



ECF Online Rapid Grand Prix Regulations – Version 0.3 14/12/2021

The ECF Rapid Grand Prix will be played on Lichess, and open to any ECF member upon payment of the entry fee.

Season

Each event will start at 2pm on the third Sunday of every month.

The tournament organiser reserves the right to vary formats or reschedule events. Should an event need to be rescheduled, this will normally be due to force majeure; e.g. technical problems on the website.

Entry Process

Step 1 Players are required to fill in the entry form and pay the entry fee on the ECF website

Step 2 Players will need to apply to join the “2022 ECF Online Rapid Grand Prix” team on Lichess

Step 3 Once a team administrator has approved the request, the player can join the tournament

Players with a single event entry will be removed from the club after the conclusion of that event.

Entry Fees

- Single event £5
- Season Pass £25
- Titled Players Free Note:
(this means holders of NM/ CM/ FM/WFM/IM/WIM/GM/WGM)

National Master (NM) is awarded by the ECF to qualifying players – you can find further details of the ECF master points scheme here:

Note: Arena Streaks will be switched on for all events in Arena format.

Points System

A number of points will be awarded to the top 10 placed players in each event:

1 st	25 points
2 nd	18 points
3 rd	15 points
4 th	12 points
5 th	10 points
6 th	8 points
7 th	6 points
8 th	4 points
9 th	2 points
10 th	1 point

A tie between two or more players in a Grand Prix event will be split by the platform's tie-breaks.

Points will be accumulated based on a player's highest scores in up to six events from the ten.

Ties at the end of the season will be split using countback – the tied player with the most 1st place event finishes will finish higher. If that is tied, then the tied player with the most 2nd place event finishes will finish higher. This continues for all places.

Prizes

2022 ECF Online Rapid Grand Prix trophies will be provided to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each of the following categories:

- ECF Online Rapid Grand Prix, open to all players
- ECF Online Women's Rapid Grand Prix, open to all women
- ECF Online Junior Rapid Grand Prix, open to all players born in 2003 or later
- ECF Online Senior Rapid Grand Prix, open to all players born in 1971 or earlier
- ECF Online Major Rapid Grand Prix, open to players with an ECF Online Rapid rating below 2000
- ECF Online Intermediate Rapid Grand Prix, open to players with an ECF Online Rapid rating below 1700
- ECF Online Improvers Rapid Grand Prix, open to players with an ECF Online Rapid rating below 1400
- ECF Online Starter Rapid Grand Prix, open to players with an ECF Online Rapid rating below 1100

The January 2022 ECF online rating lists will be used to determine eligibility for Grand Prix Sections where relevant. If a player does not have a January ECF online rating their ECF Over the Board rating, or lichess rating will be used in that order for eligibility purposes.



Season Pass entries will go into a raffle to win other prizes, to be determined at a later date.

Depending on the number of entries received, the tournament organiser may increase the number of categories.

Eight separate leaderboards will be maintained depending on the category of the player; e.g. if the highest-placed junior player finished in 10th place, then she would score 1 point in the Rapid Grand Prix, but 25 points in the Junior Rapid Grand Prix. Leaderboards will be published using real names.

Ties will be split using countback – the tied player with the most 1st place event finishes will finish higher. If that is tied, then the tied player with the most 2nd place event finishes will finish higher. This continues for all places.

Rating

All games in ECF Rapid Grand Prix events will be submitted for ECF Online rating.

Fair Play Policy

The ECF Fair Play policy will apply to all Grand Prix events, and games will be scanned by the FIDE Screening Tool. Players who are banned either by Lichess for fair play reasons, or the ECF Fair Play Panel will be excluded from the 2022 Grand Prix and potentially other ECF events for a period as outlined in the ECF Fair play policy. Results will be amended by the organiser for the event(s) in which the player was found to have used external assistance, and leaderboards updated as appropriate. Please note that players can only use one Lichess username during the 2022 Grand Prix season.
