Good Day

Hope you are all keeping safe in these challenged times. Most sports and particularly playing over-the-board chess have been a huge casualty over the last few months - but as you will agree that in moments of such crises, opportunities arise, and thankfully the lockdown situation has helped promote online chess exponentially.

I have been drawn to chess since early days and even had an opportunity to play a tournament alongside Viswanathan Anand in India where he won his first Sub- Junior's title way back in 1983. Of late, I have been accompanying my young son to various chess events (like most parents) and trying to reignite my passion for chess. As a result, I became a certified chess tutor from Chess in Schools and Communities and the European Chess Union. I am a volunteer at Delancey chess & an active member of the Kent Junior Chess Association that run chess Grand Prix' throughout the year & am also the point contact for London Junior Chess Championship for them. I volunteer to run a regular weekend chess club for juniors in a local library.

Chess in England has had a chequered trajectory of late at the competitive levels – perhaps this could be due to the partially realised **strategic initiatives** for **attracting and retaining the best available talent**. Another well acknowledged reason is the lack of sufficient **corporate sponsorships** to promote the game. As a Sales and Marketing adviser in the start-up ecosystem helping develop new products, I regularly observe & foster entrepreneurs to solve unique problems/issues using different lenses, by adapting disruptive approaches – as a result, I think I am well positioned to actively collaborate and drive innovative ideas amongst the chess fraternity, corporates, well-wishers of chess and the ECF organisation & to continue to address the **issue of talent and sponsorship** to help **elevate the level and uptake of chess** in the country.

The third area that merits greater attention is the creation, recognition and nurturing of **good chess tutors** as part of a community initiative, be it at schools, chess clubs, chess coaching venues to help engage a large number of young and experienced practitioners of chess (children, adults, women, retired & less able members) who have either moved away from the game or are fence sitters. The latter is largely due to the lack of awareness of the full potential of chess & the poor **customer experience** occasionally at events that suffer from funding at various levels. Another major issue affecting the game's popularity is the **low level of women & girl's involvement** – more events on lines of the 2019 London Chess Conference (with the theme "Chess & Female Empowerment") need to be encouraged for their increased engagement through the social & collaborative modes of chess. Coming from a management background and having led large teams, I think I can meaningfully contribute to the effective & efficient planning, organisation, collaboration and streamlining of various new and current initiatives run by the ECF.

Strong & well-funded **chess academies** need to be supported (on lines of the ECF Academy) across the country to provide guidance & opportunities to all those with potential and desire to take their game to the next level. Continued strong advocacy by the ECF organisation with active support from parents, players & members is desired for making the study of **chess as part of the school curriculum** by impressing upon the government & the masses in general about the positive emotional and intellectual impact of chess on lives.

I strongly believe in exploring all avenues to augment the number of active ECF members & volunteers / supporters of the game. We must also collectively rise above any challenges that may currently beset the ECF organisation and strengthen it further with a greater sense of purpose, innovative ideas, energy, leadership, and execution capabilities. Although I may not be known to many of you, I think I possess the credentials, enthusiasm & passion to help further the cause of my fellow members at the ECF - my LinkedIn profile appears here. If elected, I will strive to collaborate with members across all categories to help further develop new ideas / initiatives that can promote the above causes, with the ultimate objective in mind of obtaining the official status of a sport for chess in England that could completely alter its profile for good.
