The National 100 (U100s all-play-all regions league on 8th, 15th and 22nd August)

Not just for your squad players but for all U100 ECF members/Supporters in your county. Please do circulate the attached flyer to your county clubs and junior organisers. Inspired by their presence in the National Challenge (the pool matches), I have introduced a national county regional competition for them running alongside the County Championships. Again this is open to all current England ECF members/supporters (old or new memberships- new memberships taken out now give you August 2020 free plus all of the 2020/21 season), whether or not played for a county team. Act quickly as only a week before the first match and there are plenty of new players to this slow play format to attract!! The more the merrier.

I know some teams have been hit by player withdrawals, one county devastatingly so and I am also conscious of finer weather, greater freedoms for some and the holiday season. I am considering a limited relaxation of the finals eligibility rule to allow new U150 players to play in the 4 Open Championships and new U120 players to play in the U1825. To do so we need a consensus from among the qualifiers. **This is on the agenda for the captain's meeting** along with grading lists for board orders (Jan 2020 applies for eligibility).

NB In the **Open Challengers** Cumbria and Shropshire have qualified from Group B to play one of Middlesex B and Oxfordshire in Group A. Who plays who depends on two arbiter rulings in Shropshire's final group stage match (qualification is assured but group finishing order is dependent on the match result).
