University Training
Course for Teachers
and Chess Tutors

With the initiative and efforts of the European Chess Union (ECU), the European Parliament published a <u>Declaration</u> on 15 March 2012 on the introduction of the programme "Chess in School" for the educational systems of the European Union.

Prior to this, several European countries had introduced Chess as a curriculum option for primary schools. Following the Declaration, the EU educational programme Erasmus funded several projects in the field of Chess and Education with the active participation of the European Chess Union and its Educational Commission members. These included projects on chess and games pedagogy as well as chess and mathematics.

This training course is primarily aimed at teachers in Primary Education as well as those attending Teacher Training institutions. More generally, it is suitable for anyone interested in how chess and strategy games can contribute to education in terms of the social and intellectual development of children. One of the primary focuses of the initiative is to provide academic training courses for teachers and chess tutors to gain valuable skills applicable in the classroom.



The course is conducted using the online Moodle platform in English. Students are expected to work independently on weekly set tasks including interactive activities, course content, a reference reading list, video presentations and live sessions.

Study time options for the entire course consisting of 320 hours:

16 weeks - 20 hours per week 10 June 2024 - 29 September 2024

32 weeks - 10 hours per week 10 June 2024 - 19 January 2025





Upon completion of the program, the graduate will:

- Understand the rules, the basic tactics and strategies used in chess.
- Be familiar with the history and culture of this ancient game and its international importance as a mind sport.
- Have a good understanding of the benefits of chess for children in primary education and how to use chess as an educational tool.
- Be confident to conduct educational activities using different teaching techniques and strategies to develop children's 21st century skills.

Recognise the broad variety of educational settings where chess can be used as an educational tool in schools.

> Use effective age-appropriate methods to introduce chess for a specific target group of children.

The training course provides a lifelong Academic Certificate from the University of The Aegean. The academic content constitutes 12.8 ECTS academic points. The "Chess in Primary Education" Academic Certificate and the ECTS points may be used in European and worldwide educational systems.

An Academic Certificate is an objective indicator that you have the skills and knowledge to work as a *School Chess Teacher* in schools. Schools are always looking for teachers who can lead extracurricular subjects across age ranges. If you are already a school teacher the certificate is a Continuing Professional Development for your teaching career which may be taken into account for recruitment, retention and promotion.

The ECTS points derived from this course can be combined with those derived from other academic courses to reach a target number of ECTS points to complete your educational qualifications.

The European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is a metric of the European Higher Education Area for making comparisons between courses more transparent. It helps students to move between countries and to have their academic qualifications and study periods recognised abroad. ECTS has been adopted by most of the countries in the European Higher Education Area as the national credit system and is increasingly used elsewhere.

The ECU will continue to promote this Academic Certificate as the professional title for those undertaking a career involving chess teaching in Europe and in some other countries outside Europe which have adopted the European education model.

Fees

The fee for the training course leading to the Academic Certificate is 550 Euros. This can be paid in full at registration or in two instalments comprising 275 Euros at registration and 275 Euros at the halfway point of the course.

There is a discount of 10% if the full amount is paid at registration. There is also a discount of 10% if five or more participants from the same institution are registered as a group. These discounts cannot be combined.

Date

Registration closes on 1 June 2024. There are limits to the number of students who will be accepted into the 16- or 32-week study time program. Late registrants may be accepted at the discretion of the Course Director.



Prior engagement with chess is not necessary to participate in the program. The minimum Qualifications of a Candidate: Graduates of Secondary Education or equivalent practical experience subject to authorisation.
