

FOREWORD - Dominic Lawson



Greetings!

This year started with the resignation of my predecessor and a somewhat contentious FIDE presidential election in which the ECF played a forthright role. On the fortunately more rational domestic scene, ECF managers and directors delivered the core national championships in Aberystwyth for the British, Uppingham for the National Schools, High Wycombe for the National Clubs, Warwick for the National Counties, Sunningdale for the English Seniors, Surrey for the U18 Counties and Central London for the English Girls and British Blitz.

Meanwhile, strong international open and women's teams represented England in the Olympiad in Tromsø, with GM David Howell delivering an especially impressive performance at the latter. English teams also competed well in World and European Championships for Amateurs, Youth, Schools, Clubs and Individuals. The highlight was the performance of GM Keith Arkell who became the first European Seniors (50+) Champion and the World Seniors (50+) Silver Medalist. His achievements were deservedly recognised with the ECF Player of the Year Award, which I had the pleasure of presenting to him during the London Chess Classic in December. With the additional presence of GM Dr John Nunn, in a most welcome return to the board, we anticipate a formidable England team in the 2015 World Senior Team Championships in Dresden.

In November I was delighted to attend the first meeting at the House of Commons of the All Party Parliamentary Group for Chess, chaired by Yasmin Qureshi MP, and organised by the charity Chess in Schools and Communities. This historic occasion--the first Parliamentary recognition for chess--should bring benefits in coming years.

Internal improvements to the ECF's contribution were focused on building a foundation more suited to the national governing body. The Board signed up to the Voluntary Code of Good Governance for the Sport and Recreation Sector and established the ECF Forum. The stage was set for much needed foundation improvements, by the establishment of an Independent Constitution and Governance Review Commission to begin work in 2015. ECF members interested in a better English Chess Federation should stay alert for opportunities to contribute. A particular objective is to attract more female players into the game: the ECF is leading the way with free entry for all females into the 2015 British Championship.

Finally, I would like to say a particular thank you to the arbiters and tournament organisers who give up so much of their time for the benefit of English chess. All of us who love the game are in their debt.

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
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DIRECTORS' REPORTS

Chief Executive's Report

The Board is grateful for Council's support of our stewardship of the English Chess Federation and our contribution to English chess. Throughout the momentous events within the ECF (resignations of the President and a Non-executive Director) and the FIDE elections, the principle I tried to maintain with my focus fixed on ECF interests is summed up by, "We want a functioning Board, supported by Council and effective in the Community." Although I acknowledge shortfalls, the current Board was, and remains, successful.

Papers submitted for this AGM show how the Board is addressing the some of the shortfalls. The highlight is the independent constitutional and governance review. Initiatives not included in the papers will continue in the weeks leading to the AGM, such as organisational development to enable greater diversity, child protection, junior training and commercial viability.

Outcomes largely met aspirations in the British Championships, the Olympiad and European Team performances, international youth and school championships, and several outstanding individual accomplishments described in my colleagues' reports. Outcomes exceeded expectations in secondary school chess with the addition of the Team Chess Challenge, school team competitions and an English player winning the European Seniors Championship. Outcome shortfalls remain in female participation and development of the next generation of professional players.

Strategic planning has occurred this year, but an agreed strategy or strategic plan is not yet prepared for Council to review. Features that demonstrate the strategic direction in which the ECF is traveling may be discerned by activity and initiatives: delivery of core championship tournaments, pending establishment of The Chess Trust, more activity secondary school chess (mentioned above), increased use of social media and the new ECF Forum, improvements in the membership scheme and the grading database, fundraising for the international teams, integration of the new Commercial Director, emerging commercial partnerships and a commitment to principles in the Voluntary Code of Good Governance for the Sport and Recreation Sector.

Some strategic initiatives were not successful. Negotiations were attempted with Delancey UK Schools Chess Challenge to increase mutual support and association. They proactively offered to guarantee new ECF members in exchange for assured places for leading players in their 2014 tournament to represent England in the 2015 European and World Schools Individual Chess Championships. We also requested their Gigafinals to be graded and their cooperation in discussions with potential ECF sponsors. While both parties were receptive to these concepts, we were unable to agree specific terms. Cooperative dialogue with the UK Chess Academy ceased due to their premature application for FIDE Academy status, which is currently an unresolved issue among the UKCA, the ECF and FIDE. Efforts to communicate better with the membership are hampered by inability to produce timely minutes.

The Board would be pleased to discuss these at the AGM; however, AGM time is limited. In the interest of efficiency and transparency with the wider ECF membership, Council delegates may wish to engage these issues with me on the ECF Forum prior to the AGM. Council's attention is invited to two important projects:

- The ECF Office under-staffing situation is not sustainable. We are examining the benefits and costs of moving the office to a more accessible location with similar not-for-profit organisations, which should ultimately improve oversight and performance. Council will be given a verbal update.
- ◆ The National Chess Library must move out of its two locations in Hastings no later than March 2015. Potential solutions range from combining the National Chess Library with the ECF Office, placing the National Chess Library in deep storage, reducing its size by selling duplicates, and the occasional suggestion of selling it. In my view, selling or disbanding the National Chess Library is not an option. We continue to accept legacy collections into the National Chess Library. The Library Committee has provided the Board with its view. A discussion thread on the ECF Forum is now open. Council's views on the importance of the National Chess Library would be a welcome aid to required actions.

In summary, the Board is engaged in legal matters (reference the Finance and Junior Directors' reports) and internal governance matters; yet the Board and other dedicated ECF volunteer officials continue what we recognised as important for this year—deliver championship tournaments, compete internationally, address governance issues and improve commercial activity. Council may safely anticipate continued positive progress.

Director of Finance's Report

The Board is pleased to provide a view on the position for the financial year 2013/14.

The audited accounts for the year ended 31st August 2014 will be presented at the Finance Council Meeting in April 2015. The position at the end of the financial year is in line with the forecast presented at the Finance Council Meeting in April 2014; there are no major variances from the figures presented. It should be noted that the position of Office Manager has not yet been filled on a permanent basis, and consequently, the profit for the year is considerably higher than would be expected under normal circumstances. The role has been filled by John Philpott on an interim, voluntary basis, but this arrangement is going to end soon.

All past sets of accounts have now been brought up to date and have been audited. This includes the past years accounts for the BCF and Chess Centre Ltd. In accordance with Company law an Annual General meeting of Chess Centre Ltd was held in July, the first for many years. David Eustace and John Philpott were appointed directors along with existing director Gerry Walsh.

Council should note that the ECF is the defendant in a court case, brought by the parent of a junior player arising out of a dispute relating to the Youth Grand Prix. The Proceedings are being defended.

Home Chess Director's Report - Alex Holowczak

The following outlines brief reports from the three largest areas of this Directorship in terms of impact: the British Championships, the County Championships and Grading. Following that, there are comments on other areas of the Directorship where things have developed.

British Championships

The 2014 Championships were held in Aberystwyth. There were 831 entries, which was a return to the sort of numbers who entered at normal British Championships after the surge at least year's 100th. The only difference numerically was with the weekend and rapidplay tournaments; tournaments which typically rely on local entries to flourish, and Aberystwyth had less of a local chess scene relative to other recent venues.

The Championship section proper started on a Saturday rather than Monday. This allowed David Howell, Tim Kett, and Akshaya Kalaiyalahan to double up and play in both the British and the Olympiad that followed. With no clash in 2015, the Championship schedule at the University of Warwick, on the outskirts of Coventry, will return to the traditional Monday – following Friday schedule.

Financially, the Championships made a small surplus.

County Championships

The County Championships had the following number of entries in each section

Open 6 (champions Yorkshire)

Minor Counties 9 (champions Suffolk)

U180 6 (champions Warwickshire)

U160 9 (champions Yorkshire)

U140 7 (champions Hampshire)

U120 7 (champions Nottinghamshire)

U100 6 (champions Kent)

Aside from a withdrawal in the U180s and a dispute in the U120 there were no major administrative issues. The MCCU

were unhappy that their first two nominees were in the same half of the draw and after consultation at a Union Representatives meeting, and a rule has been written for this. There have also been proposals to make the process of authorising ungraded players more straightforward. Otherwise feedback from players and captains was generally positive. One form of positive feedback was the re-establishment of awarding of individual trophies for winning Finalists at Finals Day.

To assist captains in the 2014-15 season, a spreadsheet-based result sheet that will automatically show whether or not the 10-point rule has been breached has been developed, and will be distributed to captains that qualify for the Final Stage. All that captains will need to type in is a grading reference to identify players.

Grading

The Grading Team has:

- Issued both the January and August lists on time
- Moved the database onto a new server due in a bid to increase the performance of the main website
- Improved information available on the site
 - ◆There is now enough information to calculate a player's grade independently
 - ◆Current membership situation included
- Issued several improvements to the calculation software including extra information on the English Youth Grand Prix
- Reviewed and changed the FIDE conversion formula for games played abroad to ECF * 7.5 + 750. The suitability of using this is being investigated for use as new conversions between other British Isles lists.

Other Areas

<u>Arbiters:</u> The regulations for Arbiters were improved, such that there are now three tiers of Arbiters, with a new bottom level for people who have passed the ECF Arbiters Test. The Test is now free for potential candidates to take.

<u>Armed Forces & Veterans:</u> This was created last year and was transferred to my Directorship in November. Regrettably, I have done nothing in this area this year.

<u>Congress Chess:</u> The intention is to remove this post, and replace it with a "Grand Prix Controller" post, the job description of which will be to administer all aspects of the Grand Prix.

<u>Disabled Chess:</u> Various routine enquiries have been dealt with. Liaison with FIDE may establish a World Junior Disabled Championships in Durham University this December.

Grand Prix: The awarding of trophies for 2013/4 is being dealt with.

<u>National Club</u>: The format changed to a team-based weekender with four sections. The intention is to repeat this in the first half of 2014, and by the time of the AGM, details should be announced. The entry of 18 was approximately in line with expectations. The event made a small surplus.

<u>Prisons Chess:</u> Carl Portman took on this role, and has achieved various things. A chess club has been established at HMP Coldingley and HMP Wandsworth. HMP Parkhurst is also lined up for a visit. A chess column may be established in InsideTime, a national prison magazine.

Women's Chess: The £2000 set aside by Council has a tentative budget, one of the goals within this budget is the establishment of an English Women's Championship, which has previously been part of the Home Chess "to-do" list. I would like to thank all of the volunteers and Officers within this Directorship for their assistance this year.

Junior Chess Director's Report - Lawrence Cooper

It has been an honour to be the ECF Junior Director and I would like to thank everyone on Council who voted and gave me this opportunity. I would also like to thank all the juniors, parents and coaches and everyone in the Junior Directorate who have shown me unbelievable support throughout the year, in particular, I would like to thank Jim Wadsworth whose backing has been invaluable throughout a very difficult year for me, both professionally and personally. Below I have given a summary of some of the more prominent events that have taken place in the last year.

The 2013-14 Youth Grand Prix started with events at the 2013 British Championship and culminated in the National Junior Squad event in Daventry in April. Winners in all twelve age groups qualified for the European/World Youth and it will be interesting to follow their progress later this year. I was pleased to be able to visit both the Swindon and Daventry events and whilst I am already excited about the Grand Prix I hope that it will prove possible to add some events in the North and Midlands to sit alongside the impressive array of events that already exist in London, Yateley

Manor, Swindon and Daventry. I am sad to report that the federation is currently subject to a legal challenge from one of the parents of a player involved in the Grand Prix but I am unable to say more until the case is complete.

Nonsuch School from Surrey won the U19 National Schools Girls' Championship and Howell's School Cardiff won the U11 girls. My thanks to St Catherine's School in Bramley for hosting and sponsoring the girls' championship.

The winners of the 2013/14 U9 National Schools Chess Championships were Reading School who by beating Manchester Grammar in the final broke a run of 18 consecutive years when independent schools have won the title. The Plate was won by Wilson's School. Thanks to Winchester College for their continued sponsorship of this event. King's College School Wimbledon, from Surrey, won the National Schools U11 Championship. My thanks to Heathside Preparatory School for their generous sponsorship and their support of junior chess over many years and also to Uppingham School for hosting the event.

This seems an appropriate time to thank Andrew Martin who has stood down and been replaced by Neill Cooper as ECF Manager of Schools. Julian Clissold & Richard Haddrell also deserve a big thank you for fantastic work in support of these events.

In addition to all the work he does for English secondary schools chess Neill also found time to organise the English Under 18 County Championship at Wilson's School in Walington on 29th June. The Championship event was close throughout, and at the end of the second round Sussex and Herts were equal first. The tiebreak of number of wins still did not separate them and so 'Bottom board elimination' was required at which point Sussex won.

The minor event was won by Sussex Bishops. Thank you to Jim Wadsworth, Chris Howell, Christine Golding and Phil Ehr for the work on the day and to Jim for all his hard work leading up to the event and on the day. Saffrey Durrant and her team from Surrey Hills Bakery provided fantastic refreshments, all the teams, managers, parents and other supporters behaved fantastically and left the school in a clean and tidy state. Sussex Junior Chess provided large numbers of digital chess clocks, whilst Surrey County Chess Association and Wilson's School provide the rest of the chess equipment. I am also grateful to Wilson's School for providing such an excellent venue.

Whilst not ECF initiatives no junior report would be complete without congratulations and thanks to Chess in Schools and Communities (CSC), United Kingdom Schools Chess Challenge (UKSCC), English Primary School Chess Association (EPSCA), National Chess Junior Squad (NCJS), Junior Four Nations League (J4NCL) and all the many organisations in England who contribute so much to the junior chess scene.

Medals in international tournaments are great for morale and for giving belief to other players that they can be successful. I was extremely fortunate this year that so many English juniors were successful. Dhruv Radhakrishnan won the bronze medal at the World Schools Under 7 Rapid Chess Championship in Kavala, Greece in June, just a week later Harvey Zhang took the silver at the European Schools Under 9 in Kavala. My thanks to the seven coaches, twenty-eight players, all the supporting parents but in particular, the Head of Delegation Jay Atara for making this such a memorable trip.

Moving on to the Commonwealth Junior Championship in Glasgow in July Nugith Jayawarna became the Commonwealth Boys Under 12 Champion and Peter Batchelor took bronze in the Under 18. The latest success came at the European Amateur where Louise Head won the women's silver.

In August in Stirling, Scotland, England made a clean sweep at the Glorney Cup in the U12, U14, U18 open and U18 girls events. Whilst England were the favourites on grading in all events it was very pleasing to see so many players been given their first opportunity in the event. Congratulations to all, especially Debbie Taylor the Head of Delegation (HoD).

Sharon Daniel of Bolton School not only took part in the Channel 4 show Child Genius but also qualified for the final and then proceeded to win it! As well as being very intelligent she is also very down to earth and a great role model for other girls.

At the time of writing we have organised the following delegations: Ten players and three coaches will be going to the

World Youth in Durban, South Africa in September with Debbie Taylor as HoD, Jim Wadsworth will be taking 28 players and 7 coaches to the European Youth in Batumi, Georgia in October. I will be in charge of a group of twelve players and three coaches going to the World Schools in Juiz de Fora, Brazil in November. We have also sent more modestly sized delegations to the two EU Youth Championships in Mureck, Austria and Kouty nad Desnou in the Czech Republic, the World Schools Rapid & Blitz in Kavala, Greece and will be sending a player to the World Junior in Pune, India in October.

Girls playing chess is always something I have cared a lot about so I was very proud to see Akshaya Kalaiyalahan make her Olympiad debut in Tromso in August, to score 50% on board four (although several of her games were played on board three) and to qualify for the Women's Candidate Master title. I was also very happy for Amy Hoare to become British Women and Under 18 Girls Champion in Aberystwyth after a tense battle with Akshaya. She remains on the verge of the Olympiad team and hopefully her chance will come soon.

A big thank you should go to Julian Clissold, Angela Eyton and David Levens who at six weeks notice organised a very successful English Girls Championship in Nottingham in 2013 that attracted over seventy girls. With the appointment of a Manager of Girls Chess, Sabrina Chevannes, I hope that the girls' scene will be able to build on these successes. I am very grateful to Sabrina for organising coaching for Akshaya & Amy with grandmaster Stephen Gordon. We need to find a way to encourage more girls to play and to keep playing and I hope my successor is able to contribute to this.

Looking back over the year, one important target I set myself was to improve the ratio of ECF Accredited Coaches with recent DBS (Disclosure Barring Service) clearance. In October 2013 it was around 50% but now it is around 90-95%. This is only the first step, the ECF may have a list of one hundred plus coaches with the relevant clearance and references but more needs to be done in terms of a proper programme for assessing coaches and ensuring that high standards are maintained. I would also support a first aid qualification to be included as part of the overall assessment. There are many things I had hoped to achieve that have yet to happen, my apologies to those people involved in those projects. The year has largely been one of ensuring all the events we were committed to took place with little time for new initiatives. There have been some tough challenges along the way, trying to fit 116 UKSCC nominated players into the World and European Schools delegations certainly ranks as one of them but I have tried to tackle every hurdle honestly and openly.

One of my biggest frustrations is that many talented juniors are unable to represent their country abroad because they cannot afford it. We have taken the first steps to improving this, a bursary fund has been created and donations have been received including a top up from the 2014-15 ECF junior budget. The first grant was made at this year's Glorney Cup and more will follow.

My successor will be able to call on a fantastic team within the Junior Directorate who have supported me from day one and it has been an absolute joy to work with so many talented and enthusiastic juniors. Support from parents has also been fantastic.

International Chess Director's Report - David Openshaw

<u>Introduction</u>

The season 2013/2014 was a particularly busy period with two major team events the European Team championship in Warsaw in November 2013 and the Olympiad in Tromso Norway in August 2014.

I was particularly pleased that for both Open Events we were able to field very strong teams and that for the Olympiad we were able to field our strongest available Women's team.

Expenditure on both events was within the budgeted figures (including the additional budget agreed at the Council Meeting in April 2014).

Council will remember that I put great emphasis on aiming to have our strongest teams playing in these events. This is important to provide goals for both our existing top players and those with potential to reach the top. We still have work to do to if we are to achieve success in these events.

I have worked with Ian Reynolds in producing a long term plan for our team development and this was presented to the Board in the Spring of this year. We now have to find the money and the players with potential to achieve it.

Prior to the Olympiad we had a two day get together for the Women's Team at the RAC in Pall Mall. This enabled the new Coach (Stuart Conquest) and the players to get to know each other and to spend some time preparing for the tough competition ahead of us. Many thanks to members of the RAC for hosting us.

Before our selections for the Olympiad the Selectors agreed a written Selection Policy so that players can see what criteria are being used.

Three of our clubs competed in the European Clubs Cup in Greece in October 2013. We faced strong competition from many well funded/sponsored teams from other countries.

I spent a considerable amount of time on fund raising during the year. I would like to thank all those members of the ECF who have made donations to help fund our teams.

Some work has been done on Elite Development and I'm hopeful we can do more of this in 2015. Our improving players need to play more often against stronger opponents than themselves and this can be difficult to achieve.

European Team Championships Warsaw Nov 2013

Azerbaijan won the Open section in this nine round event with 14 match points, with France second and Russia third. We scored 11 match points to finish equal 7th (10th on tie break). We recovered from a loss to Greece in Round 2 with a draw against Russia and then wins against Montenegro and Germany. However an elusive further victory escaped us and we drew our final 4 rounds.

The Women's event was won by Ukraine with 15 match points, Russia were second and Poland third both with 14 match points. We started badly with four losses but recovered well to win four of the final five rounds and finish with 8 match points. This put us equal 19th (23rd on tie break) out of a total of 32 teams.

European Clubs Championship Rhodes Greece October 2013

This is a seven round Swiss event for European Clubs. We were represented by the three clubs with the best records in the 4NCL who wished to compete in the event. Barbican, Jutes of Kent and White Rose represented us. Our teams are essentially amateur teams competing against some extremely strong and well funded clubs. For example Malachite from Russia had four players over 2700 and the remaining four players over 2670. SOCAR Azerbaijan had seven players over 2700. However it's good to see that money does not buy success and the surprise winners were the Czech team Novy Bor with six wins and one draw. Malachite came second and SOCAR third!!

Barbican and White Rose both achieved 7 match points with three wins and a draw. Jutes of Kent scored 6 match points with three wins. Very creditable performances by all three teams.

Tromso Olympiad August 2014

China won the Open event with a convincing performance scoring 8 match wins and 3 draws for a total of 19 match points. Four teams tied on 17 points. Hungary took second place in Judit Polgar's final event as a professional and India were the surprise bronze medallists. Top seeded Russia were not in the medals. We performed well to get us in position for a strong result but a narrow loss in the last round to Cuba meant that a top ten finish eluded us. We finished with 6 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses for a total of 14 points in joint 24th position (28th on tie break). Michael Adams had a very strong result on Board 1 and won the silver medal for individual performance.

The Women's Olympiad was won by Russia with 20 match points (10 wins and 1 loss to the Ukraine) China were in second place and Ukraine third both with 18 points. Georgia, Armenia and Kazakstan were the three teams on 17 points. We finished equal 27th (40th on tie break) with 13 points. We had a poor start but fought back well in the final four rounds with two wins and two draws.

Seniors Chess

In November 2013 it was agreed at the Board Meeting that I would also take on responsibility for Seniors Chess. Much

of this has an International aspect and Stewart Reuben has been handling this area for some time. His report on the 2013/2014 period is shown below.

I want to highlight the performance of Keith Arkell in winning the European 50+ championship.

For the 2014/15 we have for the first time a small budget for Seniors Chess and I hope this will help us develop Seniors Chess both in International competitions and with increased activity in England across all standards of play. Both Stewart and I expect strong entries from English teams in next season's European and World competitions. This will be funded almost entirely by donations/sponsorship.

Report on Senior Chess for the ECF Council

FIDE initiated changes in eligibility rules in Senior chess which have had several effects on English chess. They changed the definition from 60+ to 50+ and also 65+. Thus players who reached their 50th birthday by 31 December 2014 became eligible to play and similarly for 65+. The ECF decided to make no change in the definition for the British Championship for 2014. I believe however, a new British 50+ Championship title should be awarded to the highest placed eligible player in the British Championship from 2015. Understandably the ECF is reluctant to change a winning formula; more players (61) took part in the British 60+ Championship than any other event in Aberystwyth. I paid little attention to the FIDE changes. But then Keith Arkell won the first European 50+ Championship and this raised considerable interest. There were inferior rules for the European Senior Team Championships in Croatia and we sent only two weaker teams totalling 9 players. But Tony Stebbings secured his first IM norm. Financial support from individuals enabled us to mount quite a strong team in the World 50+ Team Championship in Lithuania. Thus we were disappointed only to gain the silver medals. We sent a total of 18 players in four teams. Some will remember I organised the first edition of this World Senior (60+) Team Championship in the Isle of Man in 2004 and it has taken 10 years for the idea to catch on'.

Not everything has been successful. The English 60+ Championship attracted very few entries in 2014. This was partly because it was organised over Easter weekend and these dates did not seem popular with seniors.

Two of the reasons for success in this field are not hard to find: There are the demographics of the post war baby boomers. Also that England benefited more from the Fischer phenomenon of 1972 than any other federation. Thus the English Chess Explosion.

International Arbiters and FIDE commissions.

David Sedgwick in his role as Manager of Arbiters (International) has been representing our interests on both selection of Arbiters for key events and looking for opportunities for English Arbiters and administrators in both FIDE and ECU commissions. He was particularly successful at obtaining an extra place for an arbiter at Tromso. Unfortunately at the last minute this could not be taken up.

David has also been active and successful in supporting FIDE titles for our arbiters.

I have valued David's general advice on many international topics. Congratulations to Stewart Reuben and Gerry Walsh who received FIDE awards at the Tromso Olympiad for their long term contribution as International Arbiters. A concluding 'Thank you'

In closing, I would like to thank again all those members of the ECF who have made donations to help fund our teams. This is a very important contribution to the health of English Chess.

I would also like to thank the John Robinson Trust and Friends of Chess for their continued support to help the development of our improving players.

I have had help from many people and I thank them all, in particular David Sedgwick, Andrew Walker, Sean Hewitt, Stewart Reuben, Ian Reynolds, John Philpott, Natasha Regan, Jonathan Parker, Jonathan Speelman, and my fellow Board Members.

Membership Director's Report - Dave Thomas

Review

The Federation has now completed the second full year of its new Membership Scheme. At the end of August, when memberships for 2013-14 expire, there were 9883 names on the list. The comparable figure for 2012-13 was 9835; the change is small but is in the right direction! For the new season, at the time of writing the membership list stands at 4620 members; of these 3444 have renewed their membership for 2014-15, the balance being three year or life memberships carried forward.

The renewals process for the 2014-15 season has not gone as smoothly as hoped. In part this is due to lack of proper documentation of the process; I was unaware of the need to perform significant tasks which had not been my responsibility last year, and of the lead times the service provider needed to carry some of them out. A further factor was that I was on holiday at a critical stage of the process; there were personal constraints which made this unavoidable on this occasion, but it is a situation which I intend to ensure does not recur. There is, however, one aspect of the current regulations which I regard as unworkable, and a proposal on this point appears later in this paper.

Game Fee

There are proposals put to this meeting by Affiliated Organisations regarding the replacement of residual game fee. The general opinion of the Board is that a ultimately pure membership is the way to go and that the present mix is only a medium term expedient. There are certain specific problems to be overcome, but the main differences of opinion seem to be over the actual timing; as Director I am probably in favour of moving more slowly than many people would like. However, I welcome the discussion of the point, as that is the only way we will reach a consensus on the solution to the problems.

2015-16 Renewals

Major technical issues with the membership administration system arise because of the need, during the period from July to the end of August, to offer memberships both for the season in progress and the new season. This arises because Council have been given an undertaking that players may join at any time prior to Aug 31st and escape payment of League Game Fee for the season ending at that date. The number of categories this requires us to offer online from the date at which we start offering forward memberships until 31st August is unwieldy, even after current 3-year memberships have been withdrawn from sale. Administrative problems were caused by a significant number of individuals joining for the wrong year.

The Board therefore asks Council to note that:

From 1st July the Federation will sell memberships running until 31st August the following year, backdated to date of joining for the purposes of playing in current events.

It is intentional that this refers only to taking out annual membership and makes no reference to upgrades of existing memberships; these will continue to be available until 31st August but are never backdated.

Council is also asked to note that:

This proposal will require players who wish to join in arrears for the avoidance of League Game Fee to do so by 30th June.

The Board's opinion is that players will know long in advance of this whether they have played sufficient games for this to be the economically correct decision.

Commercial Director's Report

I was appointed by the board to this newly created post in April 2014.

The role of Commercial Director is to add some value to the Federation by increasing revenue in such areas as membership, advertising sales and developing the federation's products. Another function is to review fixed costs and overheads.

To identify opportunities and to establish business partnerships.

To improve the overall image of English chess by improving our communications culture. A better image will improve access to sponsorship or renewed government funding.

Communication and Image

The official ECF forum

Following a long Board meeting on strategy it was decided to implement a new public communications policy with which to engage the membership.

Establishing this forum was one of my first duties, in retrospect some more consultation was required and the technical implementation could have been improved.

After internal testing by some directors and managers we went live on 23 June.

Two experienced moderators were appointed.

- Exclusive announcements have been posted on the forum.
- Policy documents have been uploaded for discussion.
- Directors have answered member's questions...

An ongoing project.

Twitter

With Twitter we cropped the wide range of Twitter accounts held and at the same time unified the look and feel to be consistent with the ECF brand. The new social media manager has basically covered every world chess event, on probably, an hourly basis!

Many thanks to all the ECF people and to the chess public who kindly contributed to our Twitter feeds.

<u>Website</u>

Working closely with the Webmaster, the site has been substantially reworked to address issues such as functionality and reliability. The membership database was migrated successfully to another ECF server.

By agreement many memory intensive items have been archived or deleted as appropriate. A new You Tube channel has been added to the front page.

Further enhancements are planned such as cloud hosting which will allow such things as live game broadcast. This year saw an increase in seniors' chess events. I am pleased to say we managed to feature a number of these events on the front page of the website. Thanks to all the correspondents who provided content for the website.

The publicity officer post remains unfilled.

Advertising

New advertisers have been introduced and rates have been increased by an average of 15%. A new advertiser is also providing chess content for "Chess Moves" as part of an advertising contract.

Membership benefits

Discounts have been negotiated for chess themed cinema and theatre shows.

A 25% discount on the "ECF book of the year" shortlist is available to all members.

Sponsorship

There are several ongoing sponsorship discussions.

One of which is with a national newspaper. Discussions have taken place with several household names. None of these have so far resulted in a successful conclusion. An agreement has been reached with a sponsor to support a 15 round ECF British Blitz championship during November in London.

May I take this opportunity to thank the social media team Phil M, Kay and Bill, and also Andrew at Battle

Non-Executive Director's Report - Julian Clissold

Major objectives

The ECF Board has successfully undertaken and delivered its most important targets:

- ◆ The British Championship
- International open and women's Olympiad squads
- Junior participation in International Championships
- ◆ Membership scheme
- County Championships
- Financial security and budget planning

This is a testimony to the work of the Board's major Directorships. It should also be the acid test for the assessment of the work of the board in 2013-2014.

It has also successfully run:

- ◆ English Girls' Individual Championships
- ◆ English Seniors Championship
- Under 11 and Under 19 National Schools Championships
- Under 11 and Under 19 National Schools Girls' Championships

The Board has engaged in collaborative discussions with CSC and UKCC; neither of these has yet to lead to collaborative action but they have improved the relationship between the ECF and our partner organisations.

Board Membership

In the last year the ECF President has resigned after discussions with the Chief Executive. The Board has also had a resignation from a NED.

Three new people have joined the Board, a replacement NED and two new posts, one as a Commercial Manager and one as a Strategy Advisor. The Board has already benefitted from their contributions which have brought a new perspective to discussions.

It remains the case that the Board creates additional workload for itself because of the failure of the Board to act as a single, collaborative unit. This sometimes leads to heated email threads. Adherence to the new Code of Conduct prepared by the Governance Committee will be a helpful contribution to this situation. This should continue to be an objective for the new Board.

Policy developments

The Board has approved a Safeguarding Policy and is in the process of presenting policies to Council in relation to Code of Conduct and Complaints Procedure.

The Board has considered the advice of the Junior Directorate in regard to the selection policy for the ECF England Squad and attendance at regional and international junior chess events. These will be considered more fully after the October elections.

Discussions over the last year show that the ECF continues to have policy gaps in relation to a number of areas; in particular in relation to discrimination and external relations, including commissioning of third party control of events. There is also a need to build on the Chief Executive's strategy document in order to develop coherent short and medium term planning frameworks.

External Relations

The ECF's dealings with FIDE continue to provide the Board with a series of problems about how to respond. The Board elected to support the unsuccessful candidate for the post of President of FIDE. Considerable time has been

spent on this matter and this has been a distraction for the Board. The new Board should consider how to handle its relationship with FIDE and the ECU over the next few years.

There continues to be huge scope for collaboration between the ECF and other bodies responsible for the organisation of chess (CSC, EPSCA, UKSCC, 4NCL amongst others). The Board might consider a strategy for pursuing such collaboration.

Problem areas

A number of mundane but important areas continue to hamper and distract the Board. In particular over the last year Board Minutes and Board Meetings continue to generate more heat than light. The Board has collectively found an acceptable modus operandi but needs to consolidate these practices.

Non-Executive Director's Report - Angus French

I was appointed as a Non-executive Director on 19 May, after Sean Hewitt resigned his position on 3 April.

I met with Phil Ehr (Chief Executive), David Eustace (Director of Finance), Bob Kane (then a candidate to become Commercial Director) and Chris Fegan (Strategic Advisor) soon after appointment. During my period of office I've attended four Board meetings: two evening meetings by Skype and two all-day face-to-face meetings. I've received about 1,500 emails and sent 232.

Matters considered by the Board since late May include:

- The impact of the unofficial EC Forum and the formation of an official ECF Forum
- The appointment of Bob Kane as Commercial Director
- The request for an EGM to consider a proposal to reappoint Sean Hewitt to the Board
- Approval and publication of Board meetings minutes
- The formation of the Constitution and Governance Review Commission and, allied to this, sign-up to the Sport & Recreation Alliance's Code of Good Governance
- Complaints by Dr. Kadengal on behalf of his son
- Candidates for President; the role of President
- A request to join a complaint made by the Kenyan and Philippines chess federations to the FIDE Ethics Commission
- Rehousing the National Chess Library and moving the ECF Office
- Commercial ethics, Ray Keene and The Times
- FIDE Academies including an ECF complaint to FIDE, applications made by two UK organisations direct to FIDE and the ECF's own application
- Ray Keene's claimed invitation to visit the British Championships at Aberystwyth
- The English Seniors Championship payment of prizes; whether the ECF got value for money for its £1,000 investment
- Support for women's chess
- Revision and reinstatement of both the Code of Conduct and the Complaints Procedure
- The organisation of junior chess and junior training

In my role as a Non-executive Director, I've attempted to provide constructive scrutiny of the Board's operation. I've asked questions to try to ensure the interests of all stakeholders are considered, so that balanced decisions are made.

Observations and concerns

As Julian Clissold highlights in his report, in many respects the ECF has had a good year: it had a successful British Championships in Aberystwyth, its finances are improved, participation in international junior events was fantastic.

I am pleased that the Complaints Procedure and Code of Conduct have both been revised and reinstated. I hope that the Constitution and Governance Review Commission will produce constructive recommendations which are adopted.

On a different tack...

All Board members are volunteers, living in different parts of the country. These are constraints on the operation of the Board and, in my view, the biggest problem the Board has is that it attempts to achieve more than it has capacity for. Consequently it makes decisions which are not properly thought out and this can cause further work and disharmony. The Board should be less ambitious and prune its workload. It should focus first on fundamentals – for example, approving and publishing the minutes of its meetings. It should try to avoid making decisions which are divisive or risk being so.

I was particularly concerned about the handling of three matters:

- 1. Implementation of the official ECF Forum. While it was agreed there should be a facility through which Directors would make announcements and respond to queries, no proposal for a (far wider-ranging) forum was put to the Board. Concerns expressed prior to implementation were ignored. There are different views on the purpose of the Forum: is it intended as a competitor to the unofficial EC Forum or not? Also: On appointment I was asked not to post on the EC Forum and told that all Directors had agreed not to do so. I wasn't especially happy about this and would, at least, have liked a statement to have been made to explain the silence.
- 2. Sponsorship negotiations with The Times and Sunday Times newspapers through Ray Keene. Given the circumstances in which he left the BCF and his subsequent activities I was shocked to discover Board members were in discussion with Mr. Keene over a sponsorship deal. The view of fellow Directors is that a deal would be justified so long as the benefits to the ECF outweigh any anticipated loss of reputation. I was told Mr. Keene would have no involvement in anything which might transpire.
- 3. The FIDE Election. This diverted attention from more important business back home. Further, the support provided to the Kasparov campaign went, in my view, beyond what was reasonable and had been agreed. Included in this is what seems to me to be propaganda* written by the Chief Executive and presented to the representatives of national chess federations in Tromsø. I was also concerned that, despite significant concerns expressed in a public statement, an application was made for the ECF to become a FIDE Academy there are conflicting accounts on whether the application was mandated (and registration and annual membership fees are not trivial).
- * A two-page diatribe against FIDE President Kirsan Ilyumzhinov, the gist of which is that the leaked Paulson-Ilyumzhinov proposal, on the ownership and operation of AGON, provides proof that Ilyumzhinov and his cronies were out to fleece FIDE. It doesn't. Of far greater significance is the FIDE-AGON agreement approved by the FIDE General Assembly (made up of the representatives of the national chess federations). This protects FIDE's interests since it provides for payments to be made to FIDE: an amount equal to 20 or 25% of the prize fund of each event organised by AGON; and, on a sliding scale, between 30 and 55% of adjusted gross sponsorship revenue received by AGON.

FIDE Delegate's Report - Nigel Short

As I will not be seeking re-election this year, I trust Council will allow me to first make some general comments on the status and role of the ECF Delegate, before moving on to the events of the last 12 months. When I applied for the post, some years ago, it was strongly emphasised by the Board at that time that, if elected, under no circumstances was I to ask to be reimbursed for any expenses. This is despite the fact that, with the possible exception of President, the Delegate's post is by far the most financially onerous one – often requiring international travel, hotel accommodation and other costs. Among the world's major chess federations, the ECF is uniquely parsimonious in this respect – a fact which reflects very badly on us. While one can hope to be comprehensively represented on the international stage without contributing a single penny in support - in the real world, you tend get what you pay for. I would strongly recommend that, in future, the ECF allocates up to 2,000 pounds per annum out of its budget, for Delegate's expenses.

Given the apparent unattractiveness of this post, one may wonder why there is a fiercely contested election this year. While not wishing to comment on the merits or otherwise of the various candidates, suffice it to say that temptations abound in the field of international chess politics. At the crude end of the spectrum, whether true or exaggerated, the widespread assumption among delegates in FIDE Presidential Election years is that delegates accept bribes to the tune of thousands of dollars. At best, the assumption illustrates the FIDE General Assembly's corrupted ethos.

That ethos was on full display in the 2014 General Assembly. While I would not expect any of the three ECF candidates to succumb to such base skullduggery, the Federation must be ever vigilant to temptations that give a personal advantage to delegates in exchange for supporting the FIDE policy over the ECF's policy. While everyone knows that pocketing an envelope stuffed with used banknotes is profoundly wrong, self-interested arguments can easily be used to justify personal advancement in FIDE commissions and arbiter appointments. Danger bells should start ringing the moment we hear phrases from a commissioner or arbiter such as "I dislike Kirsan as much as the next person, but we have tried the hard line and it didn't work". It is a very slippery slope indeed and can lead to the sort of serial junketing at the expense of ECF independence. The vast machinery of patronage is one of the main reasons that Ilyumzhinov keeps being re-elected. It is the most obvious way to understand why Ilyumzhinov was supported by nearly all of South America, half of North America, Africa and Asia. This method of taking control of federations by stealth is absolutely routine.

2013-14 has been a particularly difficult time for me personally, not least because I was fully aware, at the time of the previous AGM that the soon-to-be-elected Andrew Paulson had deceived the membership about his political sympathies and was totally unsuitable to be ECF President. As Delegate, I knew full-well that I would become the main obstacle to his vaulting ambitions, which were clearly on the much larger international stage, and not domestic. Not only was the newly elected ECF President not neutral politically, as he claimed, but he had even drafted and signed an undisclosed, unethical business deal between himself and Kirsan Ilyumzhinov, in which the FIDE President took 51% of the commercial rights of the main FIDE events. According to the terms of the undisclosed Memorandum that he and Ilyumzhinov denied becoming operative, Paulson was effectively his employee on a generous 240,000 euro per annum salary. For reasons I still do not fully understand, Paulson had, in August 2013, verbally informed me about this in outline, although, unfortunately, I was not to get hold of a copy of the actual agreement until several months later.

Detailing all Paulson's sly moves to undermine my position would consume too much time, but suffice it say that the switch from holding Skype conference calls to physical meetings in his flat was just one of them. While I fully accept that the ECF ought to meet physically occasionally, doing so squanders time and is very expensive for the ECF – not to mention individuals who live in different countries.

Exposing Paulson (firstly in a rather weak article in the Sunday Times, but later, more thoroughly on the Internet) came at considerable cost to myself. Not only did I have to cope with threats of litigation from the ECF President – which caused anxiety and repeated insomnia – but I also had to endure a confidence vote (as if allowing Kirsan's Trojan horse to become President had been my fault). I received only two votes in my favour (although none against) – which was barely a ringing endorsement. For your information, one of the three candidates for Delegate this year wrote a spirited letter of support for Paulson to the ECF Board – despite the overwhelming evidence against him. Bizarrely and most improbably that same candidate would later claim credit for having persuaded him to resign.

The FIDE and ECU Presidential Elections were the main issues of concern for this year. In the former, the ECF correctly supported Garry Kasparov – a moral imperative – over the 18-year incumbent Ilyumzhinov. In the latter (which I will deal with first) we had a choice between Silvio Danailov and Zurab Azmaiparashvili, – both flawed candidates. We chose the incumbent on the grounds that he did not have the challenger's checkered history. He also addressed the Board and Council members positively at a dinner hosted at Simpsons in-the-Strand, commendably answering various questions about his Presidency. It might be added he was the pro-Kasparov candidate. While I still maintain that Danailov was the better choice (although he lost decisively), it is fair to say that he came with considerable baggage and that supporting him was by no means a question of life and death.

It was a totally different matter, however, as regards the FIDE Presidential Election. I have already written extensively about the events in Tromso elsewhere (New In Chess, issue 6, 2014) and do not propose to do so again. To touch upon just a few issues though, the elections were marred by a grotesquely biased and politicised Electoral Commission which handed over all 14 disputed votes (a possible swing of 28) to Ilyumzhinov. Russian diplomatic intervention in this election was immense and was responsible for a large number of votes changing hands particularly in the last two months. Kasparov did reasonably well in Africa but the greatest shock was the abject capitulation of many of the important European federations, leaving the perception of financial gain or personal advancement of Delegates—sometimes against the will of their memberships. The ECF must have a trustworthy Delegate and it must never surrender. Kirsan will be challenged again in 4 years time.

Had Kasparov won, FIDE dues (worth several thousand pound per annum to the ECF) would have been cancelled immediately. Rex Sinquefield, Garry's Treasurer and the richest man in the state of Missouri, personally guaranteed to transfer 10 million dollars into FIDE accounts. Instead, to laughter and applause the General Assembly was treated to Kirsan's ridiculous promise of "\$20 million today!". We are still waiting for the first cent of that. We may as well wait for Godot. Incidentally I was also appointed, by Kirsan, as the Director of a half-million dollar fund for Africa. I am not expecting to be busy any time soon.

One issue to watch out for is Kirsan administration's attempt to undermine the authority of national federations by bypassing them completely. Of particular concern are FIDE Academies which, as things stand, have the power to send juniors to various international without the approval of the national federations. It should be no surprise that a former university friend of Kirsan Ilyumzhinov should be behind exactly such a proposal in England. If you think I am paranoid about infiltration, wake up. It has happened before and will continue to happen unless we prevent it.

Chess in Prisons - Carl Portman

I took up this voluntary role in March 2014. My aim, in line with ECF strategy is to foster interest in prisons. In the months from then until now, the following has been achieved.

- All governors in England are now aware of the ECF and who I am.
- Ongoing correspondence with governors and their representatives.
- Chess Clubs now set up after my visits to HMP Coldingley, HMP Wandsworth and HMP Full Sutton.
- I am now the columnist for 'InsideTime' the newspaper for prison inmates in the UK.
- Frequent exchanges of correspondence with inmates via the ECF, fostering interest and developing chess further across the country.
- All prison visits involve lecture, simultaneous display and donation of equipment.
- Fantastic feedback from governors and officials so far.
- Looking to involve other people to work with their local prisons that's my next step.

I have received some truly amazing correspondence, some of which I will be able to use for publication (anonymity will be observed) in the future. To conclude, there has been real process in developing chess in prisons and the results are beginning to show. My thanks to Alex and the board for their unstinting support in this voluntary position.

Andrew Farthing

Andrew Farthing first started coming to the fore as a chess administrator when he retired from Lloyds Bank. But he has been long involved with local chess, such as the Worcestershire Congress, League and Association. He has been chairman of the two latter organisations. From 2009-13 he was a non-executive director of the MCCU and is now its chairman.

In 2010 he became both Chief Executive and Strategic Planning Officer of the ECF, two posts that had a symbiotic relationship. In 2011 the federation had to face its possibly biggest-ever challenge – the loss of the £60,000+ government grant. Andrew shepherded through the necessary cuts to expenditure in such a way that most ordinary members may have been unaware of the changes. In 2012 he was the principal architect of the move to universal membership as the prime source of annual income. A large number of people helped the almost seamless transition away from game fee as the major source. He retired as CEO in October 2012.

More recently he undertook a stint as Editor of ChessMoves. He has sometimes written on other subjects and in 2013 donated a large number of books and magazines to St Richard's Hospice Snow-drops Bookshop. He is a trustee of the Chess in Schools and Communities Charity. He is graded 145C and rated 1817.

John R Wickham

John R Wickham is an ECF Arbiter. He was long-serving Norfolk Treasurer and Registration Secretary and is now Chairman. He first became the Norfolk BCF Delegate in 1992. He was appointed EACU delegate to the BCF in 1995 and is now Chairman. Such union delegates were members of the BCF Management Board. When it changed to the ECF in 2004 he became one of the two non-executive directors of the federation until 2012. He was a member of the Awards Committee and also its chairman for a very long time. He is currently Chairman of the Personnel Committee. He is an administrator of the Glorney-Bloodworth Chess Trust and of the British Chess Educational Trust. He is graded 131B.

President's Award for Services to Chess 2014

Lara AL Barnes

Lara AL Barnes is an International Arbiter, an ECF Senior Arbiter and International Organiser. She is Chairman of the Chess Arbiters Association. She was Manager of the British Chess Championships when held in her area, North Tyneside, in 2012 and particularly of the 100th Championships in Torquay in 2013 which attracted a record entry of nearly 1200.

She was prime mover in the revival of the Scarborough Congress which is now one of the most successful weekend events on the circuit. She has run the Northumberland Tyne-Wear Congress at the Parks for nearly 20 years - this year's will be the 50th and for the first time include a FIDE rated Open Section. She also acts as arbiter at many other events. These include Hastings for many years; and the Olympiad and the World Youth Championship in 2014.

Originally a music teacher by profession she has taught chess in the schools where she was employed and helped the Northumberland Junior Chess Association with their training days as well as the Megafinals and EPSCA Zonal events. She has won the British Ladies Championship at correspondence chess and continues to play regularly for Tynemouth Chess Club where she captains the Tynemouth Hobbits in the top division of the Northumberland League. She is graded 149D. However she clearly has a deeper understanding of chess than her grade suggests.

Roger J Edwards

Roger J Edwards is a previous President and is also an Honorary Life President. He did an enormous amount of work on the ECF Grading System. He took the entries for the British Championships for some years and is an active ECF Senior Arbiter.

John A Philpott

John A Philpott became an Honorary Life Vice President of the ECF in 2007-8. But more recently his work has been invaluable in ECF administration as: Company Secretary; Voting Register Officer; Data Controller and Financial Controller. He has also been performing the Office Manager's job in Battle, on a voluntary basis, for the last 12

months.

Andrew Farthing is the prime architect of the membership system, but John is the executive who has enabled the system to work. That his grade previously was 155A and is now 136A tells us something. How does he find time for it all and be involved with Wanstead Club, the Friends of Chess and be a highly active player?

Peter JB Wilson

Peter JB Wilson was a Midlander, but is a long-term resident of Guernsey. He is an International Arbiter, International Organiser and International Candidate Master. He married his long-term partner, Mary McDermott, who is also an IA, at the beginning of August. He was Chairman of the FIDE Computer Chess Committee and also the Commonwealth Chess Association from 1998-2002. He represented Guernsey in six Olympiads. After switching his allegiance back to England, he became ECF Director of Marketing for some years.

But it is as a team captain and player that he is best-known. He was co-founder of the extremely active Mushrooms Chess Club, which won the ECF Club of the Year Award in 2008. He represented England in the European Senior Team Championship from 2004 to 2010, captaining one of the English teams each time. For a couple of years, when Stewart Reuben wasn't team leader of the whole group, he took over that responsibility.

In the last four years his health has deteriorated so that he has become less active. Travelling from Guernsey is something of an undertaking. His grade is 121D and Rating 1965.

Player of the Year 2014



KEITH ARKELL has won the ECF Player of the Year May 2013 to April 2014 Award with 283 votes. Clearly the 136 people who voted rated his winning the first-ever European 50+ Championship very highly. British and English Champion David Howell came second with 117 and Michael Adams third with 67 votes

As many as 139 different players received at least one vote. The ECF members could nominate up to 5 people. The last vote received by email was sent at 10.30pm on Monday 30 June!

Keith is a very active player. His next event is the World 50+ Team Championship in Lithuania which starts 13 July

ECF Book of the Year 2014 - shortlist

This year the choice is between three books which reflect different aspects of historic giants of the game, offset by a vibrant collection of attacking games by a master of the genre.

Aron Nimzowitsch 1928 - 1935 Annotated Games and Essays

Rudolf Reinhardt (Ed) New in Chess £29.95

Nimzowitsch is remembered not only as a great player but the author of two of the most influential chess books ever written "My System" and "Chess Praxis" (see Petrosian below). Reinhardt collected over many years all the games, annotations and articles played or written by Nimzowitsch during the last seven years of his life that he could find. The blurb describes the contents well "The unauthorized sequel to My System and Chess Praxis" A historically valuable book, which also contains much stimulating and opinionated writing that is worth reading today.

Mikhail Botvinnik The Life and Games of a World Chess Champion

Andrew Soltis McFarland £29.99

The "Father of Russian Chess" was a man of many contradictions who lived (and survived) through the turbulent history of Russia in the last century as well as the poisonous politics of the Stalin decades. How he did this and became world champion is the subject of Soltis's book rather than deep analysis of Botvinnik's games. Soltis who speaks Russian has undertaken much research to try to understand the background and has written a fascinating biography of one of the greatest chess players of all time.

Petrosian Move by Move

Thomas Engqvist Everyman Chess £19.99

According to Kasparov, Petrosian had a very distinctive style, the key to which even the greatest players could not locate. Engqvist has made a determined effort to find it in this excellent selection of 60 best games of a much underrated world champion. Detailed annotations provide clues, but one of the answers might be that the first chess book Petrosian read was Nimzowitsch's Chess Praxis.

Sacrifice and the Initiative in Chess

Ivan Sokolov New in Chess £21.95

The author states in the preface "that this is a book I have wanted to write for a long time". He spent a long time selecting and refining his material to reflect his true subject, the intuitive sacrifice. Sokolov writes fluently and as an attacking GM himself he understands both the technical and human aspects of playing this way. A delightful book that both instructs and entertains at the same time.

ECF Book of the Year 2014 - winner!

There are many chess biographies which concentrate on the games and chess personality of a player, but very few which focus on the player's life and the historical circumstances in which he or she played. This year's winner is a notable addition to this rare genre and features one of the most influential players of all time.

Andrew Soltis in his preface states his ambition in his book **Mikhail Botvinnik The Life and Games of a World Chess Champion** *McFarland* £,29.99 -

"Botvinnik was a mystery to many of his contemporaries. This book is an attempt to explain him in the context of today".

Botvinnik's achievements are too well known to be recounted here, perhaps best summed up by his later informal title of "The Patriach" (of Russian chess).

As Soltis points out Botvinnik lived and prospered in the most difficult circumstances imaginable. He survived the Russian civil war, collectivization and famine, the Terror and second world war (in which many of his friends and contacts were executed or killed), Stalin and the cold war, the malaise of the 1960s and 1970s and the collapse of communism and the Soviet Union. How did he achieve so much?

Soltis provides several reasons. First Botvinnik was an excellent politician (not a common characteristic amongst chess players). Soltis provides much detail on the intrigues which he survived and sometimes started. Botvinnik created much resentment and jealousy from some of his colleagues but he always won through in the end. Secondly Botvinnik's huge public reputation arising from his victories in the late 1930s and 1940s culminating in winning the World Championship in 1948 always counted in his favour.

Self confident, tough, suspicious, uncompromising, dogmatic and not least incredibly hard working, Botvinnik often came over as a ruthless, self-



obsessed loner. But Botvinnik had major interests outside chess, notably in the field of electrical engineering which he pursued with the same degree of determination as in chess to the extent of abandoning the game for several years. He was very happily married to Gayane Davidovna, a Kirov ballerina; he enjoyed the theatre and the arts – and football. Loyal to his friends, he was ready to use his influence to help colleagues in need.

Soltis rightly gives less attention to the games as they have been extensively analysed elsewhere not least by Botvinnik himself, which enables him to explore the many aspects – environment, opponents, contributions to chess theory – of his enigmatic subject.

Soltis has written a fascinating and readable biography of a very great chess player who was also a complex man of many contradictions.

ECF Club of the Year 2014


3Cs Children's Chess Club may be one of only two chess clubs in England with their own premises. The other is Hastings. But that of the 3Cs is purpose-built with trophy room; function room; canteen; chess library; computers with online chess.

They have won the Manchester League 12 times in 14 years including 7 players under 21. Two teams compete in the 4NCL. Six teams in MCF with some 8 year olds competing in the "adult" league. Members go into local schools to conduct weekly chess sessions. 18 players over-150 grade on the current ECF list have come through the 3Cs' ranks. There is regular attendance of over 50 youngsters at weekly club nights with 4 separate groups for coaching of various abilities. One club night earlier this year 71 players aged under-18 attended!

ECF Small Club of the Year 2014

Penrith Chess Club rose from the ashes, obtaining sizeable council grant after all its equipment was stolen. It appeared at its new premises on television, radio and in newspaper reports

Snapshots of recently achievements: winning the NCCU Club Championship (Minor) Trophy; 2 members qualifying as ECF Arbiters; operating a junior chess club in a local school; active within the County Chess Association committee; instigating several new internal competitions to promote variety and interest at all levels, e.g. 'Last Wednesday' handicap, conference pairs and Chess960 in addition to the usual standardplay and rapidplay competitions; and fielding 4 league and 3 cup teams (mostly in Cumbria). It is currently planning a congress.

ECF Magazine of the Year 2014

CHESS MAGAZINE with Malcolm Pein as Executive Editor, Richard Palliser and Byron Jacobs as Editors and John Saunders as Associate Editor the magazine provides a hugely valuable service to its readers. Those of mature years will remember back to the days it was produced by Barry Wood. Who doesn't get a frisson of excitement when it appears in one's letterbox? Of course the company also has a retail store at 44 Baker Street and often runs bookstalls at major events.

ECF Congress of the Year 2014

Heywood Congress has 5 sections. That means that they are very tightly grouped and there are few mismatches. The venue is easy to access, has car parking and is right in the town centre. Food can thus, not only be purchased at the venue where there is a bar, but also locally. The prize money is very good relative to the entry fees and it is a comfortable and a very popular tournament that has been going since the 1990's and is well-established on the tournament calendar. Bill O'Rourke puts a lot of hard work into it every year.

CHESS SERVICE PROVIDERS

ECF Arbiters

The following revised text of Regulation No. 3 relating to Arbiters was adopted by the Board on 20 March 2014

- 1. Arbiters
- (a) The Board of ECF ("the Board") shall be responsible on the recommendation of the Director of Home Chess for the appointment of the ECF Chief Arbiter, Level 3 ECF Senior Arbiters and Level 2 ECF Arbiters (collectively or individually referred to as "the Arbiter(s)").
- (b) No Arbiter shall be appointed to his or her post unless the Board is satisfied that he or she satisfies all of the following preconditions:
 - (i) Membership of ECF; and
 - (ii) Fulfilment of the appropriate qualifications current at the time of appointment, or re-appointment.
- (c) The Level 3 ECF Senior Arbiter title shall be for life.
- (d) The Level 2 ECF Arbiter title will be subject to review during the six month period following the introduction of each new set of Laws. (This will normally be every four years.)
- (e) All such appointments are subject of the right of the Director of Home Chess to suspend an Arbiter from entitlement to such appointment with immediate effect or to revoke such appointment at any time for good cause. Good cause shall include but not be limited to:
 - (i) The Arbiter ceasing to fulfil any of pre-conditions set out in 1(b) above; or
 - (ii) Breach by the Arbiter of the ECF Child Protection Policy current at the relevant time; or
 - (iii) Failure to perform his or her duties in an impartial and responsible manner; or
 - (iv) Any conduct likely to injure or discredit the reputation of ECF, its events, organisers, participants or sponsors.
- (f) The Director of Home Chess shall give written notice with grounds to any Arbiter suspended from entitlement to such appointment and shall give not less than thirty five days written notice with grounds to any Arbiter whose appointment it is intended to revoke and shall consider any written submissions received from the Arbiter within thirty five days of such written notice. If the appointment of the Arbiter is suspended or revoked he or she has a right of appeal to the Board (excluding the Director of Home Chess). The appeal shall at the option of the Arbiter be either a written appeal or a personal hearing. The decision of the Board shall be final.

101st British Chess Championships - report

The 2014 British Chess Championships were held at the University of Aberystwyth from 19 July to 2 August, and marked the first return of the Championships to Wales since Swansea 2006: Aberystwyth had previously been the venue in 1955 (won by Harry Golombek) and 1961 (won by Jonathan Penrose).

As a result of the Olympiad taking place in Tromsø from 1 to 14 August, the normal schedule of the Championship (11 rounds starting on Monday with a rest day on the middle Sunday) was amended, and the event started on Saturday 19th, with a rest day on the middle Saturday. This rescheduling enabled David Howell to defend the title that he had won outright at Torquay in 2013.

A field of 58 contested the Championship, including seven grandmasters (David Howell, Nick Pert, Mark Hebden, John Emms, Keith Arkell, Simon Williams and Chris Ward). However, it was IM Jonathan Hawkins who took the sole lead in round 4: after winning his first six games, Jonathan was 1½ points ahead of the field. These six wins included the following round 5 victory against Daniel Fernandez.

Jonathan drew his last five games, and it became a question of whether any of the GMs, could take advantage of this slowing of the pace by scoring heavily enough to catch him in the remaining rounds. The most likely contender was David Howell, who closed to within half a point coming into the last round as a result of wins against Chris Ward and Daniel Fernandez. In round 11, Hawkins drew as Black against Richard Pert, but Howell won the following game against Mark Hebden.

In view of the pending Olympiad, there was no play off on this occasion, and Jonathan and David shared the British, as well as the English, title. Jonathan's result represented a GM norm, but it did not help him secure the title in view of the lack of foreign players faced: happily this was to be rectified at the Isle of Man International in October. The British an English Women's titles were won by Amy Hoare, while the Alexander best game prize went to Chris Ward for his round 3 victory against Mark Hebden








- 5) Grading lists from previous years may be used, providing evidence is provided to allow a claim to be checked.

The 2014 ECF County Championship Finals Day was played on Saturday, 12th July at the Trident Centre in Warwick. 7 matches were played, involving over 200 players.

Essex won four out of four Under 100 Championships, but failed to qualify for the Final Stage this year. In their absence, Warwickshire and Kent qualified for the Final and were convincing $8\frac{1}{2}$ - $3\frac{1}{2}$ winners.

Nottinghamshire made it to three Finals, the most of any county. The Under 120 Championship was their only successful Final, as they beat Hertfordshire 7 - 5.

When the Under 140 section was created in 2010, Hampshire won the first two competitions, and made it back to the Final this year to play Nottinghamshire. The two teams were very evenly matched, but Hampshire prevailed 9 - 7.

Yorkshire and Middlesex met in both the Under 160 Championship Final and the Open Final. The Under 160 Final was a 10 - 6 win for Yorkshire, who were victorious on 6 of the bottom 7 boards.

Warwickshire had home advantage in the Under 180 Championship, but were nevertheless outgraded against Essex. The match was live with two boards remaining, but Warwickshire won both to secure a 9½ - 6½ win.

Nottinghamshire's route to the Final of the Minor Counties saw them beat Leicestershire three times before meeting Suffolk. Suffolk fielded three juniors on the top three boards, and Alan Merry and Justin Tan on boards 1 and 2 hold the FIDE Master title. They won their games as part of a $9\frac{1}{2}$ - $6\frac{1}{2}$ win for Suffolk.

The Open was a comfortable win for Yorkshire, 11½ - 4½. Yorkshire outgraded their opponents, but the result was unexpectedly one-sided. It was their first win since 2009. All boards of the Final were broadcast live on the Internet via the ECF website for the first time.

I would like to thank Andrew Zigmond, the Controller this year in his first year in the role; as well as the team of David Sedgwick, Sean Hewitt, Thomas Thorpe, Matthew Carr, Bruce Holland and John Philpott for providing assistance in various capacities on Finals Day. I would particularly like to thank all of the captains, whose endeavour over the course of the season has enabled over 1000 people to participate in these Championships at the Union Stage, and I hope they all return to the competition next season --- Alex Holowczak, ECF Director of Home Chess

TOURNAMENTS

Hastings 2014/15 - Final Round report and Masters results - Stewart Reuben

Often there is an 'end of term' feeling to the last round of a 9 day or more tournament. Players are content to agree a draw with their new or old friends. This was not at all the case here where there was so much going on it was impossible to keep up with everything.

Jun Zhao had $7\frac{1}{2}/8$, but Alexandr Fier could finish first equal if he beat the Chinese player with the white pieces. You would have thought the Brazilian could play riskily, since it was quite likely he would be able to bail out to a draw if things got sticky. However perhaps there was another factor. Let us compare it with poker. There, if a player is doing well, then the opponents show great respect and avoid tangling with the man in form. Zhao has definitely been the player on heat. Thus perhaps it was unsurprising that the game fizzled out into a relatively mild draw. 8/9 then for Zhao and the winner's purse of £2000. His mother accompanied him to England and I presume she has a nice, warm feeling about the event. The Chinese player gained 2.56×10 rating points with a TPR of 2852. Only three other players achieved a TPR greater than 2600+.

Aleksander Mista v Romain Edouard was a clash between two of the three 2600+ players. Again Romain didn't seem to mind playing Kf8, foregoing his castling rights. An interesting, highly complex middle game resulted where Black had a strong centre, but a somewhat exposed king. I found it all very confusing, which is the type of chess I enjoy. So obviously did the audience at Chris Ward's commentary and this received the Horntye Centre £100 Best Game Prize.

Maxim Lagarde v Keith Arkell was another game that was difficult to understand. Why Qc8 rather than Qd7? Was b5 really necessary, saddling black with a backward c pawn. Keith had to defend the endgame K+N v K+2B for 41 moves. This is a notoriously difficult endgame to draw. Usually we find Keith with the winning chances, particularly in the endgame K+R+B v K+R.

Mark Hebden v Gudmundur Kjartasson was an unusual, wild-looking opening. Did White really get compensation for the pawn? After that his position unravelled.

Maxim Rodshetin v Danny Gormally. Why not 14 Qxd7? Danny resigned on move 19. Terribly early. Chris Ward made no effort to explain why he had done so.

Deep Sengupta v Benjamin Gledura. Black needed to win in order to gain a GM norm. Did the Commonwealth ChAmpion deliberately select the Exchange Ruy in the hop that his opponent would become frustrated and make errors? After all, it is renowned as an opening where Black has few winning chances. But it was a dair draw as was Bogner v Flear.

I expect Miklos Galyas was losing against Jonathan Hawkins, but he ran headlong into a forced mate.

Wahbi Kheit played a nice, albeit fairly obvious combination against Adam Hunt. White had a very substantial plus

Tereza Olsarova v Talsma – 18...Qe8 looked very odd. Black got himself into a right old tangle. Thus Tereza won her last round game and achieved a WGM norm, the only norm of the event. This was a relief as she had played so well mid-tournament, that we didn't want to see her go away empty-handed. $5\frac{1}{2}$ 9 was enoigh to share the Women's prize of £200 with Nino Masuradze.

Theodore Slade won two £200 prizes. One for the best performance by an U2200 and the other for the best improvent in rating by a player U21. He gained 2.83 x $k = 2.83 \times 40 = 113.2$. As far as I know, only in chess can juniors win cash prizes. This way of treating everybody the same is unique to our sport. The top 50 Masters Crosstable is below ...

Tromso Chess Olympiad 2014

Round by round from David Openshaw, International Director

Rounds 1 & 2

The event is an eleven round Swiss with each round over 4 boards. Most teams have five players of whom any four can play in a particular round. The pairings by team are available by 10 pm on the day before the match and the individual pairings are made known by 10 am on the day of the match. The event is based on Match Points. So if you win the 4 board match we get 2 points and if its a 2-2 draw then both sides get 1 point.

Both our teams had good wins in the first round – in Round 1 our Opens team beat Wales 4-0. On board 1 Jones beat Jones or more precisely Gawain beat Richard. Nigel Short, David Howell and Matthew Sadler all won.

Our Women's team beat Malta 4-0 with wins for Sue Maroroa, Sabrina Chevannes, Akshaya Kalaiyalahan and Ann-Marie James.

In Round 2 our Opens team played Singapore – one of the few teams with a woman in their team. Gawain Jones and Nigel Short drew on the top two boards, David Howell beat the Women's International Master Qiayan Gong on board three and Matthew Sadler won on board 4.

Our Women's team played Bosnia and Herzegovina. We made a good start to the match and, after two hours play, looked to have a slight edge. After that however things did not go our way, and only Jovanka Houska on Board 1 scored for us with a draw giving a final score of 0.5-3.5 to Bosnia.

Today in the third round we play Germany in the Opens and our Women's team face the Dominican Republic

Rounds 3 & 4

In the Open section three countries are on 100% after 4 rounds Azerbaijan, Serbia and Bulgaria. In round 3 we drew 2-2 against Germany and in round 4 we beat Latvia 3-1 so we are in a group of 14 countries including Russia, China, Ukraine and the Netherlands with 3 wins and a draw (7 match points).

Our match against a similar rated German side was closely fought. It seemed appropriate that both Michael Adams and David Howell used the Berlin Defence as black to thwart their opponents and drew their games. Matthew Sadler won with a strongly played game eventually winning by trapping his opponent's Knight in the endgame. Gawain Jones gradually found his isolated queen's pawn caused too many problems and lost in a rook and pawn endgame.

In Round 4 against Latvia, Michael Adams had a very good win against Shirov. David Howell and Matthew Sadler both won well. Nigel Short got into difficulties early on but fought hard and near the end had a chance for perpetual check but eventually lost. Final score 3-1 to England.

Today we are drawn to play Vietnam in Round 5.

In the Women's section five teams have a 100% record after Round 4. The top two seeds China and Russia, Hungary, Iran and Indonesia. In Round 3 we beat the Dominican Republic 3.5 to 0.5 with wins for Jovanka Houska, Sue Maroroa and Sabrina Chevannes and a draw for Ann-Marie James.

In Round 4 we had a difficult day and went down 0.5-3.5 against Belarus. So after 4 rounds we have two wins and two losses (4 match points). Today we play Algeria.

Rounds 5 - 7

After 7 rounds Azerbaijan lead the Open Section with 13 match points (6 wins and one draw) and Russia lead the Women's section with a perfect 14 match points (7 wins).

In the Open Section we have 10 match points after a draw with Vietnam 2-2, a loss to Armenia 1.5 -2.5 and a win against Canada 3-1. The teams just behind the leaders Azerbaijan are Czech Republic(who beat Russia 3-1) in round 7, Bulgaria and Romania. Russia are on the same points as us.

Against Vietnam in Round 5 Michael Adams won after being slightly worse when he saw a tactical threat which his opponent did not deal with. David Howell and Matthew Sadler drew .But Gawain Jones lost after being was slightly better early on. Result England 2 Vietnam 2.

In round 6 we played the very strong Armenian side and current holders. Michael Adams drew with Aronian, and Matthew Sadler drew. But Nigel Short had a poor position early on. On board two Gawain Jones went in for complications to try to create the winning chances we needed to draw the match. He had an advantage of Queen against Rook and Knight but with few pawns it was not easy to find any kind of winning plan and the rook and knight together covered the key squares. The game reached completely drawn position despite the computer evaluation of +2!

Result England 1.5 Armenia 2.5.

In round 7 we played Canada and won 3-1. Adams drew and Jones won with the other two games continuing with uncertain outcomes. Howell was definitely worse at one stage, Sadler drew and Howell fought back to win. You can see the analysis of the final few moves on http://en.chessbase.com/post/tromso-07-russia-wins-russia-falls

In the Women's section Russia lead after beating China in round 7 when both had 100% records. World Champion Hou Yifan(China) lost and Russia won the match 3-1. Incidentally it was a bad round for both World Champions as Magus Carlsen also lost (to Naiditsch of Germany). So Russia lead with 14 points followed by China and Hungary 12 points.

Our results have been mixed with a draw against Algeria, a win against Peru 3-1 and a loss against Australia 1.5-2.5. Sabrina Chevannes and Ann-Marie James won against Peru and Sue Maroroa had a good quick win against Australia. This leaves us in mid table with 3 wins 3 losses and a draw.

Round 8

In the Open section China beat Azerbaijan 3-1 to take sole lead with 14 match points. France, Ukraine, Azerbaijan, Czech Republic and Romania are all one point behind on 13 match points. We missed a good opportunity to join teams on 12 match points when we lost to Serbia 1-3. Russia, the pre-tournament favourites, are on 11 points after a 2-2 with Spain in which Kramnik lost.

David Howell and Matthew Sadler both lost, and we were left to fight for a draw. Michael Adams won his game but despite pushing for the equalising point Gawain Jones also lost. We therefore remain on 10 match points.

In the women's section Russia continued their unbeaten record with a 3.5-0.5 win against Hungary. China also won but the two point difference at the top remains with Russia on 16 points.

We had a good win against Jordan 2.5-1.5 with wins from Jovanka Houska and Akshaya Kalaiyalahan. Sue Maroroa drew on board 2 and Sabrina Chevannes lost. We now have 9 match points.

Rounds 9 & 10

In the Open Section, with one round to go, China leads by one point with Hungary in second place. In third place, two points behind, are eight teams, including Russia, USA, France and Ukraine. We are on 14 points, three behind China.

In rounds 9 and 10 we scored two good wins – 3-1 against Denmark and 3-1 against Sweden. David Howell had wins in both matches. In the final round we play Cuba.

In the Women's section Russia failed to win for the first time going down to Ukraine. They still lead with 18 points, one ahead of China and Ukraine. We have 11 points. In rounds 9 and 10 we had two draws against Sweden and Brazil, with Ann-Marie James winning in both matches. In the final round we play Wales.

Final Round

The final round of the Olympiad was overshadowed by the deaths on the final day of two players. I'm sure all chess players around the world will join in sending condolences to the families and friends of Kurt Meier (Seychelles) and Alisher Anarkulov

(Uzbekistan).

Kurt Meier collapsed at the board late on in the round after most games had finished and died later. Alisher Anarkulov was found in the evening in his hotel room. Both were said by the organisers to have died from natural causes.

In the Open Section China continued to dominate beating Poland 3-1 to take the gold medal. They won 8 and drew 3 of their 11 matches to give them a final result of 19 match points. Of the 44 individual matches they played they lost only one – a remarkable record. 20 year old GM Yu Yangyi on board 3 had great performance with 9.5 out of 11 and a performance of 2912.

Hungary drew with second seeds Ukraine and that proved enough for them to take the silver medal on tie break with 17 match points. Judit Polgar who announced her retirement from professional chess scored 4.5 out of 6.

India (without Anand) were the surprise winners of the bronze medal. They beat Uzbekistan 3.5-0.5 in the final round.

Our win in round 10 against Sweden had put us in a good position for a high placing if we could beat Cuba in the last round. It proved a very close match which we narrowly lost 1.5 -2.5. We thus finished on 14 match points.

On an individual basis many congratulations to Michael Adams who won a silver medal in the Best Board 1 performance with a rating of 2839. Topalov(Bulgaria) won the gold and Anish Giri (Netherlands) won the bronze, all ahead of Carlsen, Aronian and Kramnik. Also many congratulations to David Howell for his 2709 performance.

In the Women's section Russia dominated the event and a last round win against Bulgaria gave them 20 match points. They clearly benefitted from the late transfer of federation of board 1 Kateryna Lagno previously of the Ukraine Federation for fees of 25,000Euros.

China and Ukraine both had 18 match points with China winning the silver medal on tie break.

We finished strongly winning 3-1 against Wales with wins for Jovanka Houska and Sabrina Chevannes and draws for Akshaya Kalaiyalahan and Ann-Marie James. This gave us 13 match points with 5wins 3 draws and 3 losses.

Abridged report - John Saunders

Vishy Anand won the 6th London Chess Classic on tie-break from Vladimir Kramnik and Anish Giri after defeating Mickey Adams with the black pieces in the final round on Sunday. Final scores in tie-break order: 1 Anand 7, 2 Kramnik 7, 3 Giri 7, 4 Nakamura 6, 5 Adams 4, 6 Caruana 4.

It speaks volumes for the character of the man that he was able to bounce back from the disappointment of Sochi a few weeks ago to take this prestigious title in London. And prestige is a two-way street: Vishy Anand's name on the trophy adds lustre to the London Chess Classic and means that all three world champions active during the tournament's existence have now won it. Vishy's win on tie-break is karmic compensation for losing out to Magnus Carlsen on tie-break in 2010 despite defeating him in the tournament. Given that the event has now been in existence for five years and six events, it might be timely to publish our roll of honour:

2009 and 2010 Magnus Carlsen; 2011 Vladimir Kramnik; 2012 Magnus Carlsen; 2013 Hikaru Nakamura; and now, 2014, Vishy Anand. You'd be hard pushed to find another 21st century tournament with a list of winners as impressive as that.

Gibraltar Chess Festival 2014

- final round report [abridged] from John Saunders

Ivan Cheparinov, 27, from Bulgaria, won the 2014 Tradewise Gibraltar Masters, held at the Caleta Hotel, after a play-off with former tournament winners Nikita Vitiugov (Russia) and Vassily Ivanchuk (Ukraine). All three finished on 8/10. With the title, Ivan picked up a cheque for £20,000. Mariya Muzychuk, 21, from Ukraine, received the £15,000 cheque for being the best female competitor on tie-break (best rating performance) from Zhao Xue (China) and Nataliya Zhukova (Ukraine).

THE WINNER

Although highly rated at 2672 and ranked 75th in the world, Cheparinov's result was something of a surprise in the context of a tournament which had such awesome strength in depth and in which he ranked 17th. But it should be borne in mind that he has been rated in excess of 2700: a highly talented player in his own right who put his own playing career to one side for several years whilst working closely with Veselin Topalov. Much of this period was spent in Spain and, like Topalov, Ivan is a fluent Spanish speaker. He now works with Spanish GM Ivan Salgado López, who is resident in Sofia and who finished with a creditable 7/10 in the tournament.

WOMEN'S PRIZE

Zhao Xue (China) had led the chase for the £15,000 women's prize after her breathtaking streak of five wins between rounds five and nine but it was brought to an end in the last round when she had Black against Nikita Vitiugov. This loss left her on 7 points and she was caught on that score by Mariya Muzychuk, who finished with a draw against Simen Agdestein, and Nataliya Zhukova, who did well to defeat US GM Alex Lenderman in the last round and finishing with a burst of 3/3. The tournament rule for this prestigious prize specifies that the £15,000 goes to the player with the best tournament performance rating. Mariya's was 2654 – incidentally, more than enough to qualify for a GM norm – while Zhao Xue's was 2561 and Nataliya's 2553, so the honour and money went to Mariya. It was a fitting reward for a consistently excellent result, having played six grandmasters and beaten two of them.

GIRLS ON TOP

One remarkable feature of the tournament was the achievement of GM norms solely by female competitors – Mariya Muzychuk (Ukraine), Lela Javakishvili (Georgia) and Tan Zhongyi (China). This is quite appropriate for a tournament that prides itself on promoting and supporting women's chess (not to mention one in which the women beat the men in the Battle of the Sexes rapidplay). Women also chalked up a number of the IM norms: Natalia Pogonina (Russia), Qi Guo (China) plus male players Pedro Martínez Reyes (Venezuela), Johan Salomon (Norway) and Bogdan-Daniel Deac (Romania).

Championship Pool

So the denouement, and the showdown between the holders Guildford 1 and Wood Green 1. The one personnel change to the two line-ups subsequent to round 10 was the inclusion of Luke McShane in the Wood Green team in place of Nick Pert, with some adjustments made to board order. Guildford's average rating was 2656 and Wood Green's 2647, with Guildford players outrating their opponents on five of the eight boards (by as much as 61 points in the case of Giri and McShane). Remember also that a 4-4 draw would be good enough for Guildford to take the championship on tie-break. Nine nations were represented amongst the 16 GMs on both sides: there were six Englishmen, two Frenchmen, two Dutchmen, one player from each of the Czech Republic, Scotland, Norway and Latvia, plus women players from Bulgaria and Sweden.

Wood Green 1 2-6 Guildford 1: the scoreline suggests an overwhelming win for the champions but it did look fairly close – maybe even better for Wood Green – about halfway into the first session.

Rapidly improving French GM Romain Edouard set the tone for his team with an adventurous display of counterattacking chess against Jon-Ludvig Hammer.

On his Facebook page, Roger Emerson set this position as a puzzle for his readers (knowing full well that Romain Edouard and Maxime Vachier-Lagrave would see it and proceed to tease each other). He posed the question: "how should Black defend his b-pawn?" MVL shot back an answer: "Black's position is hopeless no matter what. But let's say there is only one move giving some practical chances." Romain Edouard retorted: "Too deep for you, Maxime Vachier-Lagrave #NoCreativityAround". 6...a6!? Sokolov played 6...Bd7 against Ponomariov in 2007 but eventually lost. The text move only pretends to defend the b5 pawn. 7.Nxb5 axb5 Black gives up the exchange. A few people have tried 7...Bb7 but most of them have lost as White will soon be a pawn up. 8.Rxa8 Bb7 9.Ra1 e6 10.Be2 Defending the e4 pawn with 10.f3 seems logical but perhaps White was worried it would cramp his kingside development, or expose him to threats from a queen and bishop battery on the h2–b8 diagonal. 10...Nf6 11.Nf3 Nxe4 12.0-0 Qd5 13.Ne1 Perhaps White's needs to react a bit quicker here with 13.b3!?, when 13...Nc3 may be answered by 14.bxc4, etc.13...Nc6 14.Nc2 14.Be3 Bd6 15.Bf3 0-0 16.g3 f5 was played in Genzling-Donchenko in France last March and also won by Black. 14...Bd6 15.Bf3 Bb8 16.Re1 f5 17.Bxe4 fxe4 18.Qg4 0-0 19.Qxe4 Qxe4 20.Rxe4 e5 21.dxe5 Bxe5

White has done a pretty good job of liquidating down to a position where his exchange should be worth its true value but he now misses his best shot. 22.Rb1 22.Re1!, with the idea of transferring the rook to the open d-file, is better. If 22...Rd8, White can play 23.Bg5 with gain of tempo and then defend the b2–pawn next move. 22...Bf6 23.Re2 Bc8 24.b3 Bg4! 25.Kf1? White seems to have been bluffed out of playing the natural 25.f3, which is better than the text. Then 25...Bf5 26.Be3 Bd3 (26...Nb4 27.Nxb4 Bxb1 28.bxc4 bxc4 29.Nd5 c3 30.Bc5 Rc8 31.Nxf6+ gxf6 32.Ba3 looks tenable for White) 27.Rd2 Re8 could pose a few problems for White but should ultimately be tenable. 25...c3 26.Be3 Ra8!? 30.b4 Moves such as 30.Kf2 lose to 30...Bxe2 31.Kxe2 Na5! when the threat of Nxb3 forking rook and bishop is decisive. **30...Bg5! 0-1** The cluster of pins and overloaded defences spells doom for White.

Jones-Laznicka was a very interesting game and a good example of why you shouldn't always put your faith in digital engines. Fortunately for me, I had one of the all-time great organic engines at my disposal at an important juncture during the game.

Speelman version 1 (a.k.a. Spess or Speelwolf), sitting close to my left elbow and looking over my shoulder at the game on my laptop, took nanoseconds to assess Gawain's position as close to winning at a stage when his electronic rivals still seemed to think Black was either OK or even better.

Of the six English players involved in the match, Gawain Jones was the only one to record a win. Nigel Short and David Howell played out a tense draw, with the older player pressing a little harder for much of its duration. Luke McShane was perhaps Wood Green's best hope of a win but his edge gradually dissipated and was turned round completely by Anish Giri. Mickey Adams was also ground down by Maxime Vachier-Lagrave, who is becoming stronger and stronger all the time, comparable to a young Adams, or Petrosian in his prime. The other games were drawn, leaving Guildford the winners by a comfortable margin.

Demotion Pool

Wood Green 2 5-3 Barbican 1: the honour of finishing first in this pool went to Wood Green 2, thereby displacing their opponents from the head of the table. There wasn't a big differential in the ratings of the teams and this was reflected in the fairly close score. Two of the Wood Green side won, with Nick Pert defeating Matthew Turner, while Juan Manuel Bellon Lopez beat Isaac Sanders. Incidentally, the Spanish GM's colourful scoresheet filling-in caused a flutter of interest when I published a photo of one on social media.

Blackthorne Russia 4½-3½ 3Cs: as things stood at the close of round 10, all the other teams in the division were either already relegated (the pointless pair King's Head and Grantham Sharks 2) or else still in with a mathematical chance of going down. It was 3Cs' misfortune that they met the Russians at the zenith of their playing strength. Even so, they only lost by one point when they really needed both match points to save themselves. My commiserations and good wishes to this well-organised club; I'm sure they will bounce back soon. Konstantin Landa proved a godsend to the Blackthorne club, beating Stephen Gordon and completing 3/3 on the weekend. Danny Gormally and Adam Hunt also provided full points for the side, whilst Alan Walton and Daniel Abbas beat much higher rated opposition for 3Cs. Adam Ashton suffered a lengthy loss to Gormally but his consolation was knowing that he had scored an IM norm as he sat down to play – congratulations to him.

The battle to avoid the Division's wooden spoon was won by King's Head, despite conceding yet another default. That brought them their first match points of the season, while Grantham Sharks 2's fate was to leave with nothing (as Anne Robinson used to say on The Weakest Link). They were a bit unlucky, with their fate turning on a couple of transitions into a king and pawn endgame, which are never easy. Half a point more in either of the games would have reversed the match result.

These lists show the top players in the country and the top female players in the country. The statistics are remarkable. Amongst the top 80 UK players, there are 17 players who participated in the UK Chess Challenge. Amongst the female players, in the top 69 there are no less than 39 players who have competed in the UK Chess Challenge, about half of which were born in 2000 or later. This points to a growing upsurge in women's chess particular among the younger age groups.

Harvey v Kalaiyalahan

By this time only two players had perfect scores so Akshaya floated up to the top board to face the Champ. Harvey starts with a restrained and innocuous version of the queen's gambit.

White's problem is that he cannot castle on the kingside without falling under attack. So he opens up in the centre of the board, trying to make black to decide about the positioning of her own king.

Technically sound, since after 19 Bxf4 Qxf4 20 Qxb7, the rook at c1 is hanging. White would like to play 19 Be3 here, but then ... Ng4 is annoying.

19 Qd3 Qd6 20 Rd1 g4!

White's position is beginning to break up.

21 Bc3 Bg5 22 Kf1 Qc7 23 Re1 0-0-0! 24 h4!?


Trying to turn the tide of the game, Marcus comes up with an inspired idea, which throws Akshaya off balance.

24 ... Bxh4?

In the commentary box, they spotted that this was the wrong way to capture, as it eventually takes the black rook away from the d file. Better was 24 ... Rxh4. 25 g3 Bg5 26 Rxh8 Rxh8 27 Re5!


With this fork of the black pawn at a5 and the black bishop at g5, white is right back in the game. Had black's rook still been on d8, this move could have been answered by ... Qxe5.


The white king's peregrinations have left him unharmed, and his pawns and pieces are more threatening and more mobile than black's.

Black has walked into a mating attack. 1-0

There are three playing rooms with all games expected to be broadcast live.

Day 1

This year the Glorney International is taking place at Stirling University. All of the teams are accommodated in Andrew Stewart Hall which overlooks the beautiful Airthrey Loch in the centre of the campus. Just a short walk away is the Pathfoot Building where the dining hall and playing facilities are located along with the Team Room. Each day two rounds will be played. Round 1 is Ireland versus England and Scotland versus Wales. Round 2 is England versus Scotland and Wales versus Ireland. Four separate competitions are taking place – Glorney (5 boys U18), Gilbert (3 girls U18), Robinson (6 boys U14) and Stokes (6 boys U12) making 20 England players in total.

On Day 1 the first round starts at 9:30am with Round 2 at 3pm. Internet access has been patchy so some players who have got the Internet are preparing with team-mates in tandem. The 3 coaches (in alphabetical order) are IM Lawrence Cooper, GM Mark Hebden and IM Adam Hunt. They are previewing future pairings to help players achieve the best results and also analysing games with each player after every game.

At the end of Day 1 England has played Ireland and Scotland. Five players are on 2/2 – William Claridge-Hansen, Joshua Higgs, Joseph Dalton, James Golding and Alex Golding with another 5 players on 1.5 out of 2. The England Glorney and Robinson teams are currently leading their sections with 6/10 and 8/12 respectively. The Stokes team got off to a slow start with 1.5 points from 6 games against Ireland but played magnificently in Round 2 with 6 out of 6 against Scotland – they are now on 7.5/12 and are lying in second place to Ireland. The team is also in second place with 3.5/6 just half a point behind Wales. There are 4 more rounds to play over the next couple of days so watch this space!

Day 2

England had high hopes for their Day 2 morning match against Wales, and didn't disappoint. Day 3

Incongruous as it seems to write of English triumphs over the Scots (not to mention the Welsh and Irish) in the shadow of the magnificent William Wallace Memorial close to Bannockburn, this was another excellent day for the English chess teams in Stirling. England retained the Glorney Cup with a round to spare with a 4.5-0.5 morning win over the Irish, and the England Girls built a clear lead in the Gilbert Cup with an excellent 3-0 win. The Robertson team were a little more restrained with a 3.5 – 2.5 win over the Irish, but maybe performance of the day was from the under-pressure Stokes team who reversed their opening morning 4.5-1.5 loss to the Irish U12s with 3 great wins on the top 3 boards –including an extraordinary winning positional whole-rook sacrifice from board 2 James Moreby against his 1884-rated opponent who had 4/4 to that point. A very determined

performance from the bottom 3 boards too, with 3 solid draws against their strong Irish opposite numbers who had been on fire up to that point! Alex Golding has been imperious on top board for the Stokes team and took his score to 5/5, as did William Claridge-Hansen on board 2 in the Glorney.

So England went into the 4 afternoon matches against the Welsh as strong favourites to win all 3 remaining trophies, and duly swept to victory in all three, although the Welsh girls put up particularly stiff resistance in the Gilbert. Alex and William completed their 6/6 scores, but every member of each team made a significant contribution to the overall English success. A sincere thank you to Debbie Taylor who was a fantastic Head of Delegation and to coaches Mark Hebden, Adam Hunt and Loz Cooper for their brilliant support for the teams.

European Youth Chess Championships

- round by round

Saturday 18th October 2014, 10pm

We've arrived - or at least most of us have! The 2014 European Youth Chess Championships are finally about to start.

Just over 6 months ago, 28 of England's top juniors accepted an invitation from the ECF to represent their country in one of the strongest and most prestigious tournaments on the junior international chess calendar. The planning for this tournament has been difficult and time consuming but excellently marshalled and meticulously organised by Head of Delegation, Jim Wadsworth. Vaccinations and visas had to be arranged, not to mention dealing with the hotel booking, insurance and entry forms. With no direct flights from the UK and 28 players, 7 coaches and 35 parents travelling in 8 different groups arriving into 3 different airports, it's enough to give you a headache! No wonder when I bumped into Jim this morning in Istanbul airport he was in the

duty free, purchasing a large bottle of Scotch!

We travelled as a family, leaving Cornwall first thing on Friday morning, with a 4 hour drive to Heathrow, followed by a 4 hour flight to Istanbul, a 15 hour stopover in Istanbul airport and a 2 hour flight to Batumi in Georgia. Thankfully the coach journey to the hotel was a matter of minutes, although the Georgian authorities seemed to take an age over passport control (a full 5 minutes checking Andrew Martin's credentials – I can't think why!) Actually, although that might seem a bit of a long trek, I think we had it quite easy compared to some. Quite a number of players and parents opted to try to get some form of sleep in the departure lounge of the ridiculously busy Istanbul airport (we opted instead for the comfort of a ridiculously expensive airport hotel!), some decided to travel via Trabzon in Turkey, involving a rather long road trip from the airport across the border (some of them are still in transit as I type) and unfortunately we also had the almost inevitable case of lost luggage – hopefully they will be re-united with their belongings soon!

And so we come to the start of the tournament! 989 players from 45 different countries, having to cope with not only the clash of cultures and change in diet that we have already experienced in our first few hours here in Georgia, but also with the ultra strict "zero-tolerance" rule (if you are not sitting at your board when the arbiter starts the round you will be defaulted) and a 40 move "Sofia draw" rule (if you agree a draw in the first 40 moves you forfeit the game). It's a tough life being a chess player!

Oh, and I almost forgot – it's our son, Theo's birthday today! He had to remind us when we woke up in Istanbul this morning. What a way to spend your 14th birthday – half of it in Turkey and half of it in Georgia – crazy isn't it? But he wouldn't have it any other way – and nor would any of the other 27 players! They are all ready, they are all excited and they can't wait for 3pm tomorrow when the competition finally starts!

Day 2

This was a tough first day for team Junior England at the European Youth Chess Championships – with a slightly disappointing overall score of 9.5. Novice and veteran players alike can take heart from Head of Delegation Jim Wadsworth's counsel – 'there are no easy matches at this level in chess'. And it's undeniable – as coach Andrew Martin points out – we travel over 2000 miles to the eastern shores of the Black Sea, don't speak the language, can't drink the water, arrive lagged and dazed. Different if you're a Turkish or Russian junior. With allowances made for missing bags, long delays, and arriving in the wee small hours of the morning (Josh Higgs, Catherine Shephard, Ezra Kirk are all still sleep-deprived) – it's all about what happens on the board.

Triumphs first: Richard Zhu (U14) took a magnificent scalp – defeating Pole Kamil Koziol, ranked over 300 points higher. Zoe Varney (U16 G) and Josh Higgs (U14) both held superior forces (on paper, at least) at bay. Russian Ayyyna Egorova struggled for a draw with Zoe and Josh held off both sleep and German Martin Kololli, again achieving half a point. Mention must be made of young Anita Somton (U10 G) – winning her first match against Armenian Nadezhda Khachatryan. Go Girl!

A Blue on Blue pairing is always frustrating — do we have to travel this far to play at home? — but, alas, it's unavoidable. The match between Matthew Wadsworth and Theo Slade (U 14) went as the ranking would suggest, the formidable Matthew chalking up his first win. With luck, civil wars over the remaining eight rounds will be kept to a minimum. Whoever said chess wasn't physical (HMG's Department of Media, Culture and Sport?) should try matching Charlie McLaren, Sacha Brozel or Alex Golding (all U12) for sheer stamina: they notched up nearly fourteen hours of match-play between them on Day 1. Charlie and Alex battling to wrench half a point from — respectively — Georgian Giga Goderdzishvili and Azeri Muhammed Ismayilov. By 8pm, Sacha finally succumbed to the higher-ranked Edoardo di Benedietto. And the same was true for James Moreby against his far-outranking Russian opponent. Koby Kalavannan compensated in part for those losses in the section with an impressive win over home-boy Mate Todashvilli.

With eight long matches to go, and weather as variable as England international football, the parents are starting to eye one of the dozen-so casinos in town — but, far safer to bet on this squad of talented and resourceful juniors and their coaches.

Day 3

After overnight rain the sun has made a welcome appearance and it has started to get warmer. The sea is gently lapping the shore unlike yesterday when the waves were the height of houses. The England team is accommodated at the Intourist Palace Hotel in spacious, well-appointed en-suite rooms. It is just a short walk to the main playing venue at the Sheraton Batumi Hotel; the Under 8's are playing their games at the Intourist Palace Hotel. Both arenas provide excellent playing conditions with good temperature control. Carpeted rooms mean that it is nice and quiet during play. Everyone other than the players and arbiters are required to leave the room before play begins and so there are few distractions for the players.

There are 989 players from 45 countries registered for the championships with the largest delegations coming from Georgia (140), Russia (136) and Azerbaijan (96) and the smallest team from the Faroe Islands (1). England has a team of 28 players across

the different age categories who are each being coached by one of the 7 England chess coaches – Lorin D'Costa, John Emms, Glenn Flear, Jovanka Houska, Andrew Martin, Neil McDonald and Gyula Meszaros. Each player has an hour with their coach before playing a new opponent and post-match analysis is done in the team room back at the hotel.

Round 2 has resulted in a much improved set of results in comparison with Round 1, producing 15 points from 28 matches. Amy Hoare and Koby Kalavannan were playing on the live boards today but both games were eventually lost after a valiant effort. Three players are now on 2/2 – Matthew Wadsworth, Akshaya Kalaiyalahan and Anita Somton with at least two of them scheduled to play on live boards in Round 3. A further 4 players are undefeated on 1.5/2 – Ezra Kirk, Richard Zhu, Alex Golding and Haolin Zhao. Zoe Varney has playersucceeded in drawing against two much higher rated players. There are 6 players yet to score and so they are working hard in their preparations for Round 3 and beyond – there are still a further 7 rounds to play. - Mary Fraser

Day 4

We saw Batumi at its best today with perfectly clear blue skies and a full day of sunshine and it was also our best day so far in the playing halls with a total score of 17.5 points. That's 63% or in fact 65% for the purists given that, for the third day in a row, we had an England v England pairing (Amy v Katherine in the under 18 girls) and so a maximum score of 27.

Five of our players are right at the top of their respective tournaments – Akshaya is on the maximum 3 points in the under 14 girls, and Ezra, Richard, Alex and Anita are all on 2.5 points in the under 18, under 14, under 12 and under 10 girls respectively.

As ever there were some really tough draws today with 4 of our players facing opponents graded over 300 points above them (Cosima, Sacha, Josh and Richard) and particular congratulations to Richard and Sacha who won those games. We also saw great wins from Navi, Anantha and Girinath among the 13 wins of the day.

Today's results really helped our overall performance with the team scoring 50% to date (or 52% taking into account our home team draws).

Round 4 is tomorrow and whilst writing, we are waiting for the draw to come up. Fingers crossed for another great day like today. - Angela Higgs

Day 5

One of the hardest things at a chess tournament, and indeed in life, is bouncing back after a series of defeats or disappointments. This takes a lot of psychological strength and deserves to be applauded.

Today, in my view, the two biggest heroines of the England squad were those who did just that. Vickie Sit had played well in the Under 16 Girls, but had been defeated in the first three rounds by significantly higher-rated opponents. A round 4 victory has now broken that cycle and she can play with more confidence again. In the Under 14 Girls section, Thivyaa Rahulan in some ways had an even harder task, having had a bye in round 3 after two defeats which meant she was up against other players on 1 point. She proved herself up to the task and emerged from the game with a draw.

Overall the fourth round was not such a good one for England in terms of points, with twice as many losses as wins. A particularly notable exception came from Richard Zhu, who won as Black against an opponent rated more than 400 Elo points higher. This puts him on 3½ points with a rating performance so far of over 2400, although, of course it also brings him a potentially even harder game in the next round. The other England players remaining unbeaten are Alex Golding on 3 and Haolin Zhao on 2½ points.

Sacha Brozel's was another good win, his third in a row. Koby Kalavannan's came at the end of a long but calm and controlled game. In fact, the typical length of the games was another feature of this round, with almost nobody from the England contingent emerging before 3 hours, perhaps a sign of how hard each team member is fighting over the board. With still two rounds to go before the rest day, stamina is going to become very important.

Day 6

A warm day in Batumi with a sunny start although becoming cloudy in the afternoon. In the playing halls, the team achieved a 50% score with 14 out of 28, slightly better than the previous day. There were no England vs. England pairings.

Two players, Akshaya and Richard were on live boards but, unfortunately, both lost strongly fought games in time trouble, although having had good positions. Akshaya is now on 3 and Richard on 3.5 out of 5.

In the Under 18 Open, John had an impressive win against an Israeli opponent over 250 points higher than his rating. Ezra had a Russian IM opponent rated 2400 and, after a balanced fight, achieved an excellent draw taking his overall score to 3 out of 5.

Amy achieved a draw against a French WFM in the Under 18 Girls and is now on 3 out of 5.

The young players in the Under 12 Open section are performing exceptionally well, with 6 of the 7 players on scores of 50% or more. Alex built up a strong initiative in his game and his Norwegian opponent was unable to cope with threats coming from all directions and quickly succumbed in just over an hour. Alex is now on 4 out of 5. James, Koby and Sacha are on 3 out of 5.

In the Under 12 Girls, Anita achieved a draw against an Israeli opponent taking her score to 3 out of 5.

In the very tough Under 10 Open section, Adithya won a piece early on and, apart from one precarious moment, was in control of the whole game.

Haolin won in the Under 8 Open section and is now on 3.5 out of 5 and, along with Alex, is one of the two England players who remain undefeated in the championships.

Other wins were gained by Joshua, Koby, Navienaah, Ravi, Thivyaa and Zheming. Girinath, James, Anantha, Cosima and Zoe all achieved draws.

The team is eagerly looking forward to tomorrow's round and Saturday's, well-deserved, rest day.

Day 7

Day 11 - Final round and summary

Yesterday's final round started at 1pm so coaching and preparation started early. Results were again mixed with the team scoring 11½ points which included 11 draws! Special mention must go to Navi who scored her fifth win in a row.

Looking at our results overall some of our players have had excellent tournaments; Alex Golding scored 6½ points (as an U11) in the U12 to finish 9th, Haolin and Navi both scored 6 in the U8's and finished 14th and 13th respectively. However, for some the performances have been slightly disappointing and the tournament challenging. Not an excuse but the strength of the opposition should not be underestimated with the "tail" consisting of the local unrated or lowly rated Georgians many of whom have been capable of scoring 4-5 points in most sections. All players will now come home having learnt more about themselves and their chess and hopefully identified the areas for development and improvement.

The new K factor of 40 for juniors is obviously going to make junior ratings very volatile. Our top player rating wise was James Moreby who gained 158.6 rating points while others have lost over 100 points.

The tournament was excellently run with no problems and the Sheraton Hotel proved a very good playing venue. Our hotel, the Intourist was good and the Georgian red wine excellent!

What of Batumi? After the last ECF junior trip here some 4 years ago both Head of Delegation, Jim Wadsworth, and Coach, Andrew Martin left the City vowing never to return. They both returned on this trip and have been pleasantly surprised at the progress that has been made.

It's an interesting place and with snow capped mountains visible from the beaches, many Western Hotels now on the seafront and numerous casinos. The influence of the old communist era are still evident with blocks of tatty flats a few streets from the sea front, staff unable to smile and an abundance of police and leather clad heavies on street corners. However, the area is progressing.

Finally a big thanks to Jim Wadsworth for organising the trip and for selecting the best vintages in the hotels "wine cellar", he really did do an excellent job, and to all the coaches and players for their hard work and sustained efforts.

Round 3

On the upside the hotel staff are trying their best to please. However, even the intervention of a free Portuguese to English App on the iPad has failed to improve how quickly orders arrive, however it provided some entertainment whilst waiting.

The playing hall for the event is excellent in what appears to be a hotel "under development". The experience for the parents is

never ideal, but the local shopping centre has proven to be a helpful distraction from staring at a TV monitor and trying to make out how your son or daughter is doing.

For those with two wins in the first two games usually means meeting some decent opposition. This has proven to be the case in the Under 15 Open, Billy was paired with the 2283, highest seed; in the U13, Jake was paired with a Sri Lankan FM; Druva was paired with the 2054, highest seed. However, all players are now playing substantially more challenging opponents.

Unlike the first day when wins appeared after only a few tens of minutes, today was a little different with most games lasting in excess of 2 hours.

Savin was the first to finish well inside the first hour. Subsequent wins by Callum, Lauren, Elizabeth, Aditya, Bobby, Adithya and hard fought draws from Billy, Jakob & Max made it 8.5/12 for the round. Tomorrow we look forward to the double round day!

Rounds 4 & 5

We are now halfway through the tournament. Today was a gruelling day as there were two games, but the team played some admirable chess!

In the U9s section, Bobby continued his run of excellent form and won both games with clever middle game tactics. He is currently joint first on the cross-table. Adithya lost his morning game to the tournament favourite but turned things around after lunch by beating his opponent from Peru. Dhruva drew his morning encounter but lost out to a Russian in a hard fought endgame in the afternoon.

In the U7s, Savin won both his games – the second one displayed some interesting tactics which lead to a comfortable end game.

Our youngest girl Elizabeth (U11 girls) drew her first game in a long duel against her Indian opponent. In her second game Elizabeth dominated from the opening to beat her Brazilian rival.

In the U11s open, Aditya defended well in his morning encounter and he converted in the end game. His well-prepared opening paid off in the second game. Max crushed is opponent in the first game but he lost out in the afternoon to a Brazilian.

In the U13s open, Nikolai and Jake are holding their own in a cross table that includes two FIDE Masters. They both beat Brazilians in the morning and they both lost out to highly-rated Indonesians in the afternoon. Jake's opponent was Michael Owen – that's what you call multi-talented!

Lauren, currently 4th in U15 girls cross table, lost to the Brazilian number one in the morning. In the afternoon, in a game that lasted into the evening she drew with a Peruvian.

Both Billy and Callum are in the top 10 of the U15 cross-table. In the morning Callum lost out to a player whose rating was higher than his birth year. But he convincingly triumphed in the afternoon. Billy lost to the current number two on the cross-table and then after lunch drew against a Brazilian in a game that lasted several hours.

Team spirits are high and there is much camaraderie and bonding at supper time. The food at the hotel is good but the service can be slow. Order your food before the game, and if you're lucky, it will be served when you finish!

Round 6

Round 6, the last day before a well deserved rest day, had some very difficult battles in store for the members of the England team.

Bobby on 5 of 5 in the U9 Open, was facing a 2054 from Uzbekistan on Board 1 while Adithya, on 4 of 5, was playing against a 1684 from Peru on Board 3.

In the U7 Open Savin, on 4 of 5, was playing on Board 2 against the second ranked player from India and in the U15 Girls Lauren was playing against the 5th seed from Peru on Board 3. Callum in the U15 Open and Aditya in the U11 Open were facing higher rated opponents on Boards 4 and 5 respectively.

Just before the beginning of the round Callum was inspiring the team members to drive for victory, threatening them with bodily harm if otherwise!

Dhruva and Nikolai emerged very early with quick wins, obviously afraid of Callum. Bobby put up a tough fight against the 2054 but his opponent proved too strong on the day. Savin fell to a very well prepared opening setup, losing a piece and ultimately the game.

Billy and Max won both their games in impressive style. Billy was a pawn up after the opening and never looked back. Max completed his victory after 59 moves. Aditya had to let go of his exchange advantage to achieve an ultimately drawn endgame.

Lauren won her game very elegantly creating a mate with a rook, a knight and a pawn. Elizabeth was faced with a very exotic opening, but was not at all deterred by it. She played a solid middle game and ultimately promoted the a-pawn overpowering her opponent. Jake won a pawn in the opening and held on to his advantage all the way, ultimately winning a bishop endgame.

Adithya did not receive any presents from his opponent on his birthday. After a very precise opening and tight middle game his opponent found a way to check his king on the 7th rank which decided the game. Callum was a pawn down after the opening but his opponent gave it back to gain initiative in the middle game ultimately leading to a draw after over four hours.

A total of 8 points for the England team today, the third best day so far. Now we are off to celebrate Adithya's birthday and we will rest tomorrow!

Round 8

Round 8 proved to be a very tough day and whilst the England players all remain on scores over 50% and can be very proud of their efforts the medal chances took a serious blow but remain in the balance as we head into the final day.

Two England players were on board one in this round but both lost long games. Savin Dias was black on top board against a

Candidate Master from Mongolia in the Under 7 event half a point behind the leaders. From glimpses of his post mortem he played well and had a good position but tragically blundered in an ending and lost a long game which was one of the last England games to finish. Savin is the British Under 8 champion and also won the English Junior Grand Prix as well as making his England debut in the European Schools where he scored six points. He is clearly a good prospect and 2014 has been a breakthrough year for him

Elizabeth Johnson was the other player on top board and was also half behind the leaders. Her Indonesian opponent has looked very impressive in the event and won a pawn in the opening and showed impressive technique to convert it without allowing Elizabeth any chances to get back into the game. Bearing in mind Elizabeth is only ten and therefore has another year left in the event her performance has been very impressive and as her coach for the event I have enjoyed working with her. Hopefully she can have a good result in the last round and secure a top placing albeit it will probably be just below the medal positions.

Jakob Holton has played an outstanding tournament and this led to him facing an FM rated 2171 on board 3 in the Under 13s. He faced a line that we had only considered just before the start of the round but despite not being fully prepared he initially seemed to be coping well in the complications. Sadly one error was all it took for his position to become untenable and he lost material and was unable to recover. As with the two players above a win in the final round would cap an impressive performance and a high finish.

The Under 9s has been the event where we had most expectation but our medal hopes now rest on Adithya Pramod Paleri as Bobby Akeya Price fell to a third successive defeat after his 5/5 start but he has played a very strong field and his performance should definitely be viewed positively. Adithya won to move to six points and Dhruva drew to reach 5.

Lauren remains in medal contention in the Under 15s after her draw but will need other results to go her way in the final round. Whilst I had hoped to have more girls on the trip it is very pleasing that both have challenged for medals and have realistic chances going into the final round.

Rounding up the other sections, Max Miller won his third game in a row in the Under 11s and will be part of the only England v England pairing in the last round against Aditya Munshi who has shown great promise in some very tough games. Round 8 will also be remembered for board 1 being decided by a mobile phone. A timely reminder of the dangers of taking a phone into the playing room and one that will no doubt linger long in the minds of the player and family.

Callum was our final player to finish and his win boosted our score to 5.5/12 whilst Billy drew and Nikolai lost. It was the first day where the team had scored less than seven but tough pairings rather than any other reasons were one of the main reasons. There is a very fine line between a good and bad day and sadly the results didn't go our way in the key games. There is still a lot to play for in round 9 though and a good set of results will ensure that what has been a very successful event and a breakthrough for many porimising young players will be reflected in the final standings.

In case I forget to mention it in my final report I would like to take this opportunity to commend all the players, parents, grand-parents, coaches (and Savin's little brother Ruwan!) on their exemplary behaviour during the event. It has been a real honour and pleasure to meet and work with them over the last nine days and I wish them all every success in the future. I would also like to thank those back home for giving great support and encouragement including the tireless work of Andrew Walker and John Philpott amongst others to help me overcome some rather challenging administrative hurdles in the lead up to the event.



Chess Problem News


Who's the British Champion? If I said John Nunn, you'd think this article was reprinted from some years ago, but he won the 2014 British Chess Solving Championship. To be fair, by the time you read this he might not be, as I'm writing in January 2015 and this year's final of the event is due to be held next month. The competition takes place every year, and anyone resident in the UK can enter. It begins with a straightforward mate in two which appears in the main chess magazines and columns in May. If you send in the correct solution, you will receive by post a set of more difficult problems to solve – you send in your solutions by post or e-mail. Do well enough in solving those and you will get invited to the final which takes place each year in the splendid venue of the main hall at Eton College, thanks to our sponsors Winton Capital. Have a go this year! To give you a taste of the difficulty, here are three of the problems from the latest postal round, which finished recently. (Solutions at the end of this article.)

The first is a two-mover – White to play and force mate on his second move. As it's a problem, expect the key move to be surprising – if that's not a contradiction in terms!


The second was also composed in the Victorian era. It's White to play and force mate on his third move. Again an unexpected first move – a passive sacrifice and it doesn't appear to have any purpose.

The third problem is a helpmate. In helpmates, White and Black cooperate to achieve the mate of the Black king. In most helpmates, including this one, Black moves first; the moves you have to find have this sequence: BWBWBWBW. This problem has two solutions, and as you might expect they have some similarities to each other. To solve this, try thinking what pieces you need to achieve the mates and where they might take place. Also, in a problem there are no unnecessary pieces, so what, for example, is the role of the pawn on f6?



Helpmate in 4. Two solutions.


One of the regular organisers of the British Chess Solving Championship for many years was Paul Valois, who sadly died in 2014. He was an expert particularly in endgame studies and selfmates, but had an interest in all types of problem. At the annual British Chess Problem Society weekend meeting in Bournemouth in 2013, he set a solving competition for the attendees. Here is a mate in six moves from that competition.

Much gentler solving is the next problem, by Michael McDowell, a leading British problem composer (and, during 2014, a very successful competitor in the Channel 4 TV series Countdown!) Michael is also a strong solver, and received his solving IM title in 2014. There are FM, IM and GM titles for solving, and a solving Elo system; they work similarly to the OTB titles and Elos, although the titles are considerably harder to gain. The UK has two solving GMs: Nunn and Jonathan Mestel, both also former holders of the World Chess Solving Champion title.




Mate in 2

The UK has many strong composers of chess problems, and also of endgame studies. Quite a few are also keen OTB players, and as an example here is a study by Paul Byway. It appeared in my endgame studies column in BCM in December 2014 and is a correction to an unsound study by Hugh Blandford which had appeared half a century earlier in BCM.

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
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
