal ninth place out of one hundred and fifty-seven teams albeit they were placed seventeenth on tie-break. Nigel was top scorer with 7.5/10 and the team was in contention for medals after winning their first three matches and then being on eleven

points out of fourteen. Sadly defeats in rounds eight and nine ended their medal hopes but two victories at the end meant they had achieved their best performance since 2008, when coincidentally, Peter was also captain.

Whilst the women's team didn't have any of their IMs playing this year, (Jovanka was taking a well earned rest after (I believe) thirteen successive appearances and Dagne had recently given birth), we were able to field one of our youngest teams for a long time with three players making their debuts. Anya Corke (born in 1990) scored fifty per cent on top board, Maria Yurenok followed up her England debut in 2011 by making her Olympiad debut and Sabrina Chevannes (born in 1986) made a long overdue return to the England team after an absence of five years and was actually England's leading percentage scorer in both teams after eight rounds before finishing with a very respectable 4.5/7. Sarah Hegarty (born in 1988) followed up her outstanding 2010 Olympiad debut by scoring 6.5/9 on board three whilst Kanwal Bhatia playing in her third consecutive Olympiad achieved a plus score. Stephen Gordon was captain and the team finished a very respectable 40th= (46th on tie-break) out of one hundred and twenty-seven teams.

The English event of 2011 was again The London Chess Classic organised by Malcolm Pein. Held at the fantastic London Olympia venue the top event pitted England's top four players against five of the world's best: Vishy Anand, Magnus Carlsen, Levon Aronian, Vladimir Kramnik and Hikaru Nakamura. Whilst Vladimir Kramnik won the event Luke McShane had a 2853 performance that was even more remarkable given he had returned to full time employment earlier in the year and hadn't played a tournament for nine months! Notable English performances in the open came from Lorin D'Costa who had a 2601 performance but sadly only played eight games so did not get a GM norm whilst Jovanka Houska had a 2573 performance but a last round loss meant she missed out on a GM norm. Dagne Ciuksyte was joint winner of the women's event with 7.5/9. England was well represented at the 2012 World Junior with Yang-Fan Zhou, Callum Kilpatrick, William Jones, Henrik Stepanyan and Ravi Haria all competing in the boys/open event and Lateefah Messam-Sparks and Anna York-Andersen competing in the girls event. Mark Hebden and myself were coaches for the English contingent.

England achieved two junior medals, coincidentally both bronze medals in August in the under eight age group. First Ieysaa Bin-Suhayl in the EU Youth in Mureck, Austria and then Joshua Altman a couple of weeks later in the European Youth in Prague. Ravi Haria was in contention for a medal going into the last round of the 2011 World Youth but a last round draw with the player who subsequently took the gold medal meant he finished third equal but sixth on tie-break half a point behind the two joint winners. Yang-Fan Zhou also had a good performance, a round 8 loss put him out of medal contention but a last round win meant he finished in equal fifth place (sixth on tie-break).

Sabrina Chevannes was instrumental in organising junior matches between Norway and India at the London Chess Classic. The higher profile match, against India, resulted in a 11.5-6.5 victory to England with William Foo and Conor Murphy scoring 2/2, Peter Batchelor scored 1.5 and Yang-Fan Zhou, Sam Franklin, Isaac Sanders, Ravi Haria, Amy Hoare and Rohan Shiatis all scoring 1. The result was a big boost for English junior chess and those who played can be very proud of their performance.

Ameet Ghasi completed his third and final IM norm at the August e2e4 Gatwick International whilst Alex Holowczak qualified for first his FIDE Arbiter title and then his International Arbiter title in the same year! Jack Rudd also became a FIDE Arbiter. I had also forgotten until I checked the FIDE site that I had been awarded the title of International Organiser as recently as October 2011!

Sean Hewitt's e2-e4 FIDE rated events continue to grow from strength to strength providing many players and arbiters with rating and norm opportunities. It is hard to believe they have only been in existence for five years and it would be unthinkable should they disappear from our calendar. He found time to organise events in Amersham, Brighton, Buxton, Dublin, Gatwick, High Wycombe and Hinckley. He was even kind enough to allow me to host an England Wales women's match alongside Amersham that was very useful preparation for both countries in the build up to the Olympiad.

In closing, I would like to thank the following people for their help: Sabrina Chevannes, Sean Hewitt, Malcolm Pein (who assisted in arranging anonymous funding for the England team in 2011) and Ian Reynolds who helped find funding the England open team in 2012. I would also like to thank The John Robinson Trust for their support for this year's World Junior and Friends of Chess for their continued support of our amateur and female players. I wish my successor well for the future.

Junior Chess Director's Report

Junior Chess and Education grew this year as a result of committed volunteers—primarily parents and coaches. Their service in formal posts and informally behind the scenes is the greatest junior chess asset, for which I am profoundly thankful. Outside of costs reimbursed by parents, the John Robinson Youth Chess Trust (JRT) funded 100% of the junior budget for the third consecutive year.

International Representation

Fulfilling the strategy to broaden experience, delegations totalling 45 players represented England and the Federation in major championships (i.e., World Youth 2011, European Youth 2012 and U16 Olympiad) since the last AGM. Delegations totalling 51 children played in developmental championships (i.e., World Schools Individual, Glorney-Gilbert-Stokes-Robinson Cups, EU Youth and European Schools Team). Greater detail is contained in the Activity Report and the International Director's report. Objective selection standards, primarily leveraging rating and/or grading data, for the major championships worked well, albeit some refinements are necessary for 2013. Subjective judgment from the Player Development and Selection

Committee also largely satisfied the need to apply judgment to the developmental needs of aspiring players. The response of professional coaches to the increased activity is nothing short of awesome. The quality of their interaction with each child is central to our national aspiration to raise England's performance internationally.

Training & Development

Beyond the activity above, a coherent national training and development strategy does not yet exist. Well-established groups continue popular events serving the spectrum of beginners to national elites—schools, clubs, county associations, NCJS, DUKSCC, EPSCA, CSC, NYCA, J4NCL and others. Signs of a program for national elite players, however, are seen in the development of ECF-organised training weekends that prepare teams for international youth championships. The ECF Events Calendar and announcements on the ECF Juniors website supported a modest resurgence in privately organised training and mentoring from model coaches.

Championship Grand Prix

The former John Robinson Junior Grand Prix was transformed into the English Youth Chess Championship Grand Prix. It will award English Youth Championship titles to a boy and a girl in each birth year from age seven and encourages 17 and 18-year-olds to participate in the adult ECF Grand Prix. The JRT continued its support to the prize fund, which is now open to additional donors. More tournaments are included this year and discussions are underway to commission a junior championship in the North and/or Midlands in the Championship Grand Prix 2013/14.

Schools

We are very grateful to Yateley Manor for sponsoring the National Schools Chess Championships for many years. Three new sponsors (Winchester College, St. Catherine's Bramley and Heathside Preparatory School) each signed one-year contracts that tripled financial resources. Free entry was prioritized to attract state schools. A re-designed and re-launched tournament separated Under 19 and Under 11 Championships to provide a more natural divide for secondary and primary schools. Separate Girls' Championships were established. A pilot program was commissioned to potentially extend the 2013/14 tournaments into the Internet. More generally, ECF-organised events are exploring ways to re-kindle secondary school chess beyond the National Championships tournament.

Counties

Eton College kindly hosted and the Berkshire Junior Chess Association ran a tremendous U18 & U13 County Championships tournament. Entries were up by more than 50% by numbers of players as compared to 2011. Organisation for next year's event is not yet agreed.

Governance

Various improvements were made. Sponsorship contracts in compliance with financial byelaws were put in place for the National Schools Championships. A policy on coaches' fees and allowable expenses was clarified and made more consistent. A code of conduct from past years was updated and reintroduced for international trips. A more open and clear process for running tournaments where Federation titles are awarded was introduced. Membership requirements for Federation events were revised to strike an appropriate balance between outreach (in schools) and commitment to the new membership program.

Lessons

Experience this year validated the direction in which the ECF is evolving to support junior chess. Several lessons were learned, however, that should improve international selection, coordination with county leaders and logistics for trips abroad. I'll discuss specifics at the AGM if Council so wishes. Areas needing greater attention are financial sponsorship, training & development strategy, girls' chess, conversion of the current Accredited Coaches program into a Qualified Coaches program, and defining a clear vision for the Certificate of Merit.

Recommendations for Council

Lack of charitable status unnecessarily limits public support. Financial accounting processes need improvement. Persistent disputes within the chess community erode our ability to resolve issues, work in the same direction, and attract support. Solutions to these include: (1) prioritising charitable status ahead of other structural proposals; (2) adopting a code of conduct that addresses ethics and facilitates dispute resolution; and (3) increasing attention on and resources for financial controls and accounting.

FIDE Delegate's Report

The two most important issues of the year are the Lausanne court case of January 2012 and the recent FIDE General Assembly. To put this report into context, however, it is necessary to return to the 2010 FIDE Presidential Election, in Khanty-Mansiysk, which was marked by numerous irregularities – the highly-questionable redistribution of proxies, the snatch-

ing away of microphones by Delegates raising points of order, and the abrupt disenfranchisement of the Peruvian Delegate, to name just three of the most egregious examples.

The then re-elected FIDE President, Kirsan Ilyumzhinov, under the rather bland item 3.4 of the agenda "Nomination of the Vice Presidents" ambushed the General Assembly by suddenly announcing no less than five names – all of whom had backed him politically. At no point was it mentioned by the President that this was in breach of the FIDE statutes, which only allowed him to appoint "two and no more". On the basis of this, the ECF along with a further 13 other federations, subsequently protested in writing to FIDE. This brought about no satisfactory response. The ECF was then asked by Garry Kasparov – the organiser of the Karpov 2010 campaign – whether, if we were provided with full financial guarantees, we would be prepared to appeal to the Court of Arbitration in Sport (CAS) in Lausanne Switzerland. Respect for the rule of law is a vital pillar of British society and the ECF took the view it was important to uphold these values internationally. The issue of the extra Vice-Presidents was very much a test case – a drawing a line in the sand – to make FIDE more accountable.

Our biggest concern was not to do with the merits of the case but whether there was any risk to ECF finances. Having taken legal advice from David Anderton we concluded that guarantees were good and the risk was negligible. That judgment has subsequently been proven correct. To decision to fight for the rule of law has not cost the ECF a single penny. With hindsight, however, it would probably have been wiser to provide greater disclosure to Council. As Delegate, I bear a greater share of responsibility for that omission. That said, the issue of funding was germane to the Lausanne court case and to have shed public light on the matter in Council could well have damaged our legal position. It was initially very unclear how the judges would view third-party finance. Indeed the FIDE lawyers repeatedly brought up the issue of funding during the case, arguing that this produced a "conflict of interest". The judges dismissed these arguments as an irrelevance, but we could not be certain of this opinion beforehand.

One criticism that has been made repeatedly by the FIDE incumbents is that the court case was a politically-motivated attempt to bankrupt the organisation. That is totally false. Nothing could have been easier than for FIDE to withdraw the three additional VPs and to place before the 2012 General Assembly a motion permitting the nomination of the extra positions. That simple democratic procedure would have saved the governing body the best part of a million euros in legal fees. That they chose not to do so, indicates they were intent on fighting for the right to do whatever they wanted, whenever they wanted. Or, as the former BCF President and FIDE insider, David Jarrett, apparently revealingly confided to Stewart Reuben, they had no intention of being bullied into following their own rules.

FIDE came in for heavy criticism from the judges in the CAS ruling (e.g. "notes that these at the very least raise a number of prima facie issues regarding the clarity of the FIDE Statutes and Electoral Regulations, and regarding the internal governance of FIDE" and again "the Respondent's awkward disregard for constitutional formalities during the FIDE Congress, which – by amongst others creating a level of ambiguity as to the nature of the appointment of the Five Vice Presidents – should have been understood by FIDE as having a potential to create discord and lead to the commencement of claims."), but unfortunately the case was dismissed on a technicality. The question under consideration by CAS – whether a decision that is null-and-void under Swiss law is subject to the 21-day deadline or can be appealed at any time – had never before been addressed by a CAS tribunal and no one could know the answer before the ruling was handed down. This is doubtless why it took the judges six months to make their decision – twice the normal time for a CAS judgment – rather than the 2 minutes one would expect for a dismissing a late-submission. It should be stressed that it was almost impossible to meet the 21 day deadline, given that the vital evidence, in the official minutes, was only published four months after the FIDE Congress – which in itself was a breach of FIDE's rules.

Although the outcome of the court case was disappointing, FIDE has had to take heed of the judges' admonition "the Panel would encourage FIDE to assess critically its past practice in light of the texts of its statutes and regulations, so as to maintain an appropriate level of transparency in its decision-making process." This has led directly to the biggest redrafting of the FIDE statutes, in decades at September's FIDE Congress in Istanbul. Much of the work was done by Ms. Ank Santens, of White & Case, who represented the ECF in Lausanne. The sort of outrageous electoral abuse whereby one side's proxy is trumped by a newer proxy from the same federation just five minutes before the vote, will (hopefully) become a thing of the past, thanks to the new rules. The ECF can be proud of the part it has played in this process.

I played an active role in General Assembly on the first two days, contributing to many debates such as on the laws of chess. More significantly, I questioned Mr Andrew Paulson of Agon, the offshore company founded in January 2012 and which has been handed the rights to practically all FIDE competitions for the next 10 years, with a right to extend that until 2027, on financial details. The capitalization of the company remains a mystery, but his non-answer in itself was revealing...

There was regrettably a defeat on a huge hike in fees for arbiters. This will largely affect the countries where there is most chess activity.

The biggest issue of the last day was the motion, by FIDE Vice-President Ali Nihat Yazici of Turkey, to expel seven major federations including our own. It became abundantly clear that from discussions with other Delegates this did not have a catin-hell's chance of passing and that even staunch supporters of the current regime would not support a motion that, if passed, would obviously lead to the setting-up of a rival organisation. Thankfully, though, the matter never came to a vote.

L H Cooper resigned on 15 September 2012 and was replaced by S D Hewitt who had since 2 June 2012 been his alternate.

R J Edwards, C J Mattos and A R Holowczak were elected as directors at the Annual General Meeting on 13 October 2012. A P Farthing, G A Caller, A N Raoof, J Wickham and T W Woolgar ceased to be directors at the conclusion of that meeting.

D K Openshaw was appointed as a director on 20 November 2012.

Statement of directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that year. In preparing those financial statements the directors are required to:

- * Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- * Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- * State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- * Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement as to disclosure of information to auditors

So far as the directors are aware, there is no relevant information (as defined by section 418 of the Companies Act 2006) of which the company's auditors are unaware, and each director has taken all the steps that he ought to have taken as a director in order to make himself aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

Small company exemptions

The directors have taken advantage of the exemptions conferred by Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 and have done so on the grounds that in their opinion the company is entitled to the exemptions as a small company.

Auditors

The auditors, Goatcher Chandler, were reappointed as auditors at the Annual General Meeting on 13 October 2012.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered significant in relation to the company's financial statements and there have been no material changes during the period.

Accounting Convention - The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and under the historical cost convention.

Turnover - Turnover represents the sales of services, subscriptions and grants received excluding value added tax. Turnover is recognised in the accounting period to which it relates. Turnover related to specific events and the expenditure related to that event is recognised in the financial year in which the final day of that event falls.

Expenditure - Expenditure represents the directly attributable costs of providing goods and services.

Stocks - Stocks are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value, after making allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. The write-off of slow moving and obsolete stock is recognised as expenditure and is disclosed in Note 2 on page 10.

Recognition of fixed assets - Non-current assets are initially recognised at the purchase price plus all directly attributable costs of bringing the asset into service.

Depreciation on fixed assets - Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life as follows:-

- * Computer Equipment 5 years
- * Office Equipment 3 years
- * Chess Equipment 5-10 years

Assets acquired from the British Chess Federation were fully depreciated at the start of the financial year. No value is recognised in the accounts for these assets.

Events that have not yet commenced or have not been completed - Entry fees and other payments received are recognised at the point that the event is completed. Where cash has been received for an event that had not commenced or has not been finished at year end, this is recognised as a liability to the ECF and is included as accrued income. Likewise, where payments have been made for an event that has not commenced or is not complete at year-end this is recognised as an asset to the ECF and is included as a prepayment.

Subscriptions - Members' subscriptions are credited when received and a provision has been made in the accounts for subscriptions paid in advance for future years and for the cost of services to be supplied after the Balance sheet date until the subscriptions expire.

Operating Leases - Payments made under operating leases are charged to expenditure in equal amounts in accordance with the terms of the lease. Amounts owing under operating leases due in 2012-13 are disclosed in Note 8 on page 11.

Ihor Lewyk from the Bradford Chess Club

Tony Paish

Tony Paish joined the Insurance Chess Club in 1955/56 while with the Prudential ("Ibis") and played for Ibis until he joined the British Insurance Association ("BIA") in 1966. He became one of the Club's Assistant Secretaries in 1967/68, running the Tournaments, and was elected

Secretary in 1983/84.

He was elected a Vice-President in 1985 when the BIA merged with five other insurance company trade associations to become the Association of British Insurers ("ABI"). Tony then became the Office Representative for the ABI which subsequently combined forces with Zurich to form the "Combined Team", ABI/Zurich.


Following the decline of the Inter-Office Competition and the subsequent merger with the London Banks Chess League to form the Combined Banks & Insurance Chess League, Tony became the Secretary of the Combined

League. He holds that position to this day.

Tony has always supported the Club's playing activities through the Inter-Office Competition, the match programme, the Club Championship, the Nurse Lightning Championship and the Ratcliff Blitz Championship, and has consistently been listed among the Club's strongest players. He has played regularly in the Club Championship ever since he joined the Club, although he has missed a few in recent years through force majeure. Tony has won the Championship nine times, until recently a record.

More prodigious even than his playing record, has been Tony's contribution to the administrative life of the Club. He was elected Secretary in 1983. Prior to that time there had been two Committee Meetings annually, but in subsequent years the introduction of a new constitutional structure necessitated the convening of up to half a dozen Executive Meetings, in addition to the two meetings of the full Committee. This period also involved a heavy administrative workload, with Sub-Committees reviewing the Rules, considering the Club's Future Activities and, most importantly, preparing for the Club's Centenary in 1993.

To mark his fifty years of continuous membership, Tony was elected as a Life Member of the Club in 2006. He has twice been awarded the Rodney James Award for Services to the



the Club in 2006. He has twice been awarded the Rodney James Award for Services to the Club He retired as Secretary at the AGM 2010 and was presented with an engraved salver marking his twenty-seven year term in that office. Those of us who have worked with Tony appreciate the depth of intellect that he brought to an apparently mundane position. Apart from performing the administrative aspects of the Secretaryship superlatively well, Tony has also applied himself to thinking through and manag-

Apart from performing the administrative aspects of the Secretaryship superlatively well, Tony has also applied himself to thinking through and managing the various tests and challenges the Club has faced. Not the least of these has been the various changes of venue during his time: Lloyd's Training Centre, the Chartered Insurance Institute at Aldermanbury, the Bishopsgate Institute, 11 Belgrave Road Victoria, and now the Carpenters Arms at Marble Arch. Throw in the shrinking of the Inter-Office League and the advent of the Combined League, numerous Sub-Committees and the Centenary year, and you begin to get an idea of the prodigious workload Tony has shouldered. All of this has been minuted meticulously, to the extent that Tony's complete set of meeting minutes could well serve as a Club History in itself.

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Club of the Year 2012 - Witney Chess Club

During the 1990s Witney Chess Club was without doubt the strongest club in Oxfordshire, running four teams in the Oxfordshire League and repeatedly fending off challenges from the powerful Oxford University, Oxford City and Cowley teams to secure a number of league and cup titles. By 2005 we were down to one team playing in the third division, with falling membership and usually no more than one or two people turning up on non-match nights. The club was on its way to extinction as general apathy took its toll.

What has happened since those dark days is nothing less than the renaissance of the club, and shows what can be done if just a handful of committed and enthusiastic club members decide to turn round a club's fortunes. We now have a thriving club again which last season saw its first team win Division 1 of the Oxfordshire League, its second team come third in Division 2 and its third team top Division 4. This season we have increased our number of teams in the Oxfordshire League to four, with the first team winning both the Division 1 title and the Frank Wood Shield (the Oxfordshire Chess Association's knock-out competition) and our second team missing promotion to Division 1 by a hair's breadth. We currently have 28 adult members and a small but thriving junior section of 8 boys and girls.

So what are the things we have done to turn round the club's fortunes in a relatively short space of time?

• We ensure that there is always someone at the club to welcome potential new members. As most of us know to our cost, it is so often the case that when a potential new member turns up at a club he/she is often ignored by club members, who are usually too absorbed in their games to take an interest in newcomers. The potential new member hangs around for a while trying to catch someone's eye, gets discouraged, drifts off and is not seen again. We make a conscious effort to avoid that happening.

• We have started a junior section. Young players are the lifeblood of our great game, and without a constant stream of new players league chess will wither and die. The average age of club members across Oxfordshire seems to be steadily increasing, and we are determined to reverse that trend in our club at least. Youthful exuberance can mean high noise levels at times (to say the least!), so we do our best to minimise disruption on match nights by using a separate room. On non-match nights, of course, everyone plays together in the main hall. The juniors are coached by our small band of CRB cleared members, and the juniors play in our fourth team (the "feeder" team for our top two teams). In the junior section's first year we had four juniors in the county chess teams and several others as reserves, and six of our juniors got through to the British Land UK Chess Challenge gigafinals. This season our juniors joined forces with those from nearby Cumnor Chess Club to take part in the Junior 4NCL, fighting off strong competition from other junior teams to take first prize – a fantastic performance!

• As well as encouraging junior chess in our own club, we work hard to encourage junior chess elsewhere in Oxfordshire. A number of us coach in local schools, and we also organise an annual junior rapidplay tournament in Witney which is open to all juniors in Oxfordshire (and beyond, if juniors wish to play). This is a valuable "outreach" activity which not only helps to develop junior chess across Oxfordshire but also publicises Witney Chess Club.

• We contribute to wider chess affairs. Two of our members are active in the Oxfordshire Chess Association as its chairman and ECF representative respectively, and have both recently played a prominent role in redrafting the Oxfordshire Chess Association's rule book and in drafting a set of guidelines for captains on how to deal with the various contentious issues that can arise in local leagues. Our treasurer also plays a prominent role in the organisation of the 4NCL, serves as the Chairman of the ECF's Finance Committee and was recently awarded the ECF President's Award for Services to Chess. Our chairman has this season taken over the 'on the ground' running of the various Junior 4NCL weekends. Our secretary also runs a U3A Chess Group in the afternoon with sets and clocks from the club for people who have retired and retained an interest in chess but who may not want to turn out in the evenings; the group already has six members and specialises in fiercely competitive rapid play games. These are excellent ways of publicising the club to a wider audience as well as putting something back into chess on a wider platform.

• We have moved premises. Our previous premises were typical of many chess clubs – one small, uninviting and overpriced room above a large hall which often had loud bands or dance groups below. After a consultation involving all club members we decided to relocate to the village hall in Ducklington, a village just outside Witney. The difference is enormous – the hall, recently refurbished to a high standard, is well lit and warm, we have use both of the main hall and another smaller room for juniors, and there is a kitchen available as well. The village hall provides a welcoming atmosphere for potential new club members as an environment that it's actually a pleasure to play chess in!

• We put a lot of effort into fundraising. As well as keeping subscription levels down and providing an excellent way for club members to get together on a social basis, this enables us to engage local grandmaster Peter Wells who both plays in our first team and provides an annual programme of simultaneous displays and lectures. This programme is open to players from all clubs across Oxfordshire – as with junior chess, we want to develop chess across the wider community, not just in our own chess club.

Fundraising activities so far have included quiz nights (open to chess players and non-chess players), club dinners, the annual junior tournament mentioned earlier and commission deals with local suppliers for purchase made by club members. Some of our ideas have worked well, others have been less successful – but the important thing is to have a go!

• We have overhauled our equipment. In particular, we have purchased a large number of digital clocks (to drag ourselves into the 21st century) as well as new match sets as part of our drive to provide facilities that we can be proud of. Our steadily increasing membership since the dark days of the early 2000s we believe supports this.

• We have redeveloped our website. Although we have the skills within the club, those who have the skills have only limited time available. We therefore took the (fairly innovative?) decision to use our wider contacts to approach Steve Connor, webmaster for the 4NCL, the London Chess Classic and other prestigious websites, to redevelop and maintain our website. The difference was immediate. There has been an upsurge in interest from club members in contributing to the new website, and it now provides an excellent public face for the club. Such is the quality of the website that we were honoured to receive the English Chess Federation's annual website of the Year award in 2011. • We have a somewhat different approach to non-match nights from many clubs. Rather than run formal internal tournaments and championships (which take a lot of time to organise and aren't always successful anyway as people's enthusiasm levels wax and wane) we concentrate on activities such as simultaneous displays and coaching from the stronger players, impromptu speed chess tournaments and on getting juniors and adults playing together on a social basis. We have also recently set up a ladder competition, which runs mainly over the summer months and which encourages the juniors in particular to play reasonably serious chess on a timed basis both against their own age group and against adults. Members of the ladder also choose their own nicknames, which in some cases seem to be more inventive and creative than the games themselves! We believe that the Oxfordshire League provides enough competitive chess for most of our players without the need for competitive internal chess, but we do keep this under regular review to make sure we are providing what the club members want.

• Next season we hope to introduce a new weekend league (along the lines of the Woodhouse Cup in Yorkshire, but FIDE rated) to be played on Saturdays or Sundays and open to all clubs in (and beyond) Oxfordshire. Like the 4NCL, it will have relatively relaxed eligibility rules, but will be played at central venues with 'sensible' time limits to provide chess for people who are too tired to play proper chess in the evening during the week or who struggle with the long distances sometimes involved in getting to county matches.

Here are some comments about the club from current club members:

- What I like best about Witney chess club are the simultaneous displays and coaching by Mike Truran, Mark Hannon and Dave Hackett, the strong junior club (it gives a really good atmosphere) and the presence of a grandmaster (it adds to the whole atmosphere for weaker players like me).

- Witney is a great club for all ages and abilities. The atmosphere is all about having a go and trying to improve, but never being too precious for a joke. The club has gone from strength to strength because people are keen to join and keep coming back. As a middling third team player it's great to see the juniors coming through and soon to overtake us!

- For me, one of the key things about any small club is its ability to attract - and keep - new members, particularly after a long absence from playing chess. In my case, I had given up chess in 1996, after about ten years of fairly soulless battering in local league matches. I found that the game had lost its appeal, particularly after a long day's work, and there was no real social aspect to my club, nor any opportunity to learn and improve. Fast forward thirteen years, and in 2009 I casually decided to look around at clubs in my area. Witney club had a small website with a 'contact us' facility. To my surprise, I received almost immediately a friendly response to my email, inviting me along to a club night. There were about a dozen players when I arrived, with the standard ranging from "whoops I didn't realise I was in check" and "I think your knight is on the floor" to those who knew their opening theory 30 moves deep. With a refreshing absence of pressure and (given that we are, after all, chess players :-)) some decent communications skills and even dress sense, this small club made me feel welcome, to the point where I am now enjoying my chess again. Apart from when I blunder, of course! In the last fifteen months, the club has continued to attract sufficient new members to now operate four teams in the Oxfordshire league, with a team in each division - so players of all standards are catered for. I gather that only a few years ago we almost folded due to lack of members. We're also now a very diverse club - we have a Grandmaster (grade 230+) playing Board 1 of the 1sts (and he doesn't always win...) right down to keen juniors (grade c.35) on the bottom boards of the 3rds, along with every standard in between. We have male and female, old and young, local players and those who have joined us from overseas. The juniors certainly enjoy their early evening learning sessions ("Ha ha! You missed it!") with more experienced players. And once they are shepherded away by their parents (chess club membership is much cheaper than babysitting, by the way) the older players get their chance to exchange friendly banter too. All in all, I'd put forward Witney forward as a model small club that doesn't take itself too seriously and is very well run by a handful of hard working individuals behind the scenes in order to cater for all tastes. If by any chance we were to win, we would however need assistance with how to reset the digital clock, as this is something 99% of our membership struggles with! Perhaps some new members could come along and show us?!

- My friends and I are four middle-aged men who hadn't played since school! Witney Chess Club immediately nurtured us back to social and competitive chess, with its jovial banter and 'buzz'. The chess is pretty serious, whatever the level, but the top players are really helpful. Everybody gets a game and everybody has a laugh. Like golf and tennis clubs, even the rubbish players (like me) are encouraged to play great shots among the general mediocrity.

- What I look for in my ideal chess club are an ambitious first team and a pro-junior policy. Looking to both the present and the future is the path for growth. In my forty year career I have been a member of sixteen chess clubs and visited numerous others. Witney is the closest I have found to my ideal. Other clubs I have played for have had strong league teams, but juniors were scarce on the ground. My current club in Swindon integrates juniors, but its first team is in decline. At Witney I have seen several juniors still engrossed in play at 8.50 pm when I would have expected departure or wavering attention spans. I have been made to feel welcome by Witney's second and third team players, who have shown consideration for my disability and a keen interest in my games. Acceptance by the first team was immediate. Indeed on my first night I was teased about the heavy weather I had made in converting my advantage. Such banter is the norm at Witney, where it has helped build an exceptional team spirit. When you add that the main playing hall is airy with bright lighting, large tables and comfortable chairs for playing, I can understand why one of my fellow team members has been prepared to drive the seventy mile round trip (now eighty with me!) for twenty or so years. I can envisage myself keeping him company until my failing sight no longer permits.

- When I retired to Witney in 2004 the chess club was struggling to run two teams, and indeed at one stage it only ran one team. We had only two youngsters playing for us. Now we run four teams. Every club night we have several keen youngsters for whom we try to arrange friendly games. A wonderful success story!

- It's great fun to be a junior at Witney chess club; there's something special about it. Occasionally you get to play in matches and that's really cool. You just sit there looking at the chess board thinking, and it's all very tense. However, when you don't play in matches it is also fun because you can do puzzles and play other juniors. There is a big range of quality in the junior section and it is very interesting to play lots of different people with different styles. There is also a great range of different levels; there are beginners right up to county level players.

- Witney Chess Club is an outstanding small chess club, fostering links with the local community at several levels. The many positive aspects of this club include a friendly atmosphere in a modern and comfortable venue at Ducklington Village Hall and able organisation by stalwarts of the club such as Messrs Truran, Kennedy, Partridge and the team captains. There is an extremely wide range of chess interests and skills represented by the club's three dozen or so members, from young beginners (boys and even a few girls as well) up to Grandmaster level! Local schools have been approached, with schoolchildren encouraged to participate at the popular junior club evenings, which are well supervised and coached. Club team members participate in various county and inter-county tournaments (e.g. the Kidlington Congress, the Cotswold Chess congress, the 4NCL and J4NCL), and the club is twinned with Unterhaching SC near Munich. At the time of writing, we are doing well in each of the four Oxfordshire League divisions in which it has entered a team including the top division, surely a record for a small club!

- As a junior I am able to practise with all grades of players from 60 to 200. It's a fantastic place to begin playing chess and I've learnt a lot while I've been there – and I'm still learning fast!

- When I joined Witney in 2005 it was a very small club with one team, just about surviving with two or three people turning up a week. In the 7½ years I've been with the club its fortunes have turned round thanks to a lot of hard work from the committee. This season we are running four teams, up from three last season. The club now runs a junior section, a junior tournament and social events throughout the calendar year promoting chess in the local area. The club is now vibrant with many players, including the best, turning up for club nights and is an example of a fun, sociable and happy club.

... and finally, some nice words from the ECF's CEO Andrew Farthing, guest of honour at last year's Witney rapidplay tournament - "Old friends / Sat on their park bench / Like bookends" (Paul Simon)

This rather touching, if melancholy Paul Simon song about old friends and ageing was resonating in my mind as I was driving back home to Worcester on Saturday evening. Paradoxically perhaps, I had spent the day watching a collection of worryingly good juniors playing in the Witney Rapidplay, which I was attending in order to present the prizes, along with the ECF Website of the Year Award for the splendid Witney Chess Club site. The event itself had been a genuine pleasure to watch. It was run by a friend-ly and capable team of local players, led by Alan Kennedy, whose relaxed warmth and wit in introducing the event set the tone for what followed and made sure that the players and their parents had a stress-free, enjoyable day. I'm grateful to Mike Truran for the invitation and for his kind hospitality, despite his not having the decency to let me win our blitz game. (Alan beat me 2-1 as well – really, is this any way to treat an honoured guest?)

Days like this help to recharge the batteries of this occasionally weary soul, preventing me from drowning in the murky waters of the ECF's funding debate and other important but not always uplifting matters. They're a reminder of what a joy the game of chess is and of the decency of the vast majority of people involved with it. There have been days over the last couple of months when my work for the Federation has left me feeling anything but joyful, so the reminder was both timely and very welcome.

Everyone I spoke with was unfailingly friendly, and the conversations touched on everything from junior development programmes (Witney Chess Club's is self-evidently a tremendous success, built upon a determined effort to reach out to local schools and provide a supportive and encouraging environment) to daytime chess clubs for older people and the age-old question, "How do we attract and retain more female players?" (to which I wish I had a good answer).

One doesn't expect to solve the problems of English chess through chats like these, but it all helps. I did learn a useful tip for those looking for a best-selling snack treat: chocolate frogs. Helen Hackett, of Hackett's Bistro and Coffee Bar, who was providing the abundant catering for the event, could hardly restock the supply fast enough. Junior event organisers, take note!

Small Club of the Year - Trowbridge Chess Club

We have some 12 members and meet every Thursday from the beginning of September until the end of May. We also get together once a month in the summer. It is a very friendly club where everyone receives the warmest welcome. Grades vary from 155 to 67. We make sure that all members, of whatever ability, get plenty of opportunities to play competitive chess. Annual fees are kept to an absolute minimum, so that no-one is debarred for financial reasons

Being located in Wiltshire but close to the Somerset border we play in no fewer than five competitions across the two counties: Wiltshire 4-a-side (for higher graded players), Wiltshire Minor (also four a side, for lower graded players), Somerset Division 2 (six a side), Division 3 (four a side) and the Somerset Knock-Out Cup (eight a side). For the Wiltshire competitions we have two squads and in the Minor squad players are rotated so that each one plays the same number of games. In this way weaker players 'get a fair crack of the whip'; they are encouraged to keep playing and they have the opportunity to improve. We are a highly inclusive club. We have one player with a disability – profound deafness – who plays an entirely full part in the life of the Club, which includes playing in league and cup matches. All members of clubs in Wiltshire and Somerset were invited to a training weekend, with IM Andrew Martin, at the Trowbridge club last summer.

Our records in the various competitions are very good:

Wiltshire – Winners, 4-a-side 2005/06 and 2011/12; Runners-up 2010/11; Winners, Minor 2005/06, 2006/07 and 2008/09; Runners-up 2009/10

Somerset – Winners, Division 2 2009/10; Runners-up 2007/08, 2008/09 and 2010/11; Winners, Division 3 2006/07, 2008/09; Runners-up 2010/11; Runners-up, Knock-Out Cup 2008/09 (on count back)

In addition, we have a Club Championship in which members are encouraged to play each other twice during the season. We play a very full part in the administration of Wiltshire County Chess: Club Captain Tony Ransom is Tournaments Secretary, Roy Ludlow is Secretary and Mark Leonard runs the website through the Club's own site, which is outstanding.

Trowbridge members participate fully in the County tournaments which Tony organises: Wiltshire Open (major and minor individual tournaments, with monthly matches throughout the season); two individual five-minute tournaments; and an annual team rapid play tournament. The Club is well represented at congresses, not only our local one in Frome, but at others far from home, for example Blackpool, Torbay and The West of England Championships in Exmouth, where the Minor Section this year (2012) was won by a Trowbridge member, Tim Woodward.

We are always keen to reach out to the community: we have taken part in a 'Trowbridge Sports' event and three members recently gave a coaching session for a local Scout troup.

Votes

Topping this year's poll was Gawain Jones with 32 more votes than runner-up Luke McShane.

Gawain Jones is twenty-four years of age and has had an exceptional year. His FIDE rating went over 2600 for the first time in July 2011 and he is now rated 2657 after clocking up 116 rated games in the twelve months that count towards Player of the Year.

He became Commonwealth Champion on tie-break from



Nigel Short scoring 7.5/9 in Johannesburg and was then only half a point behind Adams & Short at the British after a marathon last round game ended in a draw. He also won the British Rapidplay with 10.5/11 in November and had a fine result for England in the Team European Championship, playing every round and scoring 6/9 and winning against Vladimir

Akopian, rated 2681, in England's best match result for some years. He has continued with very consistent performances in London, Corsica, Reykjavik and the 4NCL and is a very worthy winner of 2012 Player of the Year.


ECF Book of the Year 2012 - shortlist

The choice this year was difficult as the Judges received many books worthy of the Short List. Our choice shows the wide diversity of current chess writing and publishing.

Chess Lessons by Vladimir Popov | Correspondence Chess in Britain and Ireland 1824-1987 by Tim Harding Nunn's Chess Endings Volume 2 by John Nunn | The Joys of Chess by Christian Hesse

Chess Lessons

Vladimir Popov Quality Chess pp 256 £27.99 hardback



Popov is a distinguished Russian chess coach whose most famous pupils are the leading women players, the Kosintseva sisters, whom he coached from an early age. In this book Popov demonstrates his teaching methods by identifying the various areas that led to their improvement and illustrates how to learn by examples based on his experiences with the sisters. There are also plenty of exercises for the reader. An excellent self tuition manual. But in addition and importantly this book also provides a methodology for any chess trainer.


Correspondence Chess in Britain and Ireland 1824-1987

Tim Harding McFarland pp433 £34.95



Based on his doctoral thesis and subsequently expanded into this book, Harding has produced a comprehensive history of a facet of chess playing which has its own set of values and leading exponents. The book is well illustrated with pictures and documents from the past and, as always with McFarland, beautifully printed. A fascinating insight into the past, particularly before 1900.

Nunn's Chess Endings Volume 2 John Nunn Gambit pp351 £17.99



This second volume completes Nunn's major work on practical end game tactics. At first glance the pages of analysis looks forbidding, but on closer inspection a world of chess subtlety is revealed by Nunn's painstaking analysis. The lucid commentary aids understanding and every serious player – not excluding grandmasters as many of the examples illustrate – will benefit and gain deep satisfaction from a careful study of the examples given.

The Joys of Chess Christian Hesse New in Chess pp 432 £29.90



It is difficult to describe this remarkable book in a few sentences. The author is a Professor of mathematics who has an interest in the correlations of chess with the wider world. Nearly a hundred short essays, introduced by quotations from many sources cover almost every aspect of the game. Two examples only give an idea of the range: "Death at the Board" (literally) and "The theory of relative beauty". There are hundreds of positions, games and problems of all types. All in all, a wonderful cornucopia. It is not just the judges who think so. World Champion Anand wrote the Preface and his predecessor Kramnik wrote the Afterword.

ECF Book of the Year 2012 - winner!



The choice for 2012 is one of the most original chess books the judges have seen for a number of years. **Move First Think Later** by Willy Hendriks (published by New in Chess, £18.99) manages to be both serious and highly entertaining at the same time.

The subtitle gives an indication of Hendriks subject matter –"Sense and Nonsense in Improving your Chess". The author is an IM and for 25 years a professional chess trainer. He graduated from university with a degree in Philosophy and is very well read in modern developments in neural research, learning theory and associated subjects. Hendriks believes these disciplines now have much to teach us about chess teaching and playing. As a result he is interested in questions such as, for example, why are all chess players are not grandmasters? Is there a methodology for how strong moves can be found? Or, what is the role

of planning? Above all Hendriks offers a substantive criticism of much of traditional chess training and literature, in particular statements such as "Against a wing attack, counter in the centre" which can be misleading generalisations. The judges are well aware that not all readers will readily accept that all his ideas are entirely valid, nor all his propositions sound, but considered that the arguments in the book will stimulate a lively debate on how chess is taught and played.

The book consists of 27 creative and thought provoking short essays on a wide variety of related chess subjects. Each chapter is illustrated by challenging chess exercise positions (certainly not of the routine White to play and win type) which serve to illuminate the text.

All the above describes the book, but does not give an adequate impression of its originality or especially of the stimulation which it provides the reader. Hendriks is also an entertaining writer with wit and a sense of humour, often against himself, which makes the book a pleasure to read. All these qualities combine to make, Move First, Think Later a worthy Book of the Year 2012 winner.

How to become an Arbiter

The stages are that you need to attend a course for arbiters, pass the exam, and gain experience at a variety of events. At some of these, you will be assessed by a senior arbiter who, with the arbiter who has worked with you most, will then recommend your name to go to the Chief Arbiter. If he is satisfied with the reports and you are an ECF Member, your name will then be placed before the ECF Board who will, if they are satisfied, appoint you as an ECF arbiter, subject to you obtaining an Enhanced CRB clearance, for which at this point, the ECF will pay.

Training Arbiters

The following Arbiters (denoted \sim) are experienced and have the necessary skills to run a weekend training course for arbiters in conjunction with the Chief Arbiter and Manager of Arbiters. They are now designated as Training Arbiters.

99th British Chess Championships

The 99th Championships of the British Isles took place at the Parks Leisure Centre, North Shields, between 22 July and 4 August 2012. This was the furthest north the congress has been in England, the previous most northerly being Sunderland in 1966, and in the home territory of Congress Manager Lara Barnes. Many of the participants had not visited this part of the world previously, and Lara received very positive feedback about the area and its attractions, scenery, beaches and the welcoming people. The Parks venue was excellent and the centre staff went out of their way to help the congress. A huge thank you goes to Tony Morrissey, the centre manager, who delayed his holiday in order to see the championships off to a good start. Thanks also need to go to North Tyneside Council and the Elected Mayor Linda Arkley for their support of the event.

There were 64 players in the Championship itself, a very apt number, and the event ran without a hitch. There were some fantastic games played this year, and the bulletin team, the DGT boards team and the commentary team of IMs Martin and Ravikumar got these out to the public in very quick time. The event finished in a tie on 9/11 between Gawain Jones and Stephen Gordon, with Gawain winning the play-off. The English Championship was shared by these two players, while Jovanka Houska took both the British Women's and the English Women's titles.

Gawain Jones made a fast start to the event, winning his first four games, including a victory over Stephen Gordon in round 4. Stephen then put on a splendid run of 5½ out of 6 while Gawain was conceding a number of draws: Stephen was half a point ahead of Gawain going into the final round, with David Howell a further half point behind. In round 11 Stephen drew with Jonathan Hawkins, allowing Gawain to catch him by winning as Black against Dave Ledger.

A two game rapidplay play off was held on 4 August after the prizegiving. Stephen looked certain to win the first game when he won queen for minor piece, but Gawain kept his nerve and turned the tables as Stephen ran short of time. He made no mistake in the second game, winning a pawn early on and cashing in convincingly to win the play-off 2-0 and take the title.

In addition to taking the title, Gawain won the Alexander Best Game Prize for this round 8 victory against Jonathan Hawkins.

(e) Regional Master: A player must achieve a standard play A grade of at least 185 in two successive seasons on ECF official grading lists (note – grades must be 12 months apart e.g. July 2012, July 2013).

(f) National Master: A player must achieve a standard play A grade of at least 200 in two successive seasons on ECF official grading lists (note – grades must be 12 months apart e.g. July 2012, July 2013).

5) Grading lists from previous years may be used, providing evidence is provided to allow a claim to be checked.



Round 9 saw them demolish Jutes of Kent 7.5-0.5, Cheddleton only managed one game point in round 10 whilst Barbican managed a creditable five draws in round eleven but wins for Michael Adams, Nick Pert (who scored 8/9 overall) and Pia Cramling ensured their one hundred per cent record was maintained. Luke McShane, David Howell and Jonathan Rowson were among the many other grandmasters that contributed to the team's success.

British Rapidplay Chess Championships 2013

Hello again from Leeds. The weather has certainly improved, and some even got to play football outside on the green. The food was better too with roast beef and Yorkshire pudding on the menu (however, the vending machines ran out of milk, and some-one even padlocked one of the main doors and three side exits of the hall). After suitable rectifications, all was well.

After the first day, the Open was still unclear and several players were in with a chance. However, when you get tired, things can get a bit harder. Keeping one's cool often pays dividends (note: Howell's, Adams' and Short's famous victories at this event). Chess, of course, can be a difficult game, notably with rapidplay when there are just a couple of minutes or even just a few seconds left on the clock. Discerning whether a position is drawn, whether your opponent is attempting to win by fair means, or whether you've just not got enough time can be tough. Stopping the clock in the permissible manner, or consulting the arbiter in a permissible fashion means you have got to know the rules of chess. Digital clocks do help because of their accuracy.

I say all this with just a bit of basic knowledge, but respecting the fact that you might have cocked up, you still need to respect your opponent and respect an arbiter's decision. Mistakes do happen, and to err is human. After all it's just a game ... so, after viewing several games today, some of these situations did arise with games involving Stephen Gordon, Sophie Milliet, Jonathan Hawkins and Charles Storey for starters, as well as a couple more contentious ones. All had some of the above elements in them, but the arbiters seemed to deal with them fairly.

Pete Wells had an unfortunate loss against Robert Willmoth, which prompted him to call it a day, sadly, after also losing to Stephen Gordon. Respectfully, Stephen Gordon lost on time against Jonathan Hawkins, though it could have been a draw. Sophie Milliet had a good victory over James Cobb. Danny Gormally had a good start with a win against Jonathan Hawkins, but then lost to Craig Hanley.

In the last two rounds, draws by Stephen Gordon, Danny Gormally and James Cobb meant that Jonathan Hawkins could win it, and indeed he did so with a flourish. The Consett player beat Sophie Milliet in 44 moves.

Jonathan is a very good player and it shows in his grade of 251. Although only still an IM, he showed some pretty cool temperament, and above all the stamina to win. My personal thanks to all the players in the Open - their games are available in PGN on this site so that many of us can enjoy study and learn that bit more about this great game. Some other key results must be mentioned! The Major winner was Philip J Olbison, whilst the Intermediate was won by Michael McDonagh and the Minor was won by Angelica Dean.

In the junior events there were five players who all finished up on 4/5 points. Our controllers/arbiters John and Cathy managed things well .The full listings are on the BRCC website at www.british-rapidplay.org.uk. My personal thanks go to Bruce Holland who kindly presented the prizes. Bruce is the Manager of Congress Chess at the ECF. His courteous manner is an example to us all.

So as the French might say, 'A la prochaine fois ... ce n'est qu'un jeu!'

2012 Tradewise Gibraltar Chess Festival



The tenth event in the series took place from 23rd January to 2nd February 2012, as always at the Caleta Hotel. Naturally Brian Callaghan (pictured left), proprietor of the hotel and congress director, made much of this being the 10th in the series. For example, a special £5000 Diamond Jubilee prize was on offer for the highest-placed Commonwealth player. There are very attractive commemorative stamps. There was a formal dinner at the governor's residence. I was presented with Silver Miniatures of the Keys of Gibraltar. For once the weather had obeyed strict instructions and was better than any year since the first. But perhaps best of all, Brian was awarded the OBE for services to Gibraltar tourism and chess.

This event was voted as the best open of 2012 by the Association of Chess Professionals. With 11 players rated 2700 or higher and a total of 56 GMs competing, it is hard to quarrel with that. But even with Accelerated Pairings, it was round 8 before there was the first 2700 v 2700 pairing. But that has its upside heir status with just one game

- players might increase their status with just one game.

The morning rating restricted tournaments start on Monday. There is an Opening Reception and then play gets underway Tuesday for the 10 round Masters. 256 players took part from 60 federations, although Gibraltar is regarded as part of England from a FIDE viewpoint. 59 people competed in the first event in 2003.

Brian has always been in favour of female participation in the event. Thus the prize money on offer for women players is very substantial. There was a tremendous clash in Round 7. Women's World Champion Hou Yifan played and beat Judit Polgar, who perennially is the highest rated woman player in the world. They had never met before - nor even played in the same event. Judit only plays in mixed tournaments.

Both Hou Yifan and Nigel Short scored 8/10; Michael Adams, Shakhriyar Mamedyarov, Victor Bolgan and Emil Sutovsky scored 7¹/₂. Interestingly only Michael and Shakhriyar are rated 2700+. We don't need yet to introduce rating prizes for players rated 2600-2699, although we have long had them for players rated 2500-2599. Hou Yifan and Nigel Short had a playoff for first place. Brian doesn't like the idea of people sharing after a gruelling 10 rounds. Nigel won the first game convincingly and then agreed a draw when much better in the second. Thus Nigel won £25,000, made up of £20,000 first and the £5000 Diamond Jubilee Commonwealth prize. Hou Yifan £22,600 which included the second place, top women's and top U18 prize!

But the actual chess competitive is not all there is to the festival. The ambience in the bar in the evening is very enjoyable. There you can mingle with and discuss chess with some of the greatest players in the world. We also have a pairs competition and a team blitz. In each of these a social mix is encouraged, not only male/female, young/old, but also high rated/low rated. People sometimes say to me, 'The GMs are very stand-offish'. I ask, 'have you ever approached them?' 'Oh, no, I couldn't do that' 'Then

who is being stand-offish?' Recently at the London Chess Classic, a 13-year-old told me he would very much like to ask Nigel Short a question. 'Well, why not ask him?' 'Oh, I'd be too shy for that.' So I introduced him to Nigel. He asked his question and Nigel gave a perfectly sensible response. In what other sport can players, of highly variable standard and such disparate background, find such common ground?

3rd London Chess Classic

The fourth London Chess Classic took place at Olympia from 1 to 10 December 2012, with Malcolm Pein heading the organising team as Tournament Director. The nine-player line up of the previous year was repeated. Current and past world champions Vishy Anand and Vladimir Kramnik were joined by Magnus Carlsen and Levon Aronian, currently the two current highest rated players in the world, Judit Polgar, the world's strongest ever women player who was making her first appearance and US star Hikaru Nakamura who has appeared in all four Classics. The home contingent included regulars Mickey Adams and Luke McShane, together with British Champion Gawain Jones who was making his first appearance, with Nigel Short opting to stand down and join the commentary team. Nigel also gave two simultaneous displays to raise funds for Chess in Schools and Communities.

The tournament was a triumph for Magnus Carlsen, winner also of the first and second Classics, who led throughout and finished with 18 points from his eight games (the scoring system of 3 points for a win was again adopted) and a tournament performance rating of 2991. As a result of his round 4 victory against Gawain Jones, Magnus reached the highest ever live rating of 2857.4, but Gawain did not make it at all easy.



Tournament of Young Talents, Frydek Mistek

- from our man in Frydek Mistek, Peter Purland

On April 3rd, 16 players met Victor at Heathrow whilst a further 4 met Glynis and Peter at Manchester. We all met up at Prague Airport then got the bendy bus to Dejvika where we boarded the tube to Muzeum and a further one to Hlavni Nadrazi where we booked for our main line train. The three of us and many of the players had a meal en route and arrived at Ostrava within two minutes of time. We had a comfortable change then got the branch line to Frydek arriving dead on time where Vashek was waiting to meet us. We transferred to Hotel Centrum and, after dinner had a meeting then unpacked and turned in.

Wednesday was our free day and we made good use of it. Our first step was Anselm Mine at Landek which is under new ownership and has been much improved. We had a tour of both the surface and underground before lunch then had a play at the mammoth site. Next stop was Ostrava Town Hall where we went up the tower and took in the panorama of the city. We then had 100 minutes in the newest shopping mall before heading to the swimming pool. We were 30 minutes early so played soccer first then went in the pool where many played with the ball and others had a sauna or played in the whirlpool. We returned to the Centrum for dinner then the players joined Glynis and Victor for a walk in to Mistek whilst I booked us in for the tournament and got the tickets for the train.



Thursday we were at breakfast at 0800 and at the hall by 0845. This was the first two rounds of the competition and we are playing to a time limit of 90 minutes plus 30 seconds. This gives plenty of time for a well thought out game. There are over 300 players in the 6 sections representing 11 countries and after a mercifully short opening ceremony we started.

We had one player in the FIDE rated (Beskydy) Tournament and he was unlucky enough to have his opponent not arrive in the morning. However he made up for this with an excellent fighting draw against a 2100+ player in the afternoon. The U15s had a steady start scoring 6 (out of 12) in the morning but gained a creditable 8.5 in the afternoon. Only Pavan Murali was on 2\2. The U12s however stole the show with 7 (out of 7) in the morning and 4 in the afternoon when we had two inter squad pairings. Our only loss was to the top seed. Jake Liang, Theo Slade, Brian Tarhon and Aditya Yanamandra were al on 2\2. I had spent the date chatting to Karel Jubala, Karel Holusa and various other friends from abroad. This was coupled with going over quite a few games. We then returned home. ate, had our meeting and had a pairs Blitz competition run by Victor and Glynis in the evening.

Friday we were at the National House by 0845 and this was another two round day with the U12s playing steadily scoring 4 points in each round to remain just ahead of their target whilst the U15s recovered from a poor morning (5 points) to reach their target of 6.5 in the afternoon. There were some dogged performances especially from the U15s in the afternoon and Victor is happy with the way things are going. Meanwhile in the Beskydy event Matthew met an old friend of ours Taddeus who has joined in with us for the last 6 years but his friendliness only showed itself in the post match analysis. In the afternoon, however, Matthew played an FM and gained his first titled scalp. The evening was split $50 \setminus 50$ with half going to the local Aquapark with Peter and the others playing exchange with Victor and Glynis. A good time was had by all, and two future trips were also arranged during the day.

As usual we were at the National House by 0845 and there



was only one round today except for Matthew and he scored an excellent 1.5 to gain even more rating points. The U15s got 6.5 points whilst the U12s scored 4 for the fourth time in a row. Various of the players got good positions but were unable to convert them in to the extra half point. The afternoon was given over to social events and 16 of our players were lucky enough to be picked for one of the simultaneous displays. These were timed and even though our wins were on time a win against a gm is a win! Kumar Dixit beat Edouard Andreev (Ukraine) whilst Rohan Bansal beat Oleg Ivanov (Russia), Draws were gained by Theo Slade (Andreev), Alex Kitshoff and Aloysius Lip (Ivanov) and Romasn Mitra against Vlastimil Hort (Czech Republic). This was more than I could do as I lost to him in an evening event.

There were other activities which, although mostly for younger players, our lads entered in to the spirit of things and took part. We then watched the local talent show which did, perhaps, have too much audio this year. In the past it has been very visual. In the evening Victor and Glynis ran a consultation event whilst I took part in a simul and social event at the National House. Surprisingly we were at the National House by 0845. There were two rounds and these could prove vital for potential prize winners. We were very proud of the effort put in by the group and this was reflected in a good all round performance. The results are shown below but for the first time for many years we are in with a chance of first prize in three sections (the girls prizes at U12 are separate). Obviously this depends on some good results tomorrow but the players are certainly "up for it". In the evening we played Millionaire but did not have time for the tie break. The winners will be announced tomorrow. One winner from yesterday was Simon Leung who won a draw for a football.

Monday 9th April We were at the National House for 0745!! And for the final round we had 4 players on stage and 14 flags which is a record. We gained all our targets and, when the dust had settled we had three prize winners; Andrew Horton 3rd U15s, Eva Ressel 3rd in U 12 girls and Theo Slade 4th in U12s. There were only 5 prizes this year (less sponsorship) so we missed out on one more. After the prize giving we had the play off of millionaire and this was won by Theo and Harry.

We then moved to the Town Square where we had our Town Trail. This was won by Aloysius and Leo with a really good score of 17. Then it was on to the bowling where, again, a good time was had by all. The winners here were Toby Harris (older) and Harry Grieve (U12s). We then returned to the hotel where packing loomed and we spent the evening on that chore. On the final day we caught the 0827 train to Ostrava and, tired nit happy, retraced our steps back to England.

Junior Squad Championships 2012

These were held at Tiffins School in Kingston-upon-Thames and attracted 144 players in four sections, including many of our best juniors. The U16s was the smallest with the closeness of GCSEs persuading many to stay away (although intelligent chess players have nothing to fear!!)

17 took part and the lead changed hands when the early leader, Oskar Hackner, was defeated by Joseph Levene. Joseph, in turn, was defeated by Jamie Tilston and, as Oskar won his last game these two shared first place with Kumar Dixit and Philip Knott third equal on 3.5.

There were 27 U14 players and, again, this was closely contested. Ananth Balaji and Akito Oyama drew in Round Four and were joined on 3.5 by Adam C Taylor. The final round saw Ananth defeat Adam, whilst Leo Tsoi beat Akito. This left Ananth sole winner with Leo and Taran Jina second on 4 points. Akito, Adam and Prashast Vir were 4= a further half point behind.

The U 12s was the largest section with 59 players and was very hard fought. Dion Huang, Jake Liang, David Liu and Yang-Jian Zhou were all on 3/3 but then all drew to be joined on 3.5 by James Kearney and Joshua Higgs. In the final round Jake beat James, Joshua beat Dion and Yang-Jian beat David leaving three joint winners. Matthew McLachlan and Richard Zhu shared fourth place.

The U10s had 41 players with Nikolai Hinterreither and Koby Kalavannan sharing first place and Joshua Altman, Anantha Anilkumar and Charlie Mclaren joint third.

8th World Schools Individual Chess Championships 2012

Iasi, Romania 28 April – 6 May - from Hillary Altman et al Here in Iasi, pronounced "Yahhj", the former capital city of Romania, still boasting faded elegance, the voice of the President of the Romanian Chess Federation is booming across the sport hall. It signals that the World Schools Championships and Round 1 are about to begin. The parents' applause (they are over 1000 in number) from the stands that overlook the playing floor is a vigorous kick-off to the many countries, languages and row upon row of children who are assembled. They are firmly tethered to their seats, as FIDE, the world chess organization, holds these serious young players to adult standards – those not seated when the clocks are released, will forfeit.

The players have made their journeys from home countries including Armenia, Azerbaijan, Kazahkstan, Iran, Zimbabwe, Turkey, Israel and Russia, and many of these have been traveling to international tournaments and rigorously training with their teams and coaches as part of their everyday lives and education. Most already hold world rankings. For England's talented junior champions, it is a first opportunity.



The playing floor is filled with the hum of curiosity, anticipation and a few raw nerves, and the stands are filled with hope and excitement. The stakes are high. Over the next 9 days, one round, lasting several hours, will be played each afternoon. World titles, trophies, and triumph are to be had by the winners from each category, boys and girls aged 5-18.

Round 1 pairs top seeded players against unrated ones. That places England in an early underdog position, with some surprising pairings. Under 7 Jeff Tomy is facing the top seed. Under 11 Meytal Cohen is matched against a Hungarian candidate master rated 1786. Max Elliott is facing the 6th seed, from Kazahkstan, rated 1855. Yang-Jian Zhou is facing the 5th seed, a Romanian rated 1976.

The sudden sound of a loud clap from hundreds of clocks being slapped all at once by firm hands brings the hall to silence as first moves are made on the boards. Several seats are empty, and Luke Remus-Elliot and Richard Zhu prevail for England with two early wins by default.



Under 7 Callaghan McCarty-Snead earns an quick draw against a Turkish opponent. And, in one of the day's most exciting wins, an injured player, under 9 Tai Remus-Elliot, cracks on to victory. He was playing with two broken fingers (the most critical kind of disability a chess player can face!) Having spent the earlier part of the day being transported via Romanian ambulance to hospital, he still managed to kick up a pawn storm, opening the kings file and queening a pawn to victory. Tai says of his attacking win, "It was a funny situation, he kept moving his rook back and forth, back and forth, back and forth, on and on!"

19 other heads-in-hands, held high, came in as defeats across the next four hours. The games were long and hard fought, and each an intense challenge against a stronger player, but there were no upsets. Post-game analysis went on into the night, as the team met to together with their coaches with strong camaraderie and quite a few hindsights:

Under 9 Joshua Altman, against a Moldovan opponent, steadily reflects, "I should have trapped a bishop in the middle game, yeah, I should have done that."

Under 13 Anna Purvis, facing a Turkish opponent rated 1638, was a pawn up, had 2 passed pawns, missed blockading with the knight on b6, and misplaced a knight on b8, costing the game. She deadpans with a quick smile, "I blame the coach!"

Under 11 Max Elliott misplaced a queen in middle game, costing him 5 tempo moves to equalise his position, and cost him the game. He declares, "I should have beaten him easily – he was only world #24!"

Under 13 Sam Cobbold, facing an Azerbaijanian rival rated 1711, declared him to have a "disturbing stare." He shares, "It was pretty even through most of the game, I had to swap a passed pawn for a piece and it spiraled downward from there. I was felled by my scary opponent."

Under 13 Ananth Vijayakumar, who faced an Azerbaijanian player rated 1711, got a knight, but his opponent had two passed pawns and pushed it to a queen. Ananth says, "It was unstoppable!"

Finally, for the day, Under 13 Akito Oyama brought home a beautiful win against an unseeded Romanian opponent.

Finding our rhythm

After round 2 today, we have begun to settle in and rely on our talents. The round has just come to a close and as a quick update we have 8 wins and 5 draws to report today. A highlight was in the under 7s, both Callaghan McCarty-Snead and Jeff Tomy won their games.

Sam Cobbold won, too, against a Romanian graded 1764 – they were even throughout until he put his rook on a halfopen file, used two rooks and a knight to slowly tear apart his defense, and forced his opponent to resign in the endgame – he was four pawns up. Ananth Vijayakumar won his game against an Indian opponent. He was even in the opening and the middle until his opponent swapped a knight for his bishop and he managed to capture the pawns, and Ananth managed to get a queen for the win. Alex van Lint prevailed against a Tunisian opponent – he was in a draw situation throughout the game against a stronger player, but in the end sacked his knight and it was check forking the king rook, forcing his opponent to take it and he resigned, basically (says Alex, "although he could have got out of it but didn't") and James Moreby defeated a Romanian. He reports, "I played the English opening, in middle game he accidentally trapped his own bishop, and I was a piece up for the whole game until the endgame where I had a passed pawn and then he sacrificed his knight for a pawn and I went on to win the endgame ... and that's it!" Jake Liang and Karina Chan won their games strongly.

The best draw of the day was held by Richard Zhu, against the top seed from Ukraine, rated 2085. Max Elliott drew against a local "Yahhhj" – he says, "I was attacking for most of the game, but in the end I couldn't keep my attack up, but after that we were still equal and therefore agreed a draw." The girls brought in three solid draws – Eleanor Hapeshi against a Moldovan rated 1480, Jennifer Neil against a Moldovan rated 1420 and Imogen Camp against an Indian opponent.

Joseph Friar, the last to finish, lost by a hair against an Azerbaijani player rated 1822.

A test of nerves

Today, round 3, is probably the most important turning point of the 9 rounds that the players will face. The board orders are starting to sort out into a top and a bottom. For those who have achieved wins so far, about half our team, the pressure is on as they have moved into the higher boards. For the others, today will determine if they've shaken off their arrival jitters – it turns out each of the earlier days' games could have been won, but opportunities were overlooked.

So it's clear while we have strong hope, raw talent and keen ability, there are many other factors at play – the hot climate, noisy room, strange city and opponents who speak different languages and transpose unknown notation symbols.



The first finish of the day is poignant for me – it's Joshua Altman (the author's son), a just-turned 8yr-old playing under 9s, who's previous two rounds were best described as self-defeats. He managed to shrug off round 1, but yesterday's game, round 2, went over 3 hours, and he was way off

his game. In the replay, his coaches' analysis sums it up best:

From Ray Keene, "JUST SEEN JOSHS ROUND V THE RUSSIAN. THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT HE HAD THE RUSSIAN KID CRUSHED LIKE A BUG BUT KEPT ON NOT QUITE FINDING THE KILLER MOVE."

... and from Lorin d'Costa, "did he just get tired or something?"

Sainbayar Tserendorj contributed a more forensic analysis, remastering the key downturns, and finally, Neil McDonald applied motivational tactics, guiding Joshua through games of the ages, a favorite match – Morphy vs Anderson. Joshua's teammates offered many, many pats on the back, and James Moreby's dad brought back a surprise happy meal from McDonalds!

It all worked. Josh settled in, putting it all behind him, and as black, maneuvered an easy tactical win today. He's very pleased to be over his jitters ... two other early wins have come in from Jeff Tomy and Joseph Dalton. More to come shortly as round 3 continues ...

Beware the Levenfish!

Today's round 3 final results are in – we earned a total 9 wins for England, and one 4hr long, hard-won draw by Anna Purvis, the youngest girl playing under 13. Imogen Camp also earned her 1st win for Wales. She says " I set up a trap for my Romanian opponent and she fell for it. She thought it was a swap, but she lost a knight." Jeff Tomy and Callaghan McCarty-Snead both aced their under 7 games, giving Callaghan our team lead with 2½ out of 3. Other winners are Joshua Altman, Max Elliott ('My first international win!' – Max), Yang-Jian Zhou, Eleanor Hapeshi, Akito Oyama and Samuel McConnell.

Joseph Dalton also won – and was impromptu host to an ambassadorial exchange: his Pakistani competitor offered him a coin prior to the outset of their game, 1/100 of a rupee, for goodwill and perhaps a bit of a wink, and Joseph responded equivalently (he thinks) with 50 pence! Joseph went on to defeat and later befriend him!

James Moreby sadly fell afoul of the Levenfish trap, and we are wishing him and the unlucky "13? others, success tomorrow!

A way of life

We are accustomed to the power outages, sporadic hot water, stray dogs, crumbling sidewalks and buildings, and the scarcity of a fresh apple. At the same time, we've come to appreciate our abundance and freedoms, and the team have heightened awareness and appreciation of their privilege. Our notice of these differences is twofold – as we walk down a Romanian street and are permeated by Iasi's everyday life; and as we observe other teams' way of life, knowing that their team membership and performance is a core commodity of their country.

We are sharing accommodation with the Turkish delegation, and have learned their players have been rigorously coached by some of the most formidable names – Karpov, Kasparov – and are housed and supported by their governments. In contrast, the England team and coaches have arrived from different parts of the country, to travel and play together for the first time, in their first international venue. Still, the team spirit and support is remarkable. Bonds sure to last have already been formed among us – the parents, coaches and players.

We have settled by now into our routine. Breakfast is taken as a group. Mornings are spent with coaches, in small sessions individually reviewing games and strategies of our opponents – the pairings are posted for the following day just after rounds' end, and that sparks lively discussion over the evening meal. There is lunch – buffet style in the dining room, although a few of us have undertaken meal replacement strategies ranging from McDonalds to KFC to Pizza Hut (there is one of each). Then we walk or take the 'FIDE' bus to the sport hall. We arrive en masse and then dash for the boards sets in. The rounds begin, and as the players complete their games hours later, they find their way out to the 'magic garden' – a patio hut among the adjoining buildings (some of which are in various states of unfinished or ongoing construction) where parents, players and Sainbayer Tserendorj, 'forensic' coach, gather to share the ups and downs of the games.

Round 4 does not quite mark the halfway point of the 9 rounds, but today the players' pairings reveal the intensity and quality of the anticipated games -

As two England players are set to face each other (Joseph Dalton and Jake Liang) the team gathers around to express their empathy for two friends forced to battle.

Jennifer Neil, U15, will face an Azerbaijani opponent – she has been preparing by studying her rival's previous games, and can plan for the strategy and style she will likely use.

Jim Friar, a coach and dad of Joseph, plays through previous games and offers predictions to Jeff Tomy and Sam Cobbold. Sam's opponent plays the Dragon and e4, and they will look at 'slaying the dragon'. He abstains from coaching Joseph Dalton today, as he will face Jake.

Meytal Cohen, Phoebe Price and Joseph Friar are all hoping for first wins. Imogen, who had her first win yesterday, will now be facing a Woman Candidate Master, and Eleanor Hapeshi will face the under 14 top seed.

As we arrive, the air in the sport hall is stifling and dead still. The daily rumour that parents may be banned from the viewing stands that overlook the players is spreading, and fueling its cause of talking among those eagerly watching. Stern warnings are shouted in Romanian to the stands.

The afternoon unfolds as one might imagine – hot, anxious and slow, but the players, and strong results prevail ...

All good news – for first-time winners Meytal Cohen, Phoebe Price and Joseph Friar, and another win for Ananth Vijayakumar.

Jake Liang's win over team-mate and friend Joseph Dalton was bittersweet, as it was both a win and a loss for England.

Tai Remus-Elliot and Joshua Altman steadily won their under 9 games. Joshua was helped to an even quicker victory when his Moldovan opponent was caught snoozing as his clock expired!

Eleanor Hapeshi drew against the top seeded under 14 girl, Imogen Camp drew against a WCM and Anna Purvis, Jennifer Neil and Richard Zhu brought home three more draws for the day.

The final count in round 4: 7 wins and 5 draws!

Pairings

It's inevitable that friendships, once formed, will be tested. As the World Schools 2012 is an individual championship and the rules have been set, the team now faces some of the tournament's toughest hurdles – those which pit team-mates against each other and apply pressure to newly discovered friendships.

Yesterday's round 4 match between Jake Liang and Joseph Dalton was no oddity. 3 more England-England games are scheduled for today. Sam Cobbold will play Alex van Lint, Luke Remus-Elliot will face Samuel McConnell, and Tai Remus-Elliot will face his best buddy, Joshua Altman.



In the case of Sam vs Alex, they have different coaches and live in opposite parts of England. Says alex, "I think its really bad, we came to play other people instead of our own team." Sam says, "I don't feel great because he's one of my friends, but in the end it's a game and we'll still be good friends."

From Luke, optimistically "At least he will speak English!" and from Samuel, a shrug and an "I'm not sure."

For Tai and Joshua, they are both 8 years old and chums. They share a coach in GM Neil McDonald. The three spent the morning preparing together by going through some of Bobby Fischer's best games, doing puzzles, and trying to laugh it off, perhaps a bit too hard. The players chime together a response in earnest "I want to win" when asked about their feelings. Neil reflects, "This is a world championship, a hard fought draw would be everyone's best outcome – a nice, clean fight."

Sun Tzu states timelessly in The Art of War, "He who knows when he can fight and when he cannot, will be victorious." As the players all proudly sport their England t-shirts, it is hard not to notice the resemblance of the England flag they wear abreast to the universal symbol for a draw (index fingers crossed into a +)!

Our best games

We are proud of our 5th round results today -11 wins and 3 draws. The buzz has changed - no longer are sighs from 'blunders' being heard. Rather, the team have settled into a more sophisticated and analytical vocabulary of strategy, position and tactics.

Those winning today were Anna Purvis, Phoebe Price, Eleanor Hapeshi, Yang-Jian Zhou, Richard Zhu, Akito Oyama and Joseph Friar. Additional wins, hailed as ambivalent successes, were earned by Luke Remus-Elliot, Alex van Lint and Joshua Altman, who fought solidly against their own England team-mates, and a bye for Jennifer Neil. Meytal Cohen, Callaghan McCarty-Snead, and Karina Chan all held their own evenly, earning draws.

Eleanor Hapeshi, playing under 13 girls, earned a personal best against her Romanian opponent – she now boasts 3 points, exceeding her own early target of 2. Says Eleanor, "I calculated quite far but it took me longer than I thought to checkmate her." She credits her win to spot-on preparation and coaching she's received from IM Lawrence Cooper, and notes that he recapped her opponent's games, digging all the way back to 2009. Her mum agrees that the coaching has been critical in order to play at a world-class level.



Richard Zhu, competing in under 13s, who drew yesterday against the top seed, surpassed that today with a strong win against a Romanian opponent.

In the game

We are expecting our best efforts to prevail today. Round 6 has just begun, the 2/3 mark of the championships. Most noticeable among the 24 England team players is their self-assuredness and determination. Each has earned multiple wins or draws and is well-accustomed to the rigor (and danger of distraction) of the 4-hour round. The game is the focus, finally, as it should be, and each player has the stamina needed. The players and coaches have been working together, preparing for hours every morning and evening. There is a synergy and working style about approaches and a strong desire to achieve. Our hopes are high as this afternoon unfolds.

Chess is an endurance sport, no mistake, these players know their endgame is within reach ...

... well – all but two results are in. On our best day yet we can report 9 wins and 5 draws so far. That places Akito Oyama and Callaghan McCarty-Snead on 4 points and Joshua Altman on $3\frac{1}{2}$.

Wins were earned by Akito, Callaghan, Jake Liang (in a quick tactical game), Luke Remus-Elliot, Tai Remus-Elliot, Imogen Camp, Anna Purvis, Jennifer Neil and Meytal Cohen, whose game will appear here soon – her coach, Sabrina Chevannes, said it was 'really well played!'

Vijayakumar, Max Elliott and Samuel McConnell.

In a candid moment, Callaghan gave a 'celebrity radio interview' to Romanian Kiss FM! When asked if he had had a chance to see the city, he answered an honest "No!"

Chess diplomacy

As round 7 gets underway today, something is different. Handshakes and smiles, usually saved for team-mates, are being offered eagerly across the aisle, to now familiar faces, former and future opponents.

Players are comfortable on this new world stage – many have exchanged small gifts, postcards and emails. Our team has befriended the Turkish, Mongolian, Pakistani and Zimbabwean players. The Romanian team, our local hosts, have been among the most eager to engage in new friendships. As the only team who has not traveled internationally for the event, they seem particularly aware of the faraway places that each visitor represents.

They have found a way to communicate, playing friendly chess games and football, where English is not understood. They are talking about when they will meet again – at the European championships, World Youth and beyond. It's a display of both sportsmanship and respect, and a certain sign of future leadership – that these game players, the youth of many disparate countries, are open to exchange ...

... five – nill First five games in, all wins! Well played Jeff Tomy, Joshua Altman, James Moreby, Joseph Dalton and Sam Cobbold!

... two more straight wins just in – Akito Oyama and Yang-Jian Zhou ...

Quotes from the winners ...

Akito Oyama, who leads the team on 5 points, of his game against an Azerbaijani opponent -

"I played quite an aggressive opening, so I tried my best to crush his king and it worked."

Joshua Altman, on 4½ points, of his game against Romanian Isfan Ioan-Marius –

"I feel like I played my best and I concentrated, and I deserved to win!"

Yang-Jian Zhou, now on $3\frac{1}{2}$ points, earned his win today against Abdul al-Hamed from the United Arab Emirates, rated 1787 -

"Coach GM Neil McDonald prepared me well, and I attacked Abdul on the queen side, until he collapsed."

Sam Cobbold, about his Zimbabwean opponent -

"I wiped the floor with him – slowly I whipped away pieces and pawns, until there was nothing. But we shook hands, played cola bottle cricket (an England team innovation) and I've made a new friend!"

Joseph Dalton, on his win against a Pakistani opponent, who is one of his new friends made here in Romania (and a cola bottle cricket player) - "I was part of the one-point gang and I wanted it – today we all won, me, Sam and James. I feel great."

James Moreby, who "caught the toad-in-the-hole," as he faced a Romanian boy called Toader –

"I won in 39 moves because he swapped off all the pieces."

 \ldots and of Jeff Tomy's clean, tactical win, coach Jim Friar said -

"Jeff had never seen that opening, it was good preparation and he played as predicted. I met Jeff walking on the road after the game and he was well pleased! "

Underdogs - honourable mentions

Also worth noting – the girls' losses over the last couple days have been amazing battles. Imogen & Eleanor's games were 4hrs+, 80-90 move games, and Anna Purvis succumbed narrowly today to an U14 rated #80 in the world! Phoebe also held on, but was ultimately defeated by a ranked Russian opponent.

Deep into that darkness peering ...

It feels as if we are nearing the close – only two rounds to go, departure flights being posted and trophies now on displayand within reach for some. The players have settled right in, the FIDE arbiters have all but given up on trying to evict noisy parents from the hall. The parents are all a bit tightlipped as we know the final stakes – and the ticking clock against them.



As we are somewhere deep in Transylvania, and there is a thunderstorm overhead this afternoon, a bit of dark romanticism is in order – Edgar Allan Poe and the sentiment of his 'tell-tale heart' comes to mind. As in the poem, there is in this room a heightening of acute senses, a pounding becoming louder and louder in our heads as the windows go dark and the intensity of the final games unfolds. My son's opponent has a 'vulture eye' and I can see him leaning far over the board, trying to stare him down, I am sure of it! Like Poe, I feel I will explode, I must jump up and scream!

Thankfully the other parents remind me to remain sane, and collectively we come up with a bit of Romanian relief. They remind me -

1 – There IS a Romanian word for 'Yes' ... CASH!2 – We have successfully liberated the butter – butter for

everyone!

3 -It's raining – we can shower outside instead of under the brown water that comes from the tap!

4 -It is the weekend, which means there will be a new wine offered to our group, as it quietly 'disappears' from the catered event being held on the premises. We speculate the bride and groom will not notice the double dipping, oops we mean double tipping!

5 - It's raining, the lone internet signal will surely be down everywhere – no need to all rush for the internet chair

6 – It's raining, the power will go out any moment – might as well head for the Moldova mall, as the Kalashnikov shop (located conveniently between the children's toy shop and the KFC) surely has its own generator!

 $7-{\rm At}$ least the dogs will get a bath, we can cross flea powder off our wish list!

8 - Ah-choo! sounds conveniently like "Ceausescu!"

9 - Our children have learned the language. Who minds they are the words we never want them to repeat

10 – We won't need our own invisible ink if the roof begins leaking onto the players scoresheets – but we will still be wondering how those Romanian pgn files keep getting misplaced

Still wishing for a pair of binoculars, but we're all laughing heartily (of course in quiet whispers) now, and the players, the reason we wouldn't trade a moment of this great adventure, are beginning to finish their games. Prague Trip 2012 - Under 12s

Our annual Under 12 trip this year was to Prague where we were guests of Jaroslav Nemec and the Caritas Organisation. On Saturday 2nd June two groups assembled. Daniel Abbas, Matthew Fergusson, Ashwin Kalyana, James Kearney, Mark Kenyon and Johann Power met Glynis and Peter at Manchester and flew to Prague via Frankfurt. Although we were slightly late in Frankfurt we still had plenty of time and arrival in Prague was early. Meanwhile Victor was at Heathrow meeting Joshua Higgs, Taran Jina, David Liu, Matthew McLachlan, Richard Meikle-Briggs, James Meredith, Gwilym Price, Billy Twigge-Molecey, Prashast Vir and Richard Zhu. Their plane was about 10 minutes late in to Prague. We were all met at the airport by Jaroslav's family and employees and taken to the Pension Krystal which is owned by Caritas. We settled in and had dinner after which the players went in to the garden and played soccer whilst Victor, Glynis and I had a meeting with Jaroslav. We then had a meeting with the players before going to bed ready for a speed chess tournament the next day.

The timings in the Czech Republic can be a culture shock for our players as breakfast was 0700 and round one (of nine) was at 0915. The event took place at Rakovnik which was just over an hours drive towards Plsen and was 20 minutes each on the clock. This was a local one day event with almost all the other 34 players being adults with an average rating of about 1950 so we were in for a tough day. As only two of our players had fide ratings we were kept apart in round one but the standard was high and we were almost all playing top half players. This showed in the results (+3 = 1 - 12). Round Two only had one inter squad game (drawn) and our final total was +8=4-4. Round three was fairly typical of the yoyo effect as we scored +4 = 2 -10. Round four result was +2 = 8 -6 and at the lunch break our top player was Mark Kenyon on 2.5. His reward was a 2017 player and the result was predictable giving Joshua Higgs. Gwilym Price and Richard Zhu the chance to leapfrog him. Fortified by a good lunch we produced our second best result in round 5 with +4 = 7 -5. In round six only Gwilym of our top three won leaving him our sole player on 4\6 but a 2104 opponent undid him in round seven and he was joined on 4 by Matthew McLachlan and Billy Twigge-Molecey. Round six was +5 = 4 -7 whilst round seven was very similar

with +5 = 3 -8. Gwilym lost again in round eight but Matthew and Billy won to move on to 5 points. Our score this round was 9 (+7 = 4 - 5) – perhaps we are getting used to the time limit! In the final round Billy and Matthew were paired and any result other than a draw should see them in the prize list. Matthew won our vital battle to finish off with $6 \\ 9$ The final round produced 91/2 points (+9 =1 -6) so ending off very strongly. Matthew got 9th place prize and Billy got the prize for the best U1800. It is a measure of the strength of the tournament that the best 1800 was almost halfway down. By standard conversion only two of our players are over 1800 so the scores were certainly as good as we could expect. We then returned to the hotel taking a little longer as there were traffic jams coming in to Prague but we were still eating just after 1900 and after another good meal the boys went out to play football. We then had our usual meeting and headed for bed.

Monday looked to be a busy day although we were thankful for an 0830 breakfast. Our first activity was bowling and we were there for two hours. The best of the players (by a long way) was Mark Kenyon who averaged 75 per game although all of them seemed to enjoy themselves and the gutters did not see too much use! We then had an outside simultaneous against WGM Katerina Nemcova. She was given a hard time by our 16 youngsters and conceded losses to James Meredith, Joshua Higgs and Johann Power. We were running a bit late going on our sightseeing of Prague and started off with a tram trip to the city centre where we met our guide. We got the funicular up Castle Hill (Perlin) and looked at the Hungry Wall (a 15th century job creation scheme) then the Czech Eiffel Tower before going in a mirror maze which proved great fun. (The old ones are still very good!). We then walked to the main castle but were forced in to a café by very heavy rain which, of course, further delayed us. We saw the changing of the guard at the castle entrance then looked round the outside of the castle and St Vitus Cathedral before walking down Golden Street and out down the Old Castle Steps. We then went to Charles Bridge with all its statues before going across it and meeting our transport the far side. We were then taken out to a newly opened gym complex (owned by our hosts brother) where the players had a 4 a side soccer competition won by Prashast, Tara, James K and Matthew Mc whilst Glynis and I had a swim. We then gorged ourselves on pizzas before the players had a mini soccer competition won by Josh. Then it was back to the hotel, a quick meeting and bed.

Tuesday started with an 0800 breakfast after which we got on the bus for our castles tour. There was heavy rain on the journey which, fortunately had stopped by the time we reached Konopiste Castle. This was the home of Crown prince France Ferdinand, his wife Sophie and there three children and was almost an exile as the Hapsburg establishment did not approve of Sophie. However with his love of hunting (there are over 3000 trophies in the castle) he was happy with his situation. Unfortunately for the pair they were sent to Sarajevo in 1914 and the rest is history. The Czechoslovak government confiscated all Hapsburg possessions and the castle is now in state ownership. Fortunately most of the furniture, the superb collection of weapons and the trophies remained intact and it was this that we were shown during an excellent tour. We then had time in the souvenir shops before moving on. We then had roughly an hours drive to Karlstein where we went to a very nice local restaurant. Fish and chips proved the favourite – two fish each! – whilst a few others sampled the rest of the menu.

We walked up to the castle which was steep but OK and followed this with a guided tour of the castle. This was built by Charles IV who seems to be the most revered of the Czech monarchs. It had become ruined in the 19th century but was reconstructed in the late 19th century so much of what is seen is not very old. Nevertheless it was furnished authentically. It is in three parts, residence, central tower (which includes the religious areas) and the treasury tower where the crown jewels used to be kept. This area has never been taken in battle. After the tour we walked down through the village and got the coach back to Prague. Here we were in the Oasis Chess Club playing a match against Prague Juniors. They were slightly older than us but we are, of course, a national team. The time limits were faster than we had hoped for but the lads acquitted themselves well winning 11-5 with white and 81/2 - $7^{1/2}$ with black to give us victory $19^{1/2} - 12^{1/2}$. Only Ashwin, Richard MB and Gwilym got 2\2 in what was a well fought match. We then had the good old continental favourite, the blitz tournament! This was dominated by the Hollan twins (who played in the South Wales International in Penarth). Petr Hollan was first with 61/2 Martin Hollan 2nd with 6 and Mark 3rd with 51/2. Boxes of chocolate were also won by Daniel 4th, Billy 5th, Parshast 8th, Richard 9th and Ashwin 10th. We returned to the hotel for our final dinner there and, as I send this, they are having a quiz which has been arranged by our hosts as part of their "Boy of the Visit" competition.

Wednesday was another 0800 breakfast after which we packed and those efficient enough had a last game of soccer. The final thanks were then said and the results of "Boy of the Visit" were announced. This saw Johann Power winner with Mark Kenyon runner up. We then headed for the old town square where we did our last souvenir shopping and saw the astronomical clock working before heading for the airport where we separated and flew home after a very successful trip. Many thanks are due to Jaroslav Nemec, his family and the Caritas team for putting together a brilliant package and I am sure the boys enjoyed it, learnt a lot and formed greater friendships.

Regional matches v Wales 2012 - from Peter Purland

The matches between SE England and Wales and SW England and Wales took place in Monmouth School over the weekend of June 9th and 10th. Part of the object of these matches from the English point of view is to give players who just missed out on the England team a chance to experience an international match. The South East is usually the strongest area and is so again, but what Victor and I found very disappointing were the number of players who, at the trial six weeks ago, were definitely available but somehow, when they failed to get in the team, something else came up and they could not travel to Wales. The number this year was

10 out of 22 and, although obviously some have a good reason, most do not. From a team point of view, our reliable team members were willing to fill the gaps and the result was probably better than it would have been but that is not the point – commitment is lacking from either parent, child or both.

Anyway, on to the chess – the U14s played well to gain the victory by $15\frac{1}{2} - 4\frac{1}{2}$ and three newcomers to the scene gained valuable experience and, in two cases, 2 points! It was pleasing to see the top four boards winning $5\frac{1}{2} - 2\frac{1}{2}$ against a strong Welsh foursome. The U12s were stronger than intended and this showed with a 9-1 first round victory, although 4 games went beyond the 2 hour mark. The second round was closer $(8\frac{1}{2} - 3\frac{1}{2})$ although SE still ran out comfortable winners $19\frac{1}{2} - 4\frac{1}{2}$. Here again it was good to see two late replacements getting maximum score. The U10 match proved the closest in the first round with England (not just South East) winning 8-4 but they came back in the second round to win 10-2 and take the match 18-6. Three matches went to the final few minutes so the score was not fully reflective of the effort put in.

Sunday saw the South West come to Monmouth. Both SW teams appeared as selected, as did the Welsh, and a much closer match was anticipated. This proved true in the U14s where the score after the first round was 5-5. However in the U12s the Welsh team played very well and turned round 9-3 to the good. I would have been interested to hear Victor's team talk but I am barred (particularly when Wales are involved!) It was obviously a very successful team talk as the U14s roared back to win $6\frac{1}{2} - 3\frac{1}{2}$ and thus take the match $11\frac{1}{2} - 8\frac{1}{2}$ and. Although the task was beyond the U12s, they did at least reduce the margin of loss, finally going down 16 - 8 (7-5 in round two).

ECF Afternoon School Chess Tournament

Played at Wilson's School, 27th June – report by Neill Cooper The inaugural ECF Afternoon School Chess Tournament was a great success. 8 schools took part fielding a total of 16 teams with 4 players in each team. The Elite tournament consisted of just 4 teams, two from hosts Wilson's and two from nearby Sutton GS. The Main tournament of 12 teams included many players who had not played chess for their school before.

The Main tournament was very close throughout. It was run on a game score (rather than match score) so all 16 games counted. Going in to the last round 1 point covered the top 6 teams. In the end the joint winners were Wallington County Grammar School and Wilson's Southwark House team with 10.5 out of 16. Equal third were the two Emanuel School teams and another Wilson's team.

Whilst Wilson's, Sutton, Wallington and Emanuel play each year in the Briant Poulter (Surrey Secondary School) League, there were 4 other schools taking part who do not regularly play inter-school chess. Of these the top school was Warlingham School who scored 8 points, half a point ahead of St Peter's A with Ewell Castle team third and Nonsuch fourth.

Just one of the 48 players in this section won all their games, Daniel Coleman of Wallington. Wilson's Camberwell House team draw all four matches 2 - 2.

The Elite section was played as 2 paired matches between the Wilson's and Sutton GS teams. Some of the players had problems adjusting to a Fischer time limit of 10 mins + 2 secs per move. After the first two matches Wilson's A were in the lead with 6 point with Sutton A second on 4.5. The final result saw a turnaround with Sutton A winning on 10.5/16 followed by Wilson's B with 9.5 (ahead of Wilson's A). Two players in this section won all their games – Adam Taylor (Wilson's B) and Keith Barker (Wilson's A)

Glorney Cup report 2012

This report includes comments on the Gilbert (U18 girls), Robinson (U14) and Stokes (U12) Cups. The event was held at Daventry Court Hotel which is one of the Puma Hotels chain and the venue for some of the 4NCL events. The venue was definitely hailed as the best in 20 years and if we have to go back to student accommodation it will be. Playing conditions were spacious and quiet, rooms were very comfortable and the food was good and at sensible prices. Unfortunately England is the only country with more than three of this chain and where they are only in the main cities they tend to be considerably more expensive. However, we can but hope for the future!

Now to the chess -

This year the competition proved much closer with England certainly not having everything their own way, although at the end of day two they were leading in three of the four tournaments. In the Glorney the first round saw 3-2 wins for England and Scotland but in round two England defeated Scotland 4-1 whilst Ireland accounted for Wales $3^{1}/_{2} - 1^{1}/_{2}$. On the second day Wales defeated Scotland $3^{1}/_{2} - 1^{1}/_{2}$ whilst England got a whitewash against Ireland. The second day saw the first of the reverse games with Scotland and Wales doing better but going down 3-2 to England and Ireland respectively. This left England on 15 points, Wales on 9, Ireland $8^{1}/_{2}$ and Scotland $7^{1}/_{2}$. In the Gilbert we have had a lot of draws with 13/24 games ending even. Again things are fairly tight with England leading on 8, Scotland on $6^{1}/_{2}$, Ireland on 5 and Wales on $4^{1}/_{2}$.

The Robinson Cup is even closer. On day one Wales defeated England $4\frac{1}{2} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ and Ireland 4-2 but did not keep this pace up drawing with Scotland and losing 2-4 to Ireland. Scotland meanwhile lost $2\frac{1}{2} - 3\frac{1}{2}$ to England in their first meeting but gained revenge by the same margin in the return. They also won 5-1 against Ireland whilst England beat Ireland $3\frac{1}{2} - 2\frac{1}{2}$. This left Scotland leading narrowly with 14 points from Wales $13\frac{1}{2}$, England on 11 and Ireland on $9\frac{1}{2}$. The Stokes Cup is looking like an English victory although their total of $16\frac{1}{2}$ is only 5 ahead of Ireland with Scotland a further point behind and Wales on $9\frac{1}{2}$. Again almost all the games have been close with England's 5-1 win in round 4 pushing them well ahead.

To date the tournament has been played in a friendly, sporting manner and we look forward to some exciting chess in the final two rounds ...

We started the last day at 0900 to facilitate departures and the morning proved decisive in two tournaments but left the other two open. In the Glorney a $3\frac{1}{2} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ win for England over Wales gave England an unassailable lead although only one point separates the other three countries so there is still a lot to play for. The Gilbert saw 4/6 games and both matches drawn leaving England still $1\frac{1}{2}$ points ahead. In the Robinson Scotland and Ireland drew whilst Wales lost $2\frac{1}{2} - 3\frac{1}{2}$ to England and entered the final round 1 point behind Scotland but with the better tie break. Finally England built up an unas-

sailable lead in the Stokes beating Wales $4\frac{1}{2} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ whilst Scotland beat Ireland $3\frac{1}{2} - 2\frac{1}{2}$ leaving both countries tied on 14 points.

The first section to be completed was the Stokes where England saw off Ireland leaving Scotland, who had beaten Wales 4-2 in second place. The final tally was England 27, Scotland 18, Ireland 14 and Wales 13. The Robinson which all through had been the most exciting, went down to the last game with Scotland needing a win to clinch the title. England came third after drawing with Ireland. The final game finished 20 minutes from time with Rhys Bennett holding his nerve to clinch a 4-2 victory for Wales and with it the Robinson Cup: The final scores being Wales 20 points, Scotland 19, England 171/2 and Ireland 151/2. This is the first time Wales have ever won any section in this competition! The Gilbert also went down to the wire but a draw against Ireland ensured a win for England with 11 points followed by Scotland 10 pts, Ireland on 8pts and Wales 7pts. England had secured the Glorney with a round to go but the battle for second place went down to the last minute. England defeated Ireland $3\frac{1}{2} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ whilst James Thomas won a mad time scramble to gain a 3-2 win for Wales and second place. The final scores being England 22, Wales 131/2, Scotland 13 and Ireland 111/2 thus ending an excellent tournament with good chess and good sportsmanship throughout. After the prize giving we all departed for our various homes with many meeting in the North East the following week.

Visit of Saxon Chess Players August 2012

In 2010 a group of 8 Junior Squad youngsters aged 11 and 12 visited Saxony after Victor had received an invitation to come during the Paignton Congress. Looking back in the diary I saw that we won the match 29-3 but I had commented that the Saxons were young but I felt had promise and I would be interested to see them in two years time playing our U12s. This was to be the opportunity as 5 of the 8 players were in the team that visited us.

The Saxons arrived at Liverpool Airport on Friday 10th August and settled down in their hotel. The leaders then met to sort out the programme after which they had a night's sleep. On Saturday, the Saxons and I met at Liverpool Town Hall. We chatted for a bit before going on an extensive tour of the city including There were quite good views although, unusually for this summer, there was a heat haze. They then walked down to the Beatles Story but there was a long queue so they spent time in Chavasse Park before going on to the cinema. Sunday was "Ferry Cross the Mersey" day but as well as the cruise they visited Spaceport and the Wallace and Gromit exhibition at Seacombe, had a picnic lunch and went on to Woodside to view the U Boat. They tried to repatriate it but their efforts were fruitless (it is surprisingly Danish property) so they returned to Liverpool empty handed.

Monday was the first of two days devoted mostly to chess. A minibus picked us up at the hotel and we were taken to Manchester Museum of Science and Industry (MOSI) where we spent a couple of hours looking round, using many interactive exhibits and seeing a textile making demonstration.

After lunch it was down to the chess. We played two 50 minute games at MOSI where the Saxons showed how much they had improved by winning 15-1!! We then went to Bolton for a fish and chip supper followed by a blitz tournament at Bolton Chess Club. We managed a total of 34 players and this included adults (some being of a high standard) and was won on 5\5 by Henrik Hoffmann who was the Saxon coach and plays for one of the teams in the 4NCL. Second place was shared by Robert Kreyssig, Joseph McPhillips, Selina Moses and Anna Nobis with Selina getting the trophy on tie break. Afterwards the coach took us back to Liverpool. After a night's sleep the Saxons got the train to Town Green where they were met by cars and taken to Aughton St Michael's where they were to play a combined England and Lancashire team.

Unfortunately, from an English point of view, the match went the way of Monday with some good games but the English coming off second best. Hari was the only one to score gaining a draw when his opponent made an illegal move in time trouble. This gave us our only half point. We then had a buffet lunch provided by the school and then got on to the second round. After three defeats it was Hari again who broke our duck. This was a far better round with the 4 England players drawing 2-2 and Cameron getting a draw on board 5. The final score was England 3 -13 Saxony but with some good close games. We then started the rapidplay in which we had 33 players. The Saxons gradually moved to the top but were challenged by Zheming Zhang (who came second=) and Kyle Sharpe who came fourth. The winner was Theo Gungl (board 2) half a point ahead of Zheming and Robert Kreyssig (Board 1). We then went to the Stanley Arms for a farewell dinner after which the Saxons returned to their hotel and flew out Wednesday.

World Junior Chess Championship 2012

Our group all played close to or just below their rating, but this is too strong a tournament to expect to gain much in the way of rating

points!

The hotel and playing venue, Titania Hotel, in the centre of Athens (very close to the Acropolis), proved to be an excellent venue and the whole event was very well organised by the Greek Chess Federation.

World U-16 Olympiad Istanbul 2012

– from Glenn Flear

This is the first time that the youth Olympiad has been run concurrently with the mainstream Olympiad. So the experience gained by playing in a competitive team event abroad, is enhanced by the chance to watch and rub shoulders with many of the leading players in the world.

England's team of five, Marcus Harvey, Oskar Hackner, Roy Zhang, Amy Hoare, and Daniel Noel, is being coached by yours truly, GM Glenn Flear.

The venue is the Istanbul Trade centre, an enormous complex of exhibition halls, so playing conditions are modern, spacious, air-conditioned, and generally ideal for large chess events.



We are staying in a student dormitory, a short bus journey away, where the players are also eating their meals. The food is Turkish, so relatively new to most visitors. It's edible but, to put it mildly, it's not exactly the favourite type of food of our five English teenagers! The rooms are hot and a little noisy, as we are next to a busy road, but the organizers have been helpful to make the stay enjoyable. Electric fans have appeared, and each person has their own locker and desk. Indeed, despite the multi-person rooms, they are not cramped. We have also been supplied with a 3G dongle, to ease our earlier problems with the Internet.

As for the chess, the infamous five are using their preparation time by looking at all aspects of chess intensely. The preparation doesn't always crop up, as the names of the actual opponents are revealed very late, but the work they are putting into their game should pay dividends in the future.

So far the England team has won two matches out of three, but lost heavily to the third seeds:

Round 1: Lebanon 0.5-3.5 England Round 2: England 0-4 India (ouch!) Round 3: Sweden 1-3 England

A fourth round pairing against Greece, who are very slightly higher-rated than England, will be a real test.

England U-16 Team at the halfway stage in Istanbul. After five rounds, 19th seeded England is in 17th place in the Youth Olympiad.

A disappointing end to the Greek match was followed up with a comfortable victory over a useful Slovakian team. Complicated struggles in Roy Zhang's and Oskar Hackner's games, yesterday in the Greek match, could have gone either way, but Roy was only able to draw and Oskar lost.

4th round – England 1.5-2.5 Greece 5th round – Slovakia-B 1-3 England

Against Slovakia, top board Marcus Harvey won his third win in a row, while Oskar Hackner kept up his 100% record with the white pieces. Roy and Daniel drew their games to complete a fine victory over the younger of the two Slovakian teams.

Scores so far: England has a total of 11/20 (3 matches won, 2 lost).

Marcus 3.5/5, Oskar 3/5, Roy 2/4, Amy 1/3, Daniel 1.5/3

An unfortunate problem with picking four players, from a squad of five, is that it is very hard to even out the colours. So for example, from the first six rounds Amy Hoare has had four Blacks with no Whites, while Daniel Noel has only played with White!

Round 6 report

In the sixth round England lost a hotly-contested match against South Africa.

On board one Marcus Harvey held a dubious looking position, due largely to his opponent's time trouble. On board two, Oskar Hackner was pressing to win, but went astray and eventually lost, again with time playing a part. Amy Hoare went down in complications on third board, as the bishop and two pawns proved to be stronger than Amy's rook. Daniel Nöel was England's only winner, when his neat combination netted a pawn, which was duly converted in the endgame.

Round 6: South Africa 2.5-1.5 England

England is in 20th place right in the middle of the table. The team visited the central part of Istanbul on the rest day, as can be seen in the photo taken by the famous Blue Mosque.



Youth Olympiad over for 2012

In the final round England narrowly lost out to a tough Turkmenistan team. Daniel Noel defended solidly, whereas Roy had to find a route to safety after his opponent sacrificed a piece. Amy had a complicated game where her opponent obtained good play at first with a combination. The young English star then found a resourceful defence, involving a temporary piece sacrifice, to steer the dangerous complications into safer territory. A repetition at the end sealed the draw. Oskar was the only loser after his opponent played a fine game in the King's Indian.

Round Ten: England 1.5-2.5 Turkmenistan

The team finished on 19/40 which put them towards the top of the second-half of the table.

The preparation sessions involved the players helping each other and sharing their ideas and own analyses. It was a pleasure to be part of such a constructive atmosphere. The team spirit remained excellent throughout and the five players deserve credit for their 'esprit de corps'. I was also impressed at the way the players took adversary on the chin, and rebounded with the desire to fight back.

Here are the final scores of the team members:

Marcus Harvey 4.5/9 (a passionate self-confident chessoholic full of original ideas)

Oskar Hackner 4/9 (strong with the initiative)

Roy Zhang 4/7 (positionally sound and tough to beat)

Amy Hoare 2/7 (took lots of awkward Blacks, finished with two gritty draws)

Daniel Noel 4.5/8 (cautious, but gained greatly in confidence as the event progressed)

The experience gained should see these youngsters in good stead in future, and I anticipate them all being stronger for the experience. If they are to be your future opponents, be warned!

For 30 kids from England ...

... it's about 330 games of chess, 3 rollercoasters and a skislope! Today, the England Team arrived in Maribor, Slovenia, to prepare to compete in the World Youth Chess Championships that begin tomorrow afternoon, and unfold with 11 rounds over the next 11 days. 100 countries have sent their most promising players, ages 8 to 18, to participate. We are equal among the best in the world from China, Russia, India, and many more. It is the opportunity of a lifetime.

The City of Maribor has set the stage. There are banners and billboards welcoming us. Every effort has been made to make us feel we're on holiday. There is a pizza truck, a party tent with old-fashioned arcade games, dancing music, a trampoline, and an ample supply of sugary sodas and energy drinks. Even our airlines handed out bars of Toblerone and bags of Gummi Bears. There is a high level of service and comfort, and everyone has a smile. The weather is sunny and perfectly brisk. And there is a mountain to climb.

Our hotel is the Arena – an aptly named modern and cozy theatre for such an event, perched at the foot of a steep ski run – grand and grassy this time of year, that appears from below to dissolve into the sky. A lively bevy of girls, some of the first to arrive, raced toward its top and encountered a lone baby wolf, who they stared down in sober practice for the determination that will be required to prevail here.

The Arena is set at the top of a hilly compound of five buildings – the Habakuk and the Gras, which are the main playing halls, the party tent, and an adjacent building of flats for larger family groups. There are rocky footpaths, quiet connecting roads, a still pond and an empty playground in between. Inside the playing halls are the sleek, tell-tale rows of boards, clocks and pieces, hundreds upon hundreds, laid carefully atop elegant white tablecloths. The fiery clouds closing in overhead mimic the anticipation in this expectant village.

And the ups and downs of this pitching topography are like the rollercoasters the players must withstand. The first is their voyage to Slovenia – a bumpy ride by plane, train, coach and car through Birmingham, London, Marrakesh, Milan, Vienna, Zagreb, Munich, Frankfurt and Graz, via missed connections and border delays, to reach Maribor. The second is their emotional journey – a true test of the desire to be the best, strength of character, and talent as they are measured at each move, in every game. Finally, it is the ride of our lives – at the base of this mountain, we prepare tonight for our ascent to its peak.

Brainwaves and bandwidth

The England Team is now underway at the 2012 World Youth Chess Championships. Everyone has achieved points, and the board orders are sorting into a top, middle and bottom. Of the 11 rounds the 1500 players from 100 countries will play here -16,500 games in all - today's are perhaps the most rigorous test of mind, as rounds 5 and 6 are the midpoint and will be played within hours of each other, leaving little time for pause or preparation in between. A rest day will follow,

then one-a-day rounds for the remaining 5 games. Along this spectrum, today is the bottleneck. Only the best minds will break through it ...

As the mountain looms above from our base camp in the Arena, we have been fine-tuning. The players, coaches and parents all gather in the team room, where there is a less temperamental internet connection and a steady din of excitement rising as the Grandmasters, youngest and oldest team players all mix easily, sharing games and tactics of opponents faced and then overcome. A group of parents have set out on their own trek, a straight-up hike to conquer the top of the slope, and an attempt to make the long journey back down has gone astray, requiring a course-correction. A daily one-way ritual has emerged now that the return by gondola has been discovered.

As we enter the playing hall, a visual wavelength of players is also assembling, across a range of colours. The bottom boards have trended a subtle citrus, the colour of the Slovenian team's hoodies, as many of the local players are less-experienced and here just to take part in the grand event. The middle hall is filled with red track suits - the bold colour of the big countries who have put forth large teams (Russia, Turkey, and USA), splattered with the white tops of Bulgaria, Mongolia and Peru and the smart, trim navy of India's fitted blazers and England's sporty polos. The top boards are a mix of players' most comfortable attire, muted hoodies and Ts from Abercrombie, Gap and Nike. Further down, the rest of the room washes in pink, as the pony-tailed girls from nearly every country seem to fancy princesses and Barbie. Hundreds of final words fill the floor simultaneously in different languages, resonating.

We feel this kinetic energy bouncing all around us against a backdrop of caffeinated drink sponsor, Shark. The players' thoughts must certainly operate at this superfrequency of an incredible human chess brain. It seems these highwired brainwaves could explode beyond the walls of the inanimate building. It is notable that Andrew Marr in "The History of the Planet" marks the moment of the Big Blue Computer defeating a human as paramount to realigning the natural order of our world. But here, in right order, all calculations are left up to the individual player – to face himself against his opponent and the unexpected moves and outcomes only the human mind can achieve.

As the games begin, the decibels inside plummet to zero and we are relegated as observers to an endless live video loop set to mute. Only our human ability to read body language from intermittent pixels keeps the current flowing at steady speed

Slovenia – Head of Delegation's midway-through-theevent update

Well, round 6 has just started and I thought it was about time to put pen to paper (or more accurately fingers to keyboard). The England team of 34 players, 9 coaches and more than 30 family members is very happily settled into the Hotel Arena. The chess is going well, with a team score after five rounds in excess of 50%, with 2 players unbeaten, with one in the top ten of his section, and with players and coaches working together in a fantastic spirit. The Slovenian organisers have done an excellent job, and in most cases are open and approachable. All of which makes being head of delegation of such a large group much easier than it might have been!

On the hotel, we are walking distance from the playing venue; and we are by far the largest group staying in what is a relatively small and intimate hotel. (Team Scotland are also here, as is the Hong Kong team of one, and some of the Canadians). The staff are great, the beds are comfortable, and the food is both varied and plentiful. A number of the veterans of numerous previous such trips rank it amongst the top environments an England junior team has ever had; personally I can't yet claim veteran status but it's certainly the best I have experienced.

About the only quibble is that the local telecoms network can't cope with the demand being put on it by hundreds of chess players in our hotel and elsewhere in the neighbourhood simultaneously all trying to access the internet to look up their opponents' games and so on. I and others have got round this by using the excellent 3G mobile coverage when necessary.

My co-correspondent Hillary Altman has eloquently described the beautiful mountain scenery hereabouts so I won't repeat that; but I will call out the amazing autumnal colours of the surrounding forests. Quite astonishing. I hope that during tomorrow's rest day I will finally be able to go explore them a little.

As far as the chess is concerned, the playing conditions are good compared to equivalent events. There was the usual rugby scrum of people trying to get into the venues at the start of round 1 but that has pretty quickly settled down. The organisers have implemented a strict policy at the main venue of only allowing players in - not even delegation heads; slightly frustrating but the players are reporting that the arbiters are controlling the games well so not the end of the world. At the smaller venue, where the U8s and the U10 girls are playing, parents are allowed in before the round starts. There are live webcams in both playing halls; and in the main hall ten live boards per section. The organisers have waived the controversial zero time default rule - instead a more sensible 30 minutes default has been applied (not that England will be testing that, since we are just a few minutes' stroll from the venue!). In relation to draw offers, normal conditions apply - no possibly confusing Sofia rules here, I am pleased to say.

We have all settled into a good routine (only disturbed by today's double round...), with breakfast followed by pre-game preparation followed by a stroll up (or in my case part-way up) the mountain; lunch is followed by the game for the players; after a while a couple of the fathers station themselves just outside the main playing hall to escort the children back up the hill to the Arena hotel – it is quite dark by the time the games finish, and the local roads aren't well lit. Most of the party convenes in the team room generously provided gratis

by the hotel to wait for the players' return and their reviews with the coaches.

Supper is followed by a little blitz or exchange (for the players), or a beer/ glass of wine (for many of the adults). In relation to the latter, after careful research your correspondent can highly recommend a local bar called Peggy's ?.

In relation to the results over the board, it was great that by the end of the 3rd round all the players had registered a score. Various team members have put in appearances on the live boards (though it's a shame that there are no live boards in the smaller playing hall, since some of our strongest contenders are in the under 8s). Regrettably we have had a couple of intra-team pairings – one in the under 8 open and one in the under 12 open. Chances are high that there will be one or two more before the end: given we have such a big delegation and since the pairing rules do not allow event organisers to take nationality into account when determining who plays whom.

We have seen some high quality games from England players – some of which have been posted onto the ECF website, with analysis and annotation from coaches Rendle and Greet.

My thanks to the players, their family members and the coaches for their various contributions to what is so far a very successful trip. With round 6 currently in progress, we look forward to the rest of the tournament!

A parent's view - WYCC article from Tim Horton

We have now got to Day 8, and Round 8 of the World Youth Chess Championships. For those of you outside this 'bubble' that is the WYCC, you can call it Thursday 15th November! After the double-round day on Day 5, and a rest day on Day 6, we are back into the daily routine of preparing and coaching, playing and reviewing individual games. At this point we have four more rounds to play.

The double-round day (Rounds 5 and 6) on Day 5 (Monday) was a very long, hard day. There was some great chess played, but unfortunately Team England didn't always manage to collect points as a just reward for the effort put in, particularly from the second round of the day. However, on Day 7, it was great to see that some of the young players who had just missed points on Day 5 showed great determination and skill to win and draw their games. There is considerable resilience in this squad of young players, and all are striving to perform their very best in each round.

Day 7 marked the second half of the tournament, and each player has an opportunity to re-group, or kick on, after their results during the first half. The need for stamina to continue to play at these exceptionally high levels cannot be understated, and this will be an increasing challenge during the next few days. The old-timers talk candidly about the poorer quality of chess that can sometimes be played during rounds 10 and 11!

This is the first time that my son, Andy, and I have been involved in such a high-profile chess competition. In his recent post, Jim Wadsworth (our Head of Delegation) comments on some of the chess organization, in comparison to previous events. I can only agree with his comments about that, and accept that we have certainly been very fortunate to join a trip with such good facilities!

An additional benefit of the trip has been the superb surroundings. Maribor is the second city in Slovenia, with a population of approximately 90,000 people. The large river Drava flows through its centre, and just on the edge of the city there is a ski-resort situated on a forest-lined mountainside. A gondola is running to make it easier to get to the mountain top (1042m high), and there is great walking to enjoy.

In the hotel the final preparations are being made for this afternoon's round. Lines are being chosen to play at the chess board, and wise advice is being offered by the fantastic coaching team from their considerable experience.

We are ready for round 8. Let's wish the players well!

Chess Problem News

Jones Wins The Title


No, not Gawain.... it's Christopher Jones – CJA Jones – and he's become a Grandmaster of Chess Composition. Unlike the over-the-board GM title, the composing GM title is awarded only to a select few. A mere three such titles have ever been three awarded to British composers and the previous two, Comins Mansfield and Norman Macleod, are long deceased. Now, at last, we can celebrate another.

Like most composers, he started as an OTB player, playing as a junior for Scotland and captaining Oxford University in 1972-73, and began composing in early middle age. Since the 1980s, composing has taken over and his output of problems is now well past 500. His problems appear regularly in the main chess problem tourneys and journals, and have often been used in chess solving competitions like the World Chess Solving Championships.

Christopher gained his title in September. It's based on the quality of problems composed over many years, and in Christopher's case this is mainly in the field of helpmates. In case you don't know what a helpmate is, it's a chess problem where the task is to mate the Black king but with White and Black co-operating to achieve this. There's only one other difference between a conventional problem and a helpmate – who moves first; in a helpmate in two, for example, the move sequence is BWBW, unlike in a conventional mate in two where it's WBW.

Here are some examples of Christopher's problems:


CJA Jones, The Problemist 1989



Helpmate in 71/2 - Two solutions


(White moves first, and Black is mated on move 8; there are two different ways of doing this.) The solutions are: 1...Bxf3 2.Nc5 Bg4 3.Kd5 Kc8 4.Kc6 Kd8 5.Kb7 Bc8+ 6.Ka8 Kc7 7.Na6+ Kb6 8.Nb8 Bb7 and 1...Bf1 2.Ng5 Kc7 3.Kf4 Kxd6 4.Kg3 Ke5 5.Kh2 Kf4 6.Nh3+ Kxf3 7.Kh1 Kg3 8.Ng1 Bg2. (Notice that only exactly these moves solve the problems – in sound helpmates, no alternative moves work.) The two solutions echo each other in opposite corners.

CJA Jones, Orbit 1999



(Black moves first, and Black is mated by White's third move; then solve the original position again, but this time with the White pawn which was on e3 transferred to f2.) Solutions: (a) **1.Qa5 f5 2.Kb6 Rxb4 3.Rxe3+ Bxe3** and (b) **1.Rxb5 f3+ 2.Kb4 Bxb6 3.Bxf4 Rxf4**. It looks impossible to mate the Black king in three.

CJA Jones, Schach-Aktiv 2012




(The same as the previous problem, but this time in the second part it's a White rook that has to be transferred to a new position.) Solutions: **1.Bc2 b6 2.Bb3 Kxc7 3.Bxb6+ Kxb6** and (b) **1.e4 Ke7 2.Kxd5 Bxe4+ 3.Kxe4 Kxd6**.

Tony Lewis (1933-2012)

Most chess problems aren't helpmates but rather are 'orthodox direct mates'. Here is one by the late Tony Lewis, a stalwart of the British chess problem world, who died in 2012. He had been composing problems for 65 years! This was composed in his early teenage years. It's White to play and force mate in two moves.

T Lewis, Chess 1948




It's what problemists call a 'complete block', meaning that there's a mate available after every possible Black move, but of course White has to move and in Tony's problem White has no waiting move. This kind of problem is often very difficult to solve. The solution is **1.Rc7** which unexpectedly abandons the pin of the d6 knight.

Endgame Studies

The chess problem community also promotes endgame studies. Here are two by Paul Michelet that I put in my column in Correspondence Chess magazine. They are a 'twin' – two almost identical positions. They have different solutions, and to fully appreciate them you have to see why the solution in each one doesn't work in the other.


P Michelet, Correspondence Chess 2012



1.Bb7+ Ke3 2.Be4 Kxe4 3.Nb5 d5 4.Na3.

The 'try'1.Bxd7? b1Q! 2.Bc6+ Ke2 3.Nd5 fails; Black has to prevent white achieving the fortress draw of K on say a7, B on b7 and N on d5, and he can do this by, amongst other moves, 3...Qb8. Having the White king on a6 makes it just near enough the centre to draw in the main line after 4...d4 5.Nc4.

1.Bxd7 b1Q 2.Bc6+ Ke2 3.Nd5. White will be able to play Bb7 and this achieves the fortress referred to; it's known as the 'Karstedt draw'. Having the White king one square nearer the corner makes the difference. The 'try' 1.Bb7+? Ke3! 2.Be4 Kxe4 3.Nb5 d5 4.Na3 fails only to the very surprising move 4...Kf4! which keeps the Black king off any squares where the knight can check it and allows Black to shepherd his d-pawn down the board.

A very slight change in position gives an extraordinary change in solution; in addition, the 'try' in the first study is the solution in the second, and vice versa.
